## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to mineral taxation and revenue; creating a 2 committee to study and recommend incentives for certain 3 added mineral products; specifying membership; value 4 providing duties and responsibilities; requiring a report; providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective 5 6 date. 7 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9

10 Section 1.

12 There is created the value added minerals (a) 13 committee consisting of twelve (12) members as follows:

(i) Six (6) members of the senate appointed by 15

16 the president of the senate, two (2) of whom shall be

1 members of the minority party. One (1) member shall be

2 appointed cochairman of the committee;

4 (ii) Six (6) members of the house of

5 representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of

6 representatives, two (2) of whom shall be members of the

7 minority party. One (1) member shall be appointed

8 cochairman of the committee.

10 (b) The mission of the committee shall be to

11 recommend incentives for value added coal, crude oil, lease

12 condensate, natural gas and trona products to be processed

13 or manufactured in the state of Wyoming. The committee

14 shall determine the criteria for value added products to

15 qualify for incentives, as follows:

17 (i) Identify and define the nature of value

18 added coal, crude oil, lease condensate, natural gas and

19 trona products;

21 (ii) Provide a method or system to measure the

22 amount of added value;

1 (iii) Specify when sufficient value has been 2 added to the products; 3 4 (iv) Make recommendations that fulfill the 5 overall mission of the committee. 6 (c) The committee may engage the services of research 7 firms or consulting expertise as necessary to carry out the 8 9 purposes of this act. The governor's office or any agency 10 of the executive branch as directed by the governor, shall 11 provide necessary administrative and technical assistance 12 to the committee in carrying out the purposes of this act. 13 The legislative service office shall serve as staff for the committee. 14 15 16 The committee shall report its findings with any 17 recommendation to the governor and the joint revenue interim committee on or before September 1, 2004. The 18 committee shall cease to exist on December 31, 2004. 19 20 21 Section 2. There is appropriated from the general 22 fund seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00), or as much thereof as may be necessary, to the legislative service 23

office to be expended for salary, per diem and travel

1 reimbursement for legislators serving on the committee

2 created by this act. The legislative service office may

3 also expend these funds to contract for services on behalf

4 of the committee as provided under section 1 of this act.

5 Any funds remaining under this section on December 31, 2004

6 shall revert to the general fund.
