1 (a) The Wyoming enhanced and improved oil recovery 2 commission is created. The commission shall consist of 3 eight (8) members. The governor and the state geologist 4 shall serve as ex officio members of the commission. One 5 (1) legislative member shall be appointed by the management council of the legislature. The governor shall appoint the 6 7 remaining members of whom one (1) shall be from the public at large with experience in the oil and gas industry, one 8 9 (1) shall be a member of the oil and gas conservation 10 commission, two (2) shall represent the oil and qas 11 industry and one (1) shall be a representative of the 12 University of Wyoming. The gubernatorial appointments shall 13 be confirmed by the senate. Appointed members shall serve 14 three (3) year terms. Members of the commission shall not receive any fees, salary or other compensation for services 15 16 rendered but are entitled to receive per diem and mileage 17 on the same basis and at the same rate as state employees and reimbursement for any other actual 18 and necessary 19 expenses incurred in the performance of commission duties. 20 The governor may remove any appointed member as provided in 21 W.S. 9-1-202. Except for the legislative member, initial 22 appointments or any vacancy occurring between sessions of 23 the legislature may be filled by the governor in accordance

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with W.S. 28-12-101(b). The commission shall be staffed by 1 2 executive branch agencies as designated by the governor. 3 commission, in conjunction 4 (b) The with the 5 University of Wyoming and oil and gas industry research entities, shall develop: 6 7 (i) A research program at the institute for 8 9 energy research and enhanced oil recovery at the University 10 of Wyoming. The program shall focus on oil and gas recovery 11 technological issues, including carbon dioxide separation, 12 reservoir sweep performance and reservoir displacement 13 efficiency; 14 15 (ii) An expanded program at the institute focusing on technology transfer, to help industry with 16 17 access to and application of existing enhanced oil recovery and improved oil recovery technology. The program shall be 18 19 designed to promote research and technology transfer 20 efforts, including polymer and surfactant flooding, 21 horizontal drilling, zone specific fracturing and three

22 dimensional seismic infill drilling;

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1 (iii) A research program to identify and 2 evaluate all potential sources of carbon dioxide for the 3 purpose of reducing emissions in the state, increasing 4 potential source points for use of industrial carbon 5 dioxide and decreasing the cost of carbon dioxide to industrial users; 6 7 (iv) A research program for chemical engineering 8 9 research on carbon dioxide separation from power plant flue 10 gas, including experiments, theoretical models, laboratory 11 and prototype testing. 12 13 (c) In developing programs under subsection (b) of this section, the commission shall direct development to 14 economically viable solutions. 15 16 The commission: 17 (d) 18 19 (i) Shall oversee and direct development of the 20 programs developed pursuant to subsection (b) of this 21 section; 22

1 (ii) May seek and utilize government and private 2 grants to further the duties of the commission and purposes 3 of this section;

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5 (iii) Shall facilitate the development of formal 6 agreements between the institute and the oil and gas 7 industry through which the industry is provided access to 8 the institute's geologic and engineering reservoir modeling 9 and reservoir characterization work in exchange for 10 providing data access and testing facilities;

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12 (iv) Shall promote and facilitate the transfer 13 of new technologies developed at the institute throughout 14 the oil and gas industry in this state;

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16 (v) May establish advisory task forces to 17 evaluate the responsiveness of programs developed under 18 this section, the effectiveness of technology transfer and 19 funding from nonstate sources.

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(e) The commission shall provide preliminary progress
reports to the joint minerals, business and economic
development interim committee by November 1, 2004 and
November 1, 2005.

1 2 (f) As used in this section: 3 (i) "Commission" means the Wyoming enhanced and 4 5 improved oil recovery commission; 6 7 (ii) "Enhanced oil recovery and improved oil recovery" means all existing and potential technology to 8 9 recover oil beyond traditional primary and secondary 10 methods; 11 12 (iii) "Institute" means the institute for energy 13 research and enhanced oil recovery at the University of Wyoming. 14 15 16 Section 2. W.S. 9-2-1704(d) by creating a new 17 paragraph (xvi) is amended to read: 18 19 9-2-1704. Reorganization plan; structure; time frame. 20 21 (d) The entities of state government specified in 22 this subsection are designated as separate operating agencies, which are separate and distinct from the 23 departments and offices specified in subsection (a) of this 24

section because of their quasi-judicial responsibility or
 because of their unique, specialized function which
 precludes their inclusion in another department. This act
 does not otherwise apply to separate operating agencies.
 Separate operating agencies are as follows:

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7 (xvi) Wyoming enhanced and improved oil recovery

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10 The legislature finds the state's oil Section 3. 11 fields are in most cases in declining production, yet the 12 majority of the oil in these fields remains untapped 13 underground. While unrecoverable by traditional production methods, enhanced oil recovery and improved oil recovery 14 techniques exist to recover significantly more oil from 15 Wyoming fields. A successful enhanced oil recovery and 16 17 improved oil recovery program, focused on research and technology transfer, can reasonably be expected to increase 18 oil production. A successful enhanced oil recovery and 19 20 improved oil recovery program will increase revenues to the 21 state and increase employment for its citizens; therefore 22 the state has a compelling interest in promoting widespread application of enhanced oil recovery and improved oil 23 24 recovery technologies in Wyoming.

1 Section 4. Notwithstanding W.S. 30-8-101, of the 2 3 initial appointments to the enhanced and improved oil 4 recovery commission, the one (1) public at-large member, 5 one (1) member representing the oil and gas industry and the legislative member shall be appointed to an initial 6 7 term of two (2) years. 8 Section 5. 9 10 11 (a) There is appropriated to the University of 12 Wyoming from the general fund, two million four hundred eleven thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,411,500.00). This 13 appropriation shall be used solely to fund activities of 14 the institute for energy research and enhanced oil recovery 15 at the University of Wyoming taken in furtherance of this 16 17 act. 18 19 There is appropriated to the governor's office (b) 20 from the general fund, twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) 21 for expenses of the enhanced and improved oil recovery

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commission.
