Sale of hunting and fishing licenses.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; modifying provisions relating to fees charged for the sale of specified hunting 2 and fishing licenses, permits, stamps and tags; providing 3 for additional charges to the price of licenses, permits, 4 5 stamps and tags; modifying provisions for the retention of fees by selling agents; modifying provisions relating to 6 7 the sale of interstate game tags; conforming provisions; 8 and providing for an effective date. 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10

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Section 1. W.S. 11-6-305(a), 23-1-701(a) through (c) and (e), 23-1-702, 23-2-101(j)(intro) and by creating a new subsection (n), 23-2-107(e), 23-2-201(d)(intro), 23-2-301(c)(intro), 23-2-306(a)(intro) and (b)(intro) and 23-2-307(b) are amended to read:

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11-6-305. Wyoming animal damage management board
 funding; sources; methods of collection.

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5 (a) Effective January 1, 2000, there is created a "wildlife damage management" stamp. The stamp, issued at 6 7 licensed selling agents as designated by the Wyoming game and fish commission may be purchased voluntarily. Proceeds 8 9 from the sale of the stamp, excluding twenty-five cents (\$.25) fifty cents (\$.50) which the agent shall retain for 10 11 each stamp sold, shall be deposited by the state treasurer 12 into the animal damage management account created by W.S. 13 11-6-306. The Wyoming game and fish commission shall retain the fees related to those administrative costs which are 14 required to design and print stamps, and collect, account 15 for and disburse these funds to the ADMB. The Wyoming game 16 17 and fish commission shall annually provide to the ADMB a complete and detailed accounting of all administrative 18 costs and fees. 19

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21 23-1-701. Selling agents; administration of oaths;
22 game tags.

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The commission with the advice of the director 1 (a) 2 shall appoint agents to sell game, bird and fish licenses. 3 and tags. Any vendor engaged in the commercial sale of 4 sporting goods and equipment who holds a valid sales tax 5 license issued by the department of revenue under W.S. 39-15-106 may apply to the commission and shall be 6 7 appointed as an agent to sell game, bird and fish licenses, permits and stamps. and tags. At the end of each year, the 8 9 commission shall renew the appointment of agents who had 10 combined game, bird and fish license, permit and stamp 11 sales during that year of not less than one thousand 12 dollars (\$1,000.00). Renewal of the appointment of agents selling fish licenses only or agents serving remote 13 14 locations shall not be subject to the one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00) minimum sales requirement. The commission shall 15 provide bonding for agents for the purpose of selling game, 16 17 bird and fish licenses, permits and stamps. and tags. Bonding shall be provided upon receipt of a nonrefundable 18 annual fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00). The fees shall be 19 20 deposited in a bond pool fund except in any month when the 21 bond pool fund contains one hundred thousand dollars 22 (\$100,000.00) or more the fees shall be deposited in the game and fish fund. The fee shall be paid to the 23 commission before December 1 preceding the year for which 24

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1 the bond shall be in effect. Newly appointed agents shall 2 pay the same fee immediately upon appointment by the 3 commission to receive bonding for the remainder of the 4 calendar year in which the agent was appointed. All claims 5 against an agent's bond shall be paid from the bond pool 6 account.

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(b) Each license selling agent shall charge a fee as 8 9 provided in this subsection for each license, permit or 10 stamp he sells or distributes pursuant to this act. The 11 fee shall not be charged if this act specifies that the 12 issuance shall be without fee or fails to establish a fee 13 for the issuance of the license, permit or stamp. Each 14 license, permit or stamp sold or distributed under this act shall display the total amount only of all fees and other 15 16 charges required under this act. Each selling agent shall retain fifty cents (\$.50) one dollar and fifty cents 17 (\$1.50) for each license and twenty-five cents (\$.25) fifty 18 cents (\$.50) for each conservation stamp under W.S. 19 20 23-2-306 or permit he sells. For failure to comply with 21 this section, selling agents shall not be entitled to fifty cents (\$.50) per license and twenty-five cents (\$.25) for 22 23 each conservation stamp sold retain the amounts specified 24 in this subsection and shall be liable on their bond. No

1	employee of the commission shall receive any commission on
2	licenses <u>,</u> or tags <u>stamps</u> or permits sold, but the
3	department shall charge the additional fee specified in
4	this subsection for each license, stamp or permit sold by
5	commission employees. The fee charged under this subsection
6	shall be in addition to the amount otherwise established by
7	this act for the license, permit or stamp and shall be as
8	follows:
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10	(i) One dollar (\$1.00) for each license, except
11	that this additional fee shall not be charged for licenses
12	under W.S. 23-1-705(e), 23-2-101(j)(xi), (xvi), (xvii),
13	(xx), (xxi), (xxxii) or (xxxiii), 23-2-201(d)(iii) or (iv)
14	<u>or (f) or 23-2-301(c)(xiii);</u>
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16	(ii) Fifty cents (\$.50) for each stamp;
17	
18	(iii) Fifty cents (\$.50) for each permit, except
19	that this additional fee shall not be charged for permits
20	<u>under W.S. 23-1-302(m).</u>
21	
22	(c) On or before the 10th of each month every selling
23	agent shall file a report for the preceding month with the
24	commission on forms approved by the commission. Selling

agents shall also remit all money collected during the previous month less commission, and shall account for and deliver all surplus, unused and damaged licenses, tags, <u>permits, stamps</u>, and stubs of licenses received by the selling agent to the commission.

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7 The department shall supply sufficient numbers of (e) self-locking tags stamped with the words "Wyoming game tag" 8 9 or "Wyoming interstate game tag". The commission by rule 10 may authorize the distribution of interstate game tags by 11 taxidermists, meat processing plants or other businesses as 12 the commission determines. The commission by rule may set 13 the commissions for the sale of interstate game tags not to 14 exceed the commissions paid to license selling agents for the sale of licenses. The commission by rule may also set 15 16 the reporting requirements for businesses authorized to 17 distribute interstate game tags. Interstate game tags shall be furnished through the chief game warden for distribution 18 19 to the game wardens, and such selling agents game tag 20 distributors as the commission may designate. Game wardens 21 and selling agents game tag distributors shall collect and 22 remit to the department the proper fee for each Wyoming 23 game tag or Wyoming interstate game tag.

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23-1-702. Duplicate license upon loss or destruction
 of original; issuance; fees.

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4 When any license issued under this act has been lost or 5 destroyed, the licensee may secure a duplicate of the original license from any district office or any authorized 6 7 personnel of the department upon the presentation of satisfactory proof that the original license was lost or 8 9 destroyed. Prior to issuing the duplicate license and in 10 accordance with rule and regulation of the commission, the 11 department may assess a fee of not more than three dollars 12 (\$3.00) plus the fee charged under W.S. 23-1-701. Duplicate 13 licenses shall be issued in accordance with procedure established by commission order. 14

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16 23-2-101. Fees; restrictions; nonresident application 17 fee; nonresident licenses; verification of residency 18 required.

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(j) Subject to W.S. 23-2-101(f) and the applicable
fee under W.S. 23-1-701, the following hunting licenses and
tags may be purchased for the fee indicated and subject to
the limitations provided:

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8	(e) A resident applicant shall pay a license fee of
9	three hundred thirty dollars (\$330.00) and shall pay the
10	fee required by W.S. 23-2-101(e). A nonresident applicant
11	shall pay a license fee of two thousand one hundred dollars
12	($$2,100.00$) and shall pay the fee required by W.S.
13	23-2-101(e). The fee charged under W.S. 23-1-701 shall be
14	in addition to the fee imposed under this subsection.

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19	(d) The following fishing licenses may be purchased
20	for the fee indicated in addition to the applicable fee
21	under W.S. 23-1-701 and subject to the limitations
22	provided:
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23-2-301. Miscellaneous 1 fees; verification of 2 residency required. 3 4 (c) The following licenses and tags may be purchased 5 for the fee indicated in addition to the applicable fee under W.S. 23-1-701 and subject to other requirements of 6 7 this article: 8

23-2-306. Conservation stamp; exemptions.

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11 (a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section and the 12 applicable fee under W.S. 23-1-701, each sportsman licensed under W.S. 23-2-101, 23-2-107 or 23-2-201 shall purchase a 13 single conservation stamp for ten dollars (\$10.00) which 14 shall be valid for one (1) calendar year and in the 15 16 possession of any person exercising rights under any 17 fishing or hunting license issued pursuant to W.S. 23-2-101, 23-2-107 or 23-2-201. Holders of pioneer licenses 18 as defined under W.S. 23-1-705(d) and (e), of special 19 20 limited fishing permits issued under W.S. 23-2-207 and 21 holders of licenses only under W.S. 23-2-101(j)(v) and 22 (vi), 23-2-201(d)(vi) and (vii) and 23-2-201(f) are exempt from the provisions of this section. Revenues collected 23

from the sale of each stamp under this subsection shall be 1 2 deposited as follows: 3 4 (b) A lifetime conservation stamp may be purchased 5 for one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) plus the applicable fee under W.S. 23-1-701. Revenues collected from the sale 6 7 of each stamp under this subsection shall be deposited as follows: 8 9 10 23-2-307. Special management permit. 11 12 (b) Special management permits may be purchased from 13 the department or its authorized selling agents for ten 14 dollars (\$10.00) plus the applicable fee under W.S. 23-1-701 and shall be valid for one (1) calendar year. 15 16 17 Section 2.
