Specialty license plates.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to license plates; authorizing the display  
2 of a special license plate; specifying license plate  
3 production and sales; imposing special application fees;  
4 and providing for an effective date.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-2-205 by creating a new subsection  
9 (c) is amended to read:

10

11 **31-2-205. Display of license plates; special license**  
12 **plates.**

14 (c) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a  
15 special license plate in support of a public or private  
16 organization may be displayed on the front of the vehicle  
17 in place of the regular issued license plate. The yearly

1 dated renewal sticker shall be affixed to this special  
2 license plate displayed on the vehicle front plate position  
3 in place of the usual numbered plate. The department shall  
4 prescribe the design of the special license plate, in  
5 consultation with the organization that applied for the  
6 special license plate, and arrange for the production of  
7 the special license plate which shall be available for  
8 purchase upon application by a public or private  
9 organization and payment of the production costs for the  
10 number of the special license plate that has been requested  
11 by the organization. Upon application from the owner of a  
12 vehicle currently registered in Wyoming, along with proof  
13 of current vehicle registration in Wyoming and payment of  
14 the fee not to exceed the cost of the special license plate  
15 plus twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) assessed by the public or  
16 private organization, the organization may issue a special  
17 license plate to the applicant for display on the front of  
18 the vehicle in place of the regular issued license plate.

1           **Section 2.**    This act is effective immediately upon  
2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law  
3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming  
4 Constitution.
