A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to contagious and infectious diseases; 2 providing for sale of cattle or domestic bison infected
- 3 with or exposed to brucellosis; amending the payment for
- 4 the slaughter of livestock affected with tuberculosis;
- 5 providing for brucellosis testing and surveillance as
- 6 specified; providing a penalty; and providing for an
- 7 effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-19-406 is created to read:

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13 11-19-406. Sale of diseased cattle or domestic bison.

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- 15 All cattle or domestic bison in Wyoming lawfully found to
- 16 be affected with brucellosis, including all sexually intact

1 cattle or domestic bison that are part of a herd found to be affected with brucellosis, may be shipped or transported 2 3 under the direction of the state veterinarian to livestock 4 markets and sold for immediate slaughter or transferred to 5 an approved slaughter facility or veterinary diagnostic laboratory in accordance with federal regulations. 6 to directing that any cattle or bison that are part of an 7 infected herd be sold under this section, the state 8 9 veterinarian shall ascertain that sufficient funds are available from either federal or state sources to ensure 10 11 that the owner of the condemned cattle or domestic bison will be paid the difference between the market value at the 12 13 time of quarantine and the amount received for the sale, less any amount of reimbursement provided for and paid 14 under federal law or regulation, the cost of shipping or 15 16 transportation and commission charges. Payments under this 17 section shall not be made by the state for any sexually intact female cattle or bison which are over twelve (12) 18 months old and which are not official calfhood vaccinates 19 20 as provided in board rule and regulation.

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Section 2. W.S. 11-19-214 and 11-19-405 by creating 22

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new subsections (c) through (f) are amended to read: 23

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11-19-214. Sale of diseased livestock. 1

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3 All cattle livestock in Wyoming lawfully found to be 4 affected with either tuberculosis or Bang's disease may be 5 shipped or transported under the direction of the state veterinarian in accordance with federal regulations, to 6 7 livestock markets and there sold for salvage and destroyed or transferred to an approved slaughter facility or 8 9 veterinary diagnostic laboratory in accordance with federal 10 Prior to directing that any affected regulations. 11 livestock be sold under this section, the state 12 veterinarian shall ascertain that sufficient funds are 13 available from either federal or state sources to ensure that the owner of condemned cattle shall receive the entire 14 15 proceeds for such sale less livestock will be paid the 16 difference between the market value at the time of 17 quarantine and the amount received for the sale, less any amount of reimbursement provided for and paid under federal 18 19 law or regulation, the cost of shipping or transportation 20 and commission charges. If the net salvage obtained from 21 the cattle does not equal their assessed valuation for the 22 year preceding the date of condemnation and shipping, the difference between the sale monies and the assessed 23

valuation shall be paid to the owner of the cattle 1 2 appropriation for that purpose. 3 4 11-19-405. Control of brucellosis; governor 5 authorized to negotiate with federal agencies. 6 7 (c) In the event of a confirmed outbreak of 8 brucellosis, the governor may authorize the state 9 veterinarian, with the approval of the Wyoming livestock 10 board, to require brucellosis testing of all test eligible 11 bovine or domestic bison at the farm or ranch of origin or 12 any licensed Wyoming livestock market prior to a change of 13 ownership for a period of up to eighteen (18) months. At 14 the end of the required testing period, the state 15 veterinarian shall review the testing requirement and may 16 reimpose brucellosis testing for one (1) or more successive 17 periods under this subsection if there is deemed by the state veterinarian to be a threat to Wyoming's brucellosis 18 19 free status or if the state is designated as brucellosis 20 class A or lower status.

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22 (d) The state veterinarian may direct any Wyoming 23 brand inspector to withhold a brand inspection for movement

or change of ownership to any person who has not shown 1 2 evidence of any required brucellosis test.

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4 (e) As part of the state brucellosis surveillance and

5 prevention program, the state veterinarian may require

6 brucellosis testing at any licensed Wyoming livestock

market at any time. Failure to comply shall result in a 7

suspension of the livestock market's license. 8

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10 (f) Any person who violates any provision of this

11 section shall be punished as provided by W.S. 11-1-103.

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Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 13

completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 14

15 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

16 Constitution.
