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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-7-102(a)(xxv), 31-7-108(a),
- 10 31-7-109(d) by creating a new paragraph (vii), 31-7-110(a),
- 11 (f) and by creating a new subsection (g), 31-7-113(a) by
- 12 creating a new subsection (xi), 31-7-117(f)(i) and (ii),
- 31-7-126 and 31-7-304 (a) (ii) (C) are amended to read:

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15 **31-7-102.** Definitions.

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1 (a) As used in this act: 2 3 (xxv) "License", "driver's license", "commercial 4 driver's license", or "instruction permit" or "intermediate 5 permit" means any a license or permit secured by a person from the division, in accordance with this act which grants 6 7 the privilege to drive or operate a motor vehicle on the public highways, streets and roads of this state; 8 9 10 31-7-108. Persons not to be licensed; investigation 11 by the division. 12 13 (a) No driver's license shall be issued to any person who is under the age of sixteen (16) seventeen (17) years, 14 except as provided in W.S. 31-7-110 and 31-7-117(c). 15 16 31-7-109. Classes of licenses. 17 18 19 (d) Licensing classification plan: 20 21 (vii) Class "I2" indicates an intermediate 22 permit issued pursuant to W.S. 31-7-110(g). 23

24 31-7-110. Instruction and temporary driver's permits.

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2 (a) Any person who is at least fifteen (15) years of 3 age may apply to the division for an instruction permit. 4 The division, after the applicant has successfully passed 5 all parts of the examination other than the driving test, may issue to the applicant an instruction permit which 6 7 entitles the applicant while having the permit in his immediate possession to drive a specified type or class of 8 9 motor vehicle for a period of one (1) year when accompanied 10 by a person at least eighteen (18) twenty-one (21) years of 11 age who holds a valid driver's license and has been 12 licensed as a driver for the type or class of vehicle being 13 used for at least one (1) year two (2) years, who is fit 14 and capable of exercising control over the vehicle and who is occupying a seat beside the driver. This subsection does 15 16 and subsections (f) and (g) of this section do not apply to 17 motorcycle instruction permits.

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(f) Any person who is at least fourteen (14) years of age and who has applied and been approved for a restricted license under W.S. 31-7-117(c), shall apply to the division for an instruction permit. The division, after the applicant has successfully passed all parts of 23 24 examination other than the driving test, may issue to the

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1 applicant an instruction permit which entitles the 2 having the permit in applicant while his immediate 3 possession to drive a class "C" motor vehicle for a period 4 of sixty (60) days when accompanied by a person at least eighteen (18) twenty-one (21) years of age who holds a 5 valid driver's license and has been licensed as a driver 6 7 for a class "C" vehicle for at least one (1) year two (2) years, who is fit and capable of exercising control over 8 9 the vehicle and who is occupying a seat beside the driver. 10 11 (g) Any person, who is at least sixteen (16) years of 12 and has held an instruction permit pursuant to 13 subsection (a) of this section or a similar permit from 14

another jurisdiction and has completed practice driving of at least fifty (50) actual driving hours, including at 15 16 least ten (10) hours of night driving, may apply to the 17 division for an intermediate permit that entitles the applicant to drive a specified type or class of motor 18 19 vehicle. No permit may be issued unless a parent or 20 quardian certifies the applicant has completed the practice 21 driving requirements. Provided that when operating a motor 22 vehicle, a person with an intermediate permit:

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1	(i) May not transport more than one (1)
2	passenger under the age of twenty-one (21) who is not a
3	member of the permittee's immediate family;
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5	(ii) Shall only be upon a public highway between
6	the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. unless:
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8	(A) Accompanied by a licensed driver
9	twenty-one (21) years of age or older;
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11	(B) Required by medical necessity as
12	evidenced by a signed statement from medical personnel;
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14	(C) Driving to or from work as evidenced by
15	a signed statement from the permittee's employer;

17	(D) Driving to or from school, a school
18	activity or a religious activity as evidenced by a signed
19	statement of a school or religious official or a parent or
20	guardian; or
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22	(E) Required due to a medical emergency.
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1	(iii) May apply for a driver's license no sooner
2	than one (1) year after obtaining an intermediate permit
3	provided his permit had not been suspended or revoked
4	pursuant to W.S. 31-5-233, 31-5-234, 31-5-235, 31-6-108 or
5	a similar local ordinance or a similar statute or ordinance
6	in another jurisdiction and the permittee has not been
7	convicted of a violation of W.S. 31-5-1402, a similar
8	violation in any jurisdiction, a moving violation in any
9	jurisdiction or subsection (g) of this section. Provided
10	that:
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12	(A) Upon receiving competent evidence of a
13	conviction or permit suspension or revocation for an
14	offense specified in this subsection, the division shall
15	notify the person holding the intermediate permit that he
16	will not be able to apply for a driver's license until a
17	year from the date of the conviction or until he reaches
18	the age of seventeen (17) whichever occurs first;

20	(B) A person who has been issued a license
21	prior to receipt of evidence of the conviction or permit
22	suspension or revocation by the division shall have the
23	license cancelled and be required to reapply for intermediate permit and shall not be allowed to reappl

1	a driver's license until one (1) year from the date of
2	conviction or until the permittee has reached the age of
3	seventeen (17) whichever occurs first unless the department
4	determines that reapplying for a license would be futile
5	because the person will be seventeen (17) years of age
6	before the application process would be accomplished.

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10	(a) The following fees are imposed:

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16	(f) A person who is at least fifteen (15) years of
17	age who holds a restricted class "C" license may drive
18	beyond the hours and radius specified in subsection (c) of

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5 31-7-126. Reporting of convictions and failure

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6 appear by courts.

Every court having jurisdiction under any statute of this 8 9 state or a municipal ordinance adopted by local authority 10 regulating the driving of motor vehicles, shall forward to 11 the division within ten (10) working days from the date of 12 conviction a record of the conviction of any person in the 13 court for a violation of any of those laws or ordinances, 14 other than those regulating standing or parking of a motor vehicle. Each court in this state shall also forward to the 15 16 division within ten (10) working days from the date of conviction a record of the conviction of any person under 17 nineteen (19) years of age in the court for a violation of 18 19 any law regarding the possession, delivery, manufacture or 20 use of a controlled substance or alcohol. The court shall 21 also forward to the division a report of any violation by 22 any person of a written promise to appear in court as given to the arresting officer upon the issuance of a traffic 23 24 citation and any failure to appear in court at the time

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1 specified by the court. Failure of a court to forward a

2 record of conviction or violation under this section within

3 the time specified in this section from the date of

4 conviction or violation shall not affect the division's

5 authority under this act.

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7 31-7-304. Issuance; classifications and endorsements.

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9 (a) Commercial driver's licenses may be issued with

10 the following classifications and endorsements. The holder

11 of a valid commercial driver's license may drive all

12 vehicles in the class for which that license is issued and

13 all lesser classes of vehicles except motorcycles and

14 vehicles which require a separate endorsement, unless the

15 proper endorsement appears on the license:

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17 (ii) The following driver's license endorsements

18 are special authorizations permitting the driver to operate

19 certain types of motor vehicles or transport certain types

20 of cargo if the endorsement is displayed on the driver's

21 license:

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23 (C) "P" authorizes the driver to operate a

24 bus or any motor vehicle as defined in W.S.

1 31-7-102(a)(iii) used for the transportation of passengers,

2 providing the licensed driver has attained the age of

3 eighteen (18) years; except the "P" endorsement may be

4 placed upon the license of a licensed driver between the

5 ages of sixteen (16) and eighteen (18) years who has

6 secured the approval of the school district and the

7 permission of a parent or guardian of each child to be

8 transported, thereby allowing the driver to transport

9 students to and from school;

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11 **Section 2.** W.S. 31-7-108(b)(vii) is repealed.

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13 **Section 3.** This act shall only apply to persons

14 applying for a license or permit who are under the age of

15 seventeen (17) on July 1, 2004 and who do not have a valid

16 driver's license from this state or another jurisdiction.

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Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2004.
