Teacher shortage loan repayment program.

## A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to teachers; establishing the Wyoming
2	teacher shortage loan repayment program; specifying
3	eligibility criteria; prescribing procedures and repayment
4	of loans; providing for program administration by the
5	Wyoming higher education assistance authority; sunsetting
6	the program; providing an appropriation; providing for
7	transfer of appropriations and administration under
8	specified conditions; and providing for an effective date.
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10	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

12	Section 1. W.S. 21-7-601 is created to read:

14	ARTICLE 6
15	WYOMING TEACHER SHORTAGE LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM

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21-7-601. Wyoming teacher shortage loan repayment 1

2 program; eligibility criteria; procedures; program

3 reporting.

5 (a) The Wyoming teacher shortage loan repayment

program is created to be administered by the Wyoming higher 6

7 education assistance authority established under W.S.

21-16-703. Applicants shall be residents of this state or 8

9 graduates of a Wyoming high school and may apply for loans

from the program in accordance with this section. 10

11

12 (b) To qualify for a loan under this section, the

13 applicant shall first:

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15 (i) Be enrolled in good standing in a teacher

education program at the University of Wyoming leading to 16

17 certification as a special education, math or science

18 teacher;

19

20 (ii) Have class standing of at least a junior

21 for the first semester for which application for a loan

22 under this program is made;

23

24 (iii) Apply for federal financial assistance.

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(c) Subject to the availability of funds appropriated for this program, loans under this section may be granted to qualified applicants to pay the unmet financial need, as determined by the Wyoming higher education assistance authority, of attendance at the teacher education program specified under paragraph (b) (i) of this section.

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9 (d) A loan provided under this section shall not
10 exceed the cost of attendance for the approved program,
11 reduced by the amount of any Pell or other federal grant
12 and any employer based financial assistance received by the
13 applicant.

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(e) A recipient of a loan under this section may 15 16 repay the loan without cash payment by working in Wyoming 17 as a certified teacher in a Wyoming public school as provided in subsection (f) of this section. To qualify as 18 repayment under this subsection, work shall be performed 19 20 within the minimum amount of time necessary to repay the 21 loan, plus two (2) years, which shall begin with the calendar month following the month in which the student 22 completed the academic program. 23

(f) Qualified work under subsection (e) of this 1

2 section shall be credited such that the student's loan

3 balance is reduced on the basis of one (1) year of full-

4 time employment repaying the loan balance for one (1)

5 academic year of full-time enrollment. Qualified work

shall be credited on a proportional basis to the loan 6

7 balance.

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9 (g) Any recipient of a loan under this section who

10 fails:

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12 (i) To complete the academic program for which

13 the loan was provided shall commence cash repayment of the

loan no later than forty-five (45) days after the recipient 14

leaves the academic program; 15

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17 (ii) To obtain employment in the targeted

occupation for which the person received the education 18

within two hundred forty (240) days after successfully 19

20 obtaining the appropriate certification, shall commence

21 cash repayment of the loan within two hundred eighty-five

22 (285) days after successfully obtaining the appropriate

23 certification;

1 (iii) To obtain the appropriate certification

2 within one hundred eighty (180) days after completion of

3 the program shall commence cash repayment of the loan.

4

5 (h) Loan repayment options under this section may be

deferred for a period not to exceed four (4) years while a 6

7 loan recipient is serving on full-time active duty with any

branch of the military services of the United States. 8

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10 (j) The Wyoming higher education assistance authority

11 shall have the powers and duties specified under W.S.

12 21-16-705 to implement this section and shall establish

terms and conditions of loans issued under this section, 13

14 including:

15

16 (i) Interest rates and loan terms;

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(ii) The form and process for loan application, 18

19 review and award;

20

21 (iii) Criteria under which students may be

22 relieved from having to repay loans and interest thereon,

in whole or in part, where the requirement to repay would 23

24 cause undue hardship.

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2 (k) Funding of the loan program established under

3 this section shall be by appropriation of the legislature.

4 The authority shall transfer approved loan amounts to the

5 University of Wyoming.

6

7 (m) Cash repayment of loans and interest thereon

8 shall be credited to the general fund.

9

10 (n) The authority shall annually review the loan

11 program established under this section and report to the

12 governor and the legislature in accordance with W.S.

13 9-2-1014, regarding program results, funds received and

14 loans issued during the preceding academic year, together

15 with the status of all outstanding loan commitments and

16 repayments under the program. The report required under

17 this subsection shall include information submitted by the

18 professional teaching standards board regarding the impact

19 of the program on identified teacher shortage areas and

20 recommendations for modifications to the program, including

21 funding levels, to address other identified teacher

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22 shortage areas.

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1 (o) This program created by this section shall expire 2 effective June 30, 2011.

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4 (p) Notwithstanding subsection (o) of this section:

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(i) Any person who receives a loan under this 6 7 section shall continue to receive funding for the program as the person remains eligible as required by this section; 8

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10 (ii) Repayment of loans provided under this section shall continue as specified by this section until 11 12 all loan obligations have been satisfied.

## 14 Section 2.

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16 (a) Four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000.00) is 17 appropriated from the general fund to the Wyoming higher education assistance authority to implement this act. Not 18 more than five percent (5%) of the amount appropriated 19 20 under this section may be used by the Wyoming higher 21 education assistance authority for administration of the 22 program, including expenses of the authority and loan 23 administration fees.

(b) If responsibility for administration of the 1

2 Wyoming investment in nursing program under W.S. 9-2-123 is

3 transferred to another state agency by enactment of

4 legislation adopted during the 2005 general session, the

5 appropriation under this section is transferred to that

successor agency and the administration of the Wyoming 6

teacher shortage loan repayment program established under 7

this act shall be accordingly transferred to that successor 8

9 agency.

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Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 11

completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 12

as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 13

14 Constitution.
