- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-7-102(a)(xxv), 31-7-108(a),
- 10 31-7-109(d) by creating a new paragraph (vii), 31-7-110(a),
- 11 (f) and by creating a new subsection (g), 31-7-113(a) by
- 12 creating a new subsection (xi), 31-7-117(f)(i) and (ii),
- 31-7-126 and 31-7-304 (a) (ii) (C) are amended to read:

15 **31-7-102. Definitions.**

1 2 (a) As used in this act: 3 4 (xxv) "License", "driver's license", "commercial 5 driver's license", or "instruction permit" or "intermediate permit" means any a license or permit secured by a person 6 7 from the division, in accordance with this act which grants the privilege to drive or operate a motor vehicle on the 8 9 public highways, streets and roads of this state; 10 31-7-108. Persons not to be licensed; investigation 11 12 by the division. 13 14 (a) No driver's license shall be issued to any person who is under the age of sixteen (16) eighteen (18) years, 15 except as provided in W.S. 31-7-110 and 31-7-117(c). 16 17 18 31-7-109. Classes of licenses. 19 20 (d) Licensing classification plan: 21 22 (vii) Class "I2" indicates an intermediate

23 permit issued pursuant to W.S. 31-7-110(g).

1 31-7-110. Instruction and temporary driver's permits.

2

3 Any person who is at least fifteen (15) years of 4 age may apply to the division for an instruction permit. 5 The division, after the applicant has successfully passed all parts of the examination other than the driving test, 6 may issue to the applicant an instruction permit which 7 entitles the applicant while having the permit in his 8 9 immediate possession to drive a specified type or class of 10 motor vehicle for a period of one (1) year when accompanied 11 by a person at least eighteen (18) twenty-one (21) years of 12 age who holds a valid driver's license and has been 13 licensed as a driver for the type or class of vehicle being used for at least one (1) year three (3) years, who is fit 14 and capable of exercising control over the vehicle and who 15 16 is occupying a seat beside the driver. This subsection does 17 and subsections (f) and (g) of this section do not apply to motorcycle instruction permits. 18

20 (f) Any person who is at least fourteen (14) years of
21 age and who has applied and been approved for a restricted
22 license under W.S. 31-7-117(c), shall apply to the division
23 for an instruction permit. The division, after the
24 applicant has successfully passed all parts of the

examination other than the driving test, may issue to the

2 an instruction permit which entitles the applicant 3 applicant while having the permit in his 4 possession to drive a class "C" motor vehicle for a period 5 of sixty (60) days when accompanied by a person at least eighteen (18) twenty-one (21) years of age who holds a 6 7 valid driver's license and has been licensed as a driver for a class "C" vehicle for at least one (1) year three (3) 8 9 years, who is fit and capable of exercising control over 10 the vehicle and who is occupying a seat beside the driver. 11 12 (g) Any person, who is at least sixteen (16) years of 13 age and has held an instruction permit pursuant to 14 subsection (a) or (f) of this section or a similar permit from another jurisdiction and has completed practice 15 16 driving of at least fifty (50) actual driving hours, 17 including at least ten (10) hours of night driving, may apply to the division for an intermediate permit that 18 19 entitles the applicant to drive a specified type or class 20 of motor vehicle. No permit may be issued unless a parent 21 or guardian certifies the applicant has completed the 22 practice driving requirements. Provided that when operating a motor vehicle, a person with an intermediate 23 24 permit:

5 eighteen (18) whichever occurs first unless the department

6 determines that reapplying for a license would be futile

7 because the person will be eighteen (18) years of age

8 before the application process would be accomplished;

10 (C) A person may contest the existence of a 11 conviction, permit suspension or revocation under this paragraph by producing documents to the division proving 12 13 that he is not the person who is the subject of the 14 conviction, permit suspension or revocation or that the conviction, permit suspension or revocation did not result 15 16 from an offense listed in, or similar to an offense listed 17 in, this paragraph. A hearing and appeal from an adverse decision by the division shall be allowed under the Wyoming 18 19 Administrative Procedure Act solely on the issue of the 20 identification of the person or whether the offense 21 resulting in the conviction, permit suspension or 22 revocation is an offense listed in, or similar to an

3	regulating the driving of motor vehicles, shall forward to
4	the division within ten (10) working days from the date of
5	conviction a record of the conviction of any person in the
6	court for a violation of any of those laws or ordinances,
7	other than those regulating standing or parking of a motor
8	vehicle. Each court in this state shall also forward to the
9	division within ten (10) working days from the date of
10	conviction a record of the conviction of any person under
11	nineteen (19) years of age in the court for a violation of
12	any law regarding the possession, delivery, manufacture or
13	use of a controlled substance or alcohol. The court shall
14	also forward to the division a report of any violation by
15	any person of a written promise to appear in court as given
16	to the arresting officer upon the issuance of a traffic
17	citation and any failure to appear in court at the time
18	specified by the court. Failure of a court to forward a
19	record of conviction or violation under this section within
20	the time specified in this section from the date of
21	conviction or violation shall not affect the division's
22	authority under this act.

2 (a) Commercial driver's licenses may be issued with
3 the following classifications and endorsements. The holder
4 of a valid commercial driver's license may drive all
5 vehicles in the class for which that license is issued and
6 all lesser classes of vehicles except motorcycles and
7 vehicles which require a separate endorsement, unless the
8 proper endorsement appears on the license:

are special authorizations permitting the driver to operate
certain types of motor vehicles or transport certain types
of cargo if the endorsement is displayed on the driver's
license:

16 (C) "P" authorizes the driver to operate a 17 or any motor vehicle as defined in 31-7-102(a)(iii) used for the transportation of passengers, 18 providing the licensed driver has attained the age of 19 20 eighteen (18) years; except the "P" endorsement may be 21 placed upon the license of a licensed driver between the 22 ages of sixteen (16) and eighteen (18) years who has 23 secured the approval of the school district and the 24 permission of a parent or guardian of each child to be
