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15 **9-4-1301.** Definitions.

1 (a) As used in this act: 2 (i) "Assistance" means public funds, including 3 4 but not limited to grants, low interest loans, no interest 5 loans, tax incentives, tax exemptions, tax reductions, industrial bonds or any other funding which is derived from 6 public funds, allocated to private for-profit enterprises 7 in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) for 8 9 a single business project; 10 11 (ii) "Governmental agency" means 12 governmental entity, including municipalities, counties, 13 state government, boards and agencies with the power or 14 authority to allocate public funds to private for-profit 15 enterprises; 16 17 (iii) "Livable wage" means a wage equal to or exceeding the federal poverty level for a family of four 18 19 (4);20 21 (iv) "This act" means W.S. 9-4-1301 and 22 9-4-1302.

24 9-4-1302. Public funds accountability; procedures.

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2 (a) Each governmental agency providing assistance to a for-profit business for the purpose of economic 3 4 development or job growth shall establish wage level and job creation goals to be met by the business. The goals 5 shall include an increase in livable wage jobs in Wyoming. 6 7 (b) The governmental agency providing the assistance 8 9 shall report annually, by April 1, to the department of revenue on a form prescribed by the department the 10 11 following information: 12 13 (i) The governmental agency's name, name of filer and date; 14 15 (ii) The governmental agency's address, phone 16 17 and facsimile numbers; 18 19 (iii) The name of the governmental agency's

20 contact person;

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22 (iv) The type of governmental agency;

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24 (v) The type and amount of assistance;

1 2 (vi) The name, address and telephone number of 3 the business receiving the assistance; 4 5 (vii) The job creation goals; 6 7 (viii) The wage level goals; 8 9 (ix) The date upon which the goals identified in paragraphs (vii) and (viii) of this subsection are expected 10 11 to be completed; 12 13 (x) Actual jobs created since the business

received assistance; 14

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(xi) Actual hourly wages and job numbers for 16 17 each wage level since the business received assistance; and

19 (xii) The last date the actual wage and job 20 creation levels were documented.

22 (c) The department of revenue shall annually compile and publish, by June 1, the results of reports filed 23

1 pursuant to subsection (b) of this section for the previous

calendar year.

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4 (d) All forms filed pursuant to subsection (b) of

5 this section and the annual report compiled pursuant to

6 subsection (c) of this section shall be made available to

7 members of the public upon request.

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9 (e) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-4-1301(a)(i), this act

10 does not apply to tax incentives for mining or oil and gas

11 production.

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Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2004.
