1	(A) The commission shall adopt rules and
2	regulations to classify the gray wolf as a trophy game
3	animal and prohibit <u>regulate</u> the taking of gray wolves
4	except as provided by W.S. $23-3-115(c)$, within that area of
5	the state the commission determines is necessary to
6	reasonably ensure that at the end of the current calendar
7	year at least seven (7) packs of gray wolves are located in
8	this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National
9	Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller,
10	Jr. Memorial Parkway <u>,</u> at the end of the current calendar
11	year <u>and at least fifteen</u> (15) packs of gray wolves are
12	located in this state including those specified areas;

(ii) Maintain the classification of gray wolves 14 as a predatory animal and trophy game animal as specified 15 in W.S. 23-1-101(a)(viii) and (xii)(B)(I), if it determines 16 there were at least more than seven (7) packs of gray 17 18 wolves located in this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and 19 20 John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway or at least and 21 more than fifteen (15) packs within this state, including Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and 22 John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway as of the end of 23 24 the preceding calendar quarter.

2	(c) For purposes of this section "pack" means five
3	(5) or more gray wolves traveling together <u>that</u> form a
4	group in winter. If a group of gray wolves consists of
5	more than ten (10) animals <mark>,</mark> known to be traveling together,
6	the commission may, at its discretion, recognize the number
7	of packs within such a group to be equal to the number of
8	reproductively mature females bearing young found within
9	that group of wolves.
10	
11	(d) The department shall institute and maintain an
12	active program of population monitoring statewide. In all
13	areas of the state, except where otherwise provided, any
14	person who harvests takes a wolf shall notify report the
15	take and required information concerning the wolf to the
16	department where the harvest occurred within ten (10) days
17	as provided by commission rule and regulation. Any
18	information regarding the number or <u>nature type</u> of wolves
19	legally harvested <u>taken</u> within the state of Wyoming shall
20	only be released in its aggregate form and no information
21	of a private or confidential <u>personal</u> nature shall be
22	released without the written consent of the person to whom
23	the information may refer. Information identifying any
24	person legally <i>harvesting taking</i> a wolf within this state

is solely for the use of the department or appropriate law enforcement offices agencies and is not a public record for purposes of W.S. 16-4-201 through 16-4-205.

5 23-3-115. Taking black bear, mountain lion, gray 6 wolf, bobcat, weasel, badger, squirrels or muskrat for 7 damaging property.

9 The provisions of subsection (a) of this section (C) 10 relating to the taking of animals doing damage to private 11 property shall apply to gray wolves from and after the date 12 gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental 13 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108. The owner, 14 employee or lessee acting under authority of this section 15 16 shall notify the department of the killing taking of a gray 17 wolf within an any area of the state in which the gray wolf is classified as a trophy game animal. The notification 18 19 shall be made within ten (10) days of the kill unless the 20 gray wolf was taken in an area where wolves have been 21 classified as trophy game animals pursuant to W.S. 22 23-1-304 (b) (i) (A) in which case the notification shall be made within seventy-two (72) hours as provided in W.S. 23 24 23-1-304(d).
