A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to a Wyoming Cosmetology Act; providing for
- 2 the licensure of manicurist or nail technicians,
- 3 estheticians and hair stylists as specified; specifying
- 4 duties of the board of cosmetology; specifying reasons for
- 5 the revocation, suspension or nonrenewal of licenses;
- 6 providing for fees; and providing for an effective date.

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    of a combination of practices or services performed for
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    others for the improvement and beautification of the hair
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    for cosmetic purposes;
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              (vi) (xi) "Instructor" means a person licensed to
    teach cosmetology or any practices thereof in a school of
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    cosmetology as defined by this act and rules of the board;
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              (vii) (xii) "License" means a current document
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    recognizing the cosmetologist, manicurist or nail
    technician, esthetician, hair stylist, instructor, salon or
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    school has met the qualifications required for doing
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    business in this state;

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    person who engages in the practice of manicuring or nail
    technology as defined by this act and rule of the board and

Each member shall be a 15 16 cosmetologist licensed in Wyoming, and at least one (1) 17 shall be an instructor licensed in Wyoming. Each member of the board shall be a resident of Wyoming with at least five 18 19 (5) years experience as a cosmetologist in Wyoming 20 immediately preceding the appointment. Appointments shall

license is required, is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable,

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An applicant for a license to practice or instruct 11 12 cosmetology, manicuring or nail technology, esthetics or 13 hair styling in Wyoming who is a qualified and currently licensed cosmetologist, manicurist or nail technician, 14 esthetician, hair stylist or cosmetology instructor in 15 16 another state, upon submitting an application to the board, 17 a certification from the board or licensing agency of the state in which the applicant is licensed, proof of meeting 18 the requirements of this section and payment of the 19 20 required fee, may receive a cosmetologist, manicurist or 21 nail technician, esthetician, hair stylist or cosmetology 22 instructor license by endorsement without examination in this state. An applicant from another state which does not 23 require a board examination for licensure, or an applicant 24

1 who did not attend a licensed state approved cosmetology,

2 manicuring or nail technology, esthetics or hair styling

3 school meeting requirements of the rules of the board,

4 shall not obtain a Wyoming license by endorsement. An

5 applicant from another state who has not practiced

8 application shall obtain a Wyoming license by endorsement

Any member of the board 13 may administer oaths to witnesses appearing to testify 14 before the board or before any board member. 15 16 (b) (c) The board may refuse to grant a license to any 17 person guilty of fraud, cheating or unfair practices in passing the examination, or who has at any time been found 18 19 guilty of a felony or of grossly unprofessional or 20 dishonest conduct, as defined by the board, or to anyone 21 addicted to the use of intoxicating liquor or drugs to such an extent as to render him unfit to practice or teach 22 23 cosmetology, or to anyone advertising by means
