## A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to government administration and
2	organization; creating a Wyoming office of energy planning
3	and policy; requiring a reorganization plan as specified;
4	requiring reports as specified; providing definitions;
5	making conforming amendments; authorizing positions;
6	providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective
7	date.

9	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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11	Section 1. W.S. 9-2-2901 is created to read:

9-2-2901. Wyoming office of energy planning and 1 2 policy created; director; powers and duties; reorganization 3 plan. 4 5 (a) There is created as a separate operating agency the Wyoming office of energy planning and policy. 6 7 (b) The administrative head of the office shall be a 8 9 director appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate. The initial director shall be 10 11 appointed not later than April 1, 2004 and may serve as 12 temporary director until a director is confirmed by the 13 senate. The director shall serve at the pleasure of the 14 governor. 15 16 (c) The office shall: 17 18 modify and (i) Review, implement the 19 comprehensive state energy plan developed by the Wyoming 20 energy commission and designed to facilitate development, 21 marketing, use and enhancement of Wyoming energy resources, 22 both within and without the state of Wyoming. In modifying

and implementing the state energy plan, the office shall

attempt to maximize the production and value of all of the 1

2 state's energy resources;

4 (ii) Propose research, development

5 demonstration projects and programs necessary to evaluate

the availability and cost effectiveness of enhanced oil 6

7 recovery, including both secondary and tertiary recovery,

in Wyoming; 8

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10 (iii) Serve as a single contact point within

state government to identify and coordinate all state 11

12 permitting required for construction or development of

13 energy projects within the state;

14

15 (iv) Maintain a public information position

within the office to solicit public input and provide 16

17 information to the public on Wyoming's energy plan and

energy projects proposed or being developed in Wyoming; 18

20 (v) Communicate and coordinate activities

21 relating to energy production and development with agencies

22 and programs of this state, other energy producing states

and the federal government; 23

(vi) Utilize the services of 1 and receive 2 information and assistance from other agencies and programs 3 of this state, other states and the federal government. 4 The office is authorized to seek and utilize matching 5 grants, private funding and other federal government grants and assistance to further the purposes of the office; 6 7 (vii) Establish and maintain a branch office in 8 9 Washington, D.C. to ensure state representation in the 10 development and implementation of national energy plans and 11 policies; 12 13 (viii) Report to the governor and to the state loan and investment board periodically on the activities of 14 the office; 15 16 17 (ix) Adopt rules to carry out the purposes of this article; 18 19 20 (x) Perform such other duties as may be 21 necessary to carry out the purposes of this article. 22 addition to any other powers and duties 23 (d) 24 specified in this section, the director shall prepare a

1 plan for reorganization of agencies, programs and functions

2 as specified in subsections (e) and (f) of this section and

3 submit the plan to the governor for approval. The

4 reorganization plan, as approved by the governor, shall be

5 submitted to the joint minerals, business and economic

6 development interim committee not later than September 15,

7 2004 and made available to the public. The committee shall

8 hold at least one (1) public hearing regarding the plan

9 before December 1, 2004 and shall report to the legislature

10 before the 2005 general session its recommendations on the

11 plan, including necessary legislation with respect to the

12 plan. The reorganization plan, as approved by act of the

13 legislature, shall be implemented not later than July 1,

14 2005.

16 (e) The reorganization plan shall consider whether

17 all or part of the following duties, responsibilities,

18 functions or programs should be assigned to the office:

20 (i) Duties and responsibilities of the Wyoming

21 energy commission specified in W.S. 30-7-101(b);

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(ii) Powers and duties of the Wyoming oil and

24 gas conservation commission;

2 (iii) Science energy and technology authority

3 functions administered by the Wyoming business council

4 under W.S. 9-12-201 and 9-12-202;

6 (iv) Duties of the state under the Western

7 Interstate Nuclear Compact, W.S. 9-6-101 through 9-6-105;

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9 (v) Duties of the natural gas pipeline authority

10 under W.S. 37-5-101 through 37-5-208;

12 (vi) Monitoring activities of the Black Hills

13 joint power commission under W.S. 37-7-301 through

14 37-7-311;

16 (vii) Monitoring activities of irrigation

17 districts undertaking power projects pursuant to W.S.

18 41-7-701 through 41-7-718 and public irrigation and power

19 districts under W.S. 41-7-801 through 41-7-865;

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21 (viii) Monitoring activities of electric light

22 or power plants owned by municipalities or joint powers

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23 boards pursuant to W.S. 15-7-201 through 15-7-209;

(ix) Duties of other programs identified by the 1 2 office that relate to the development, use and enhancement 3 of Wyoming energy resources. 4 5 (f) In developing the reorganization plan the director shall: 6 7 (i) Consider the cost effectiveness of 8 any 9 recommended transfer; 10 (ii) Consider whether the recommended transfer 11 12 will result in a more efficient development of energy 13 production and marketing in the state; 14 15 (iii) Consider the extent to which the 16 recommended transfer would benefit from involvement by another agency; 17 18 (iv) Recommend additional legislation necessary 19 to ensure cooperation between and coordination of all 20 21 energy related programs of the state. 22 (g) Upon approval of the plan by the legislature, the 23 24 director shall submit a report to the governor and the

joint minerals, business and economic development interim 1 2 committee no later than November 1, 2005 addressing the 3 plan implementation. 4 5 (h) As used in this article: 6 7 (i) "Director" means the director of the office; 8 9 (ii) "Office" means the Wyoming office of energy planning and policy. 10 11 12 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-2-1704 (d) by creating a new 13 paragraph (xvi) is amended to read: 14 15 9-2-1704. Reorganization plan; structure; time frame. 16 The entities of state government specified in 17 (d) this subsection are designated as separate operating 18 agencies, which are separate and distinct from the 19 20 departments and offices specified in subsection (a) of this 21 section because of their quasi-judicial responsibility or 22 because of their unique, specialized function which

precludes their inclusion in another department. This act

1 does not otherwise apply to separate operating agencies.

7 Section 3.

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9 (a) There is appropriated from the general fund one

10 million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to the office of energy

11 planning and policy for the period beginning April 1, 2004

12 and ending June 30, 2006 for the purposes of this act.

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14 (b) The office of energy planning and policy is

15 authorized six (6) full-time positions.

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17 **Section 4.** This act is effective immediately upon

18 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

19 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

20 Constitution.
