for

- 1 AN ACT relating to wolf management; reclassifying the gray
- 2 wolf; providing for management of gray wolves as specified;
- 3 modifying penalty for illegally taking a gray wolf;
- 4 modifying fees for hunting gray wolves; and providing for
- 5 an effective date.

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19	(a) The commission is directed and empowered:

Classification of gray wolves. 6 The commission shall determine the classification 7 (a) of manage gray wolves as provided in this section act. The 8 9 commission shall manage for fifteen (15) packs of gray 10 wolves in this state. In making this classification 11 managing for gray wolves the commission shall rely upon 12 information provided by department personnel and shall 13 consult with the Wyoming animal damage management board created by W.S. 11-6-303 and the director of the Wyoming 14 department of agriculture, and consider any additional 15 16 information provided by that board and by that director. 17 The department shall provide to the commission at 18 (b) least a quarterly monitoring report on the number of gray 19 20 wolf packs within this state and their general location. 21 Within thirty (30) days of receiving a department report

the commission shall at a public meeting:

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(c) For purposes of this section "pack" means five 1 2 (5) or more gray wolves traveling together. If a group of 3 gray wolves consists of more than ten (10) animals known to be traveling together, the commission may, at its 4 5 discretion, recognize the number of packs within such a group to be equal to the number of reproductively mature 6 7 females bearing young found within that group of wolves shall be as defined by commission rule and regulation based 8 9 upon the commission's determination of the number of wolves 10 required at a specified period of the year to prevent 11 future listing of the gray wolf as an experimental 12 nonessential population, endangered or threatened species. 13 The department shall institute and maintain an 14 (d) active program of wolf population monitoring statewide. In 15 16 all areas of the state, except where otherwise provided, 17 any person who harvests takes a wolf shall notify the department where the harvest take occurred within ten (10) 18 19 days the time period required by commission rule and 20 regulation. In adopting rules and regulations requiring 21 notification of the taking of a wolf, the commission shall 22 not require the submission of any parts of the wolf other than its skin and skull. Any information regarding the 23

number or nature type of wolves legally harvested taken

- 1 within the state of Wyoming shall only be released in its
- 2 aggregate form and no information of a private or
- 3 confidential personal nature shall be released without the
- 4 written consent of the person to whom the information may
- 5 refer. Information identifying any person legally
- 6 harvesting taking a wolf within this state is solely for
- 7 the use of the department or appropriate law enforcement
- 8 offices agencies and is not a public record for purposes of
- 9 W.S. 16-4-201 through 16-4-205.

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5 23-2-104. Archery licenses; special seasons;

6 prohibition against firearms; equipment.

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(e) When hunting antelope, bighorn sheep, black bear, 8 deer, mountain goat or mountain lion the longbow hunter 9 10 must be equipped with a longbow of not less than forty (40) 11 pounds draw weight or possessing the ability to cast a 12 hunting arrow of four hundred (400) grain weight at least 13 one hundred sixty (160) yards. When hunting elk, grizzly bear or moose, the longbow hunter must be equipped with a 14 longbow of not less than fifty (50) pounds draw weight or 15 possessing the ability to cast a hunting arrow of five 16 17 hundred (500) grain weight at least one hundred sixty (160) yards. The crossbow hunter must be equipped with a crossbow 18 of not less than ninety (90) pounds draw weight which has a 19 20 minimum draw length of fourteen (14) inches (from front of 21 bow to back of string in the cocked position), a positive 22 safety mechanism, and, except as provided in subsection (f) of this section, which must be cocked by hand without the 23 aid of leverage-gaining devices. Crossbow bolts must be at 24

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1 least sixteen (16) inches long. The broadhead of arrows or

- 2 bolts shall be of sharp steel with a minimum cutting width
- 3 of one (1) inch. The provisions of this subsection
- 4 relating to the hunting of antelope, bighorn sheep, black
- 5 bear, deer, mountain goat and mountain lion shall also
- 6 apply to the hunting of the gray wolf as a trophy game
- 7 animal. from and after the date gray wolves are removed
- 8 from the list of experimental nonessential population,
- 9 endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as
- 10 provided by W.S. 23-1-108.

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- 12 23-3-102. Taking certain game animals without license
- or during a closed season prohibited.

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- 15 (b) Any person who takes any bighorn sheep, mountain
- 16 goat, mountain lion, or grizzly bear or, gray wolf where
- 17 classified as a trophy game animal, without the proper
- 18 license except as otherwise permitted by this act is quilty
- 19 of a 4th degree misdemeanor.

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- 21 23-3-115. Taking black bear, mountain lion, gray
- 22 wolf, bobcat, weasel, badger, squirrels or muskrat for

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23 damaging property.

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(c) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section 1 2 relating to the taking of animals doing damage to private 3 property shall apply to gray wolves from and after the date 4 gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental 5 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108. The owner, 6 7 employee or lessee acting under authority of this section subsection shall save and care for the skin and skull, 8 9 procure a Wyoming game tag for the skin and notify the department of the killing taking of a gray wolf within an 10 11 area of the state in which the gray wolf is classified as a 12 trophy game animal. The notification shall be made within 13 ten (10) days of the kill unless the gray wolf was taken in 14 an area where wolves have been classified as trophy game animals pursuant to W.S. 23-1-304(b)(i)(A) in which case 15 16 the notification shall be made within seventy-two (72) 17 hours in accordance with W.S. 23-1-304 and rules and 18 regulations promulgated pursuant to that section.

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20 **Section 2.** W.S. 11-6-302(a)(ix)(B)(I) and (II), 21 (x)(B)(I) and (II), 23-1-101(a)(viii)(B)(I) and (II),

22 (xii)(B)(I) and (II), 23-1-304(b)(i) and (ii) and 2003

23 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 115, Section 4(c) and (d) are

24 repealed.

2 **Section 3.** The legislature hereby reconfirms the 3 purposes and intent stated in 2003 Wyoming Session Laws,

4 Chapter 115, Section 4(a) and (b). The game and fish

5 commission shall manage for gray wolves as provided by this

6 act in accordance with those purposes and stated intent.

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8 **Section 4.** This act is effective immediately upon 9 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 10 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

11 Constitution.
