1 (ii) "Routine maintenance and repair" means activities 2 necessary to keep a building or facility in safe and good working order so 3 that it may be used at its original or designed capacity for its originally intended purposes, including janitorial, groundskeeping and maintenance 4 tasks done on a routine basis and typically accomplished by state, 5 university or community college personnel with exceptions for any routine 6 7 tasks accomplished by contractors such as elevator or other specialized 8 equipment or building system maintenance.

(e) Not later than September 1, 2005, the general services division 10 of the department of administration and information shall submit to the 11 12 state building commission a recommendation for funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2006, for major building and facility repair and 13 14 replacement for state institutions, for University of Wyoming facilities and 15 for community college facilities. There is appropriated from the general fund to the attorney general two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00) to be expended only for contracting for the provision of a legal assistance clinic in Laramie, Wyoming for victims of domestic violence or sexual assault for the period beginning July 1, 2004 and ending June 30, 2006. Should federal funding become available for this purpose, any unexpended general fund appropriations shall revert to the general fund upon receipt of federal funds.

[CHIEF INFORMATION OFFICER]

Section 309.

The governor is authorized to employ a chief information officer. The chief information officer shall develop a plan for the organization of information technology activities for all executive and judicial branch agencies including the department of transportation and the game and fish department. The plan shall categorize each information technology structure into an enterprise framework by function. The plan shall also include the

1 development of a system for creating common information technology 2 architecture and standards, which lead to an efficient and effective use of 3 funds. All executive branch agencies including the department 4 transportation and the game and fish department and all judicial branch agencies shall assist in developing the plan and provide any information 5 requested by the chief information officer. The chief information officer 6 7 shall submit the plan to the governor for approval and to the joint 8 appropriations interim committee for review. 18 **Section 310.**

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(a) There is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative service office twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) to fund the preparation of two (2) annual prescription drug cost containment reports. The department of health and legislative service office research staff shall each prepare a cost/benefit report on the savings realized and direct and indirect costs incurred in the implementation of any prescription drug cost-containment measure including but not limited to a preferred drug list, prior authorization, refill too soon program, lock-in program for narcotics, state maximum allowable cost program, or quantity limitations. The report shall assess all therapeutic prescription drug classes that are currently subject to prior authorization and incorporate all prescription drug

1 programs administered by the state. Costs and savings should include 2 consideration of the following: 3 4 (i) Direct costs such as staffing, contracts and other resources used; 5 6 7 (ii) Cost shifting to physicians in terms of added time spent 8 in obtaining authorization for a selected course of therapy; 9 (iii) Internal program cost shifting, including but not limited 10 11 additional prescriptions, laboratory tests, physician hospitalization, and skilled nursing care that are associated with the 12 implementation of the prior authorization program; 13 14 15 (iv) Discussion of qualitative costs and benefits experienced by patients; and 16 17 18 (v) Direct state and federal prescription drug expenditure 19 savings. 20 (b) The legislative service office and the department of health shall 21 22 collectively agree upon the necessary data to be collected. The department 23 of health shall be solely responsible for all data collection as well as any 24 related expenditures for data collection and preparation of the department's 25 annual report. 26

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27 (c) The legislative service office and the department of health shall include recommendations for improvement of this evaluation process as a part of each annual report.

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1 (d) The department of health and the legislative service office shall 2 separately report their annual findings of this study to the joint 3 appropriations interim committee by December 1, 2004 and October 31, 2005.
