Massage therapist licensing.

- for 1 AN ACT relating to professions and occupations; providing 2 for the licensure of massage therapists as specified; creating a licensing board; requiring a license for massage 3 therapists as specified; providing exceptions; providing 4 licensure requirements as specified; providing definitions; 5 providing for revocation of the license as specified; 6 7 providing a penalty; and providing for an effective date. 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-44-101 through 33-44-120 are 12 created to read: 13 14 CHAPTER 44 15 MASSAGE THERAPISTS
- 17 **33-44-101.** Short title.

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1 2 This act may be cited as the "Massage Therapy Practice Act." 3 4 5 33-44-102. Definitions. 6 7 (a) As used in this act: 8 9 (i) "Board" means the board of massage therapy; 10 (ii) "Department" means the department of 11 12 administration and information; 13 (iii) "Jurisprudence" means the statutes and 14 rules of the state pertaining to the practice of massage 15 16 therapy; 17

18 (iv) "Massage therapist" means a person who uses
19 the title of massage therapist, is licensed pursuant to
20 this act and administers massage therapy for compensation;
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21

(v) "Massage therapy" means the treatment of soft tissues for therapeutic purposes as defined in W.S. 33-44-103; and

2 (vi) "This act" means W.S. 33-44-101 through

3 33-44-120.

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5 33-44-103. Massage therapy; therapy; defined.

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(a) Massage therapy is the treatment of soft tissues

for therapeutic purposes, primarily comfort and relief of

pain. Massage therapy is a health care service. Massage

therapy includes but is not limited to effleurage,

petrissage, tapotement, compression, vibration, friction,

nerve strokes and Swedish gymnastics. Massage therapy may

include the use of oils, salt glows, hot or cold packs or

14 hydrotherapy. Synonymous terms for massage therapy include

15 massage, therapeutic massage, body massage, myomassage,

16 bodywork, body rub or any derivation of those terms.

17

18 (b) The terms "therapy" and "therapeutic massage" do
19 not include the diagnosis or treatment of illness or
20 disease or any service or procedure for which a license to
21 practice medicine, nursing, chiropractic, physical therapy,
22 occupational therapy, acupuncture or podiatry is required
23 by law.

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1 33-44-104. License required.

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- 3 It is unlawful for any person to practice massage therapy
- 4 for compensation, to offer services as a massage therapist
- 5 for compensation or to purport to be a massage therapist
- 6 unless that person possesses a license to practice massage
- 7 therapy under the provisions of this act. No person shall
- 8 use the title of or represent himself to be a massage
- 9 therapist or use any other title, abbreviations, letters,
- 10 figures, signs or devices that indicate that person is a
- 11 massage therapist unless he is licensed to practice massage
- 12 therapy pursuant to the provisions of this act.

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14 **33-44-105**. Exemptions.

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- 16 (a) Nothing in this act shall be construed to
- 17 prevent:

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- 19 (i) Qualified members of other recognized
- 20 professions that are licensed or regulated under the law of
- 21 this state from rendering services within the scope of
- 22 their license or regulation, provided they do not represent

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23 themselves as massage therapists;

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1 (ii) Students from rendering massage therapy 2 services within the course of study of an approved massage 3 therapy school and under the supervision of a licensed 4 massage therapy instructor; 5 (iii) Visiting massage therapy instructors from 6 another state or territory of the United States, the 7 District of Columbia or any foreign nation from teaching 8 9 massage therapy provided the instructor is duly licensed or 10 registered, if required, and is qualified in his place of 11 residence for the practice of massage therapy. The board 12 shall establish by rule the duration of stay for a visiting 13 massage therapy instructor; and 14 15 (iv) Native American healers from usina 16 traditional or Native American healing practices. Healers 17 who use these practices but apply for a license registration pursuant to the Massage Therapy Practice Act 18 shall comply with all licensure requirements. 19 20 21 33-44-106. Board created; membership. 22 There is created the board of massage therapy 23 (a)

within the department of administration and information.

2 The board shall consist of five (5) members who (b) 3 are residents of this state. Members of the board shall be 4 appointed by the governor. Three (3) members of the board 5 shall be licensed massage therapists, each with at least five (5) years of massage therapy practice in this state. 6 Two (2) members of the board shall be public members. The 7 initial three (3) professional members appointed shall not 8 9 be required to meet the requirements for licensure. The 10 public members shall not have been licensed or have any 11 financial interest, direct or indirect, in the profession 12 regulated.

13

(c) Each member of the board shall hold office until
the expiration of the term for which appointed or until a
successor has been appointed and qualified.

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18 (d) No board member shall serve more than two (2)
19 consecutive terms.

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21 (e) The board shall elect annually a chairman and 22 other officers as it deems necessary. The board shall meet 23 as often as necessary for the conduct of business, but no 24 less than twice a year. Meetings shall be called by the

1 chairman or upon the written request of three (3) or more

2 members of the board. Three (3) members, at least one (1)

3 of whom is a public member, shall constitute a quorum.

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5 (f) The governor may remove any member of the board

6 as provided by W.S. 9-1-202. Any board member may be

7 recommended for removal as a member of the board for

8 failing to attend, after proper notice, three (3)

9 consecutive board meetings.

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11 (g) Members of the board shall receive per diem in

12 the same manner and amount as state employees under W.S.

13 9-3-102 and shall receive no other compensation or

14 allowance.

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16 **33-44-107.** Board duties.

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18 (a) The board shall have the power to:

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20 (i) Adopt rules and regulations necessary to

21 carry out the provisions of this act;

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(ii) Provide for the evaluation of 1 the 2 qualifications of applicants for licensure or registration under this act; 3 4 5 (iii) Provide for the issuance of licenses or registrations to applicants who meet the requirements of 6 this act; 7 8 9 (iv) Provide for the inspection, when required, of the business premises of any licensee during regular 10 business hours; 11 12 13 (v) Establish minimum training and educational standards for licensure; 14 15 16 (vi) Establish a process for approval of 17 training programs and massage therapy schools; 18 19 (vii) Provide for the investigation of persons 20 engaging in practices that may violate the provisions of 21 this act; 22

1	(viii) Revoke, suspend or deny a license or
2	registration in accordance with the provisions of the
3	Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act;
4	
5	(ix) Adopt a code of ethics; and
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7	(x) Provide for the investigation of complaints
8	against licensees.
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10	33-44-108. Requirements for licensure; registered
11	instructors.
12	
13	(a) The board shall issue a license to practice
14	massage therapy to any person who files a completed
15	application, accompanied by the required fees, and who
16	submits satisfactory evidence that the applicant:
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18	(i) Has reached the age of majority;
19	
20	(ii) Has completed all educational requirements
21	established by the board;
22	

23 (iii) Has completed a training program approved 24 by the board, at a school approved by the board, that

- 1 program being at least six hundred fifty (650) hours in
- 2 length and consisting of the following areas: anatomy,
- 3 physiology, massage therapy, business, hydrotherapy, first
- 4 aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation and professional ethics.
- 5 If the approved training program is less than six hundred
- 6 fifty (650) hours, the applicant shall provide
- 7 documentation of up to three hundred fifty (350) hours of
- 8 alternative qualifying experience, including but not
- 9 limited to professional massage therapy experience,
- 10 apprenticeship training in massage therapy, clinical or
- 11 internship training and prior experience in a health
- 12 career, to be approved by the board; and

- 14 (iv) Demonstrates professional competence by
- 15 passing a written examination as prescribed by the board.

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- 17 (b) The board may also require a practical
- 18 examination as a condition for licensure.

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- 20 (c) The board shall register as a massage therapy
- 21 instructor any applicant who:

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1 (i) Is currently licensed as a massage therapist 2 in another state or by a nationally recognized massage 3 therapist association; and 4 5 (ii) Proves to the board's satisfaction that he meets the minimum requirement of two 6 (2) years of 7 experience in his area of instruction. 8 9 33-44-109. Display of license. 10 A massage therapy license or registration issued by the 11 12 board shall at all times be posted in a conspicuous place 13 in the holder's principal place of business. 14 15 33-44-110. Assignability of license. 16 17 A license or registration issued pursuant to this act is not assignable or transferable. 18 19 20 33-44-111. Examinations. 21 (a) Examinations shall be held at least twice each 22 year on a date and at a location established by the board. 23 Applicants who have been found to meet the education and 24

1 experience requirements for licensure shall be scheduled

2 for the next examination following the filing of the

3 application. The board shall establish by rule the

4 examination application deadline and other rules relating

5 to taking and retaking licensure examinations. The board

6 shall determine the passing grade on examinations.

7

8 (b) The board shall specify by rule the general areas

9 of competency to be covered by examinations for licensure

10 and ensure that the examinations measure adequately both an

11 applicant's competency and knowledge of related statutory

12 requirements. Professional testing services may be utilized

13 for the examinations.

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15 (c) After taking the written examination, each

16 applicant may be tested in the practical application of

17 massage therapy techniques in such a manner and by such

18 methods as shall reveal the applicant's skill and

19 knowledge.

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21 (d) All licensing examinations shall be conducted in

22 such a manner that the applicants shall be known to the

23 board by number until the examination is completed and the

24 grade determined. A record of each examination shall be

1 filed in the board office and be available for inspection

- 2 for a period of not less than two (2) years immediately
- 3 following the examination.

4

5 33-44-112. Temporary license.

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- (a) Prior to examination, an applicant for licensure 7
- may obtain a temporary license to engage in the practice of 8
- 9 massage therapy, provided that the applicant meets all the
- 10 requirements for licensure except completion of the
- 11 examination.

12

- 13 (b) The temporary license is valid until the results
- of the next scheduled examination are available and a 14
- license is issued or denied. If approved, the applicant 15
- shall be issued the initial license for the remainder of 16
- 17 the year.

18

- 19 (c) No more than one (1) temporary license may be
- issued to an individual, and no temporary license shall be 20
- 21 issued to an applicant who has previously failed the
- 22 examinations.

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24 33-44-113. Licensure by credentials.

2 After successful completion of a jurisprudence examination,

3 the board may license an applicant, provided that he

4 possesses a valid license or registration to practice

5 massage therapy issued by the appropriate examining board

6 under the laws of any other state or territory of the

7 United States, the District of Columbia or any foreign

8 nation and has met educational requirements substantially

9 equivalent to or exceeding those established pursuant to

10 this act.

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12 33-44-114. License or registration renewal;

13 continuing education.

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- 15 (a) Massage therapy licenses shall expire annually on
- 16 a date established by rule. Each licensee shall renew his
- 17 license by submitting a renewal application on a form
- 18 provided by the board. The board may establish continuing
- 19 educational requirements as a condition of the renewal of
- 20 licenses.

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- 22 (b) A sixty (60) day grace period shall be allowed
- 23 each license or registration holder after the end of the
- 24 renewal period, during which time a license or registration

1 may be renewed upon payment of the renewal fee and a late

2 fee as prescribed by the board.

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4 **33-44-115**. Inactive status.

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- 6 (a) Any license not renewed at the end of the sixty
- 7 (60) day grace period shall be placed on inactive status
- 8 for a period not to exceed two (2) years. At the end of two
- 9 (2) years, if the license has not been reactivated, it
- 10 shall automatically expire.

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- 12 (b) If, within a period of two (2) years from the
- 13 date the license was placed on inactive status, the massage
- 14 therapist wishes to resume practice, the board shall be
- 15 notified in writing, and, upon proof of completion of any
- 16 continuing education or refresher courses prescribed by
- 17 regulation of the board and payment of an amount set by the
- 18 board in lieu of all lapsed renewal fees, the license shall
- 19 be restored in full.

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21 **33-44-116.** License fees.

22

- 23 (a) The board shall establish a schedule of
- 24 reasonable fees for applications, licenses, registrations,

1 renewals, placement on inactive status and necessary 2 administrative fees in accordance with W.S. 33-1-201 for 3 the following: 4 5 (i) Initial licensure application; 6 7 (ii) Initial license fee; 8 9 (iii) Examination fee; 10 (iv) Annual renewal fee; 11 12 13 (v) Fee for reactivation of an inactive license; 14 and 15 16 (vi) Late renewal fee. 17 18 33-44-117. Advertising. 19 20 Each massage therapist licensed under the provisions of 21 this act shall include the number of his license, in any 22 advertisement of massage therapy services appearing in any newspaper, airwave transmission, telephone directory or 23 other advertising medium. 24

2 33-44-118. Power of county or municipality to

3 regulate massage.

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- 5 A county or municipality, within its jurisdiction, may
- regulate persons licensed pursuant to this act. Regulation 6
- 7 shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of this act.
- This section shall not be construed to prohibit a county or 8
- 9 municipality from enacting any regulation of persons not
- 10 licensed pursuant to this act.

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- 12 33-44-119. Denial, suspension, revocation and
- 13 reinstatement of licenses.

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- (a) The board may place on probation as specified by 15
- 16 the board or refuse to issue or renew or may deny, suspend
- 17 or revoke any license or temporary license held or applied
- for under this act in accordance with the Wyoming 18
- 19 Administrative Procedure Act upon a finding by the board
- 20 that the licensee, registrant or applicant:

21

- 22 (i) Is guilty of fraud, deceit or
- 23 misrepresentation in procuring or attempting to procure a
- 24 license or registration provided for in this act;

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1

2 (ii) Attempted to use as his own the license of

3 another;

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5 (iii) Allowed the use of his license by another;

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7 (iv) Has been adjudicated as mentally

incompetent by regularly constituted authorities; 8

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(v) Has been convicted or found guilty, 10

regardless of adjudication, of a crime, in any 11

12 jurisdiction, that directly relates to the practice of

13 massage therapy or to the ability to practice massage

therapy. Any plea of nolo contendere shall be considered a 14

conviction for the purposes of this section; 15

16

17 (vi) Is guilty of unprofessional or unethical

conduct or a violation of the code of ethics; 18

19

20 (vii) Is habitually or excessively using

21 controlled substances or alcohol;

22

(viii) Is guilty of false, deceptive or 23

24 misleading advertising;

2 (ix) Is guilty of aiding, assisting or

3 advertising any unlicensed or unregistered person in the

4 practice of massage therapy;

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6 (x) Is grossly negligent or incompetent in the

7 practice of massage therapy; or

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9 (xi) Has had a license or registration to

10 practice massage therapy revoked, suspended or denied in

11 any jurisdiction, territory or possession of the United

12 States or another country for acts of the licensee or

13 registrant similar to acts described in this section. A

14 certified copy of the record of conviction shall be

15 conclusive evidence of such conviction.

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17 (b) Disciplinary proceedings may be instituted by

18 sworn complaint of any person, including members of the

19 board, and shall conform with the provisions of the Wyoming

20 Administrative Procedure Act.

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(c) The board may establish the guidelines for the

23 disposition of the disciplinary cases. Such guidelines may

1 include periods of probation, conditions of probation or

2 reissuance of a license or registration.

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4 (d) License and registration holders who have been

5 found culpable and sanctioned by the board shall be

6 responsible for the payments of all costs of the

7 disciplinary proceedings.

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9 **33-44-120.** Penalties.

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11 Any person who violates any provision of this act is guilty

12 of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by

13 a fine not to exceed seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00),

14 imprisonment for a period not to exceed six (6) months, or

15 both.

16

17 **Section 2.** The legislature recognizes that the

18 practice of massage therapy is potentially dangerous to the

19 public. Therefore, it is necessary and in the interest of

20 public health, safety and welfare, to regulate the practice

21 of massage therapy.

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Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2004.
