- 8 paragraph (xi) and by creating a new subsection (b) is

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33-26-103. Applicability of chapter.

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13 (a) This chapter does not apply to:

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- 15 (xi) Any person who practices direct entry
- 16 midwifery if that person:

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2	(A) Does not in any manner advertise, hold
3	himself out or otherwise represent that he is authorized to
4	<pre>practice medicine;</pre>

6	(B) Does not in any manner otherwise
7	perform any of the other acts specified in W.S.
8	33-26-102(a)(xi), except delivering or assisting in the
9	delivery of infants and the management of pregnancy and
LO	parturition when the mother to be has also been seen by a
L1	licensed physician at least twice during the pregnancy; and

L3	(C) Is registered with the board, verifying
L 4	that he has successfully completed requirements established
L 5	by the North American registry of midwives for certified
L 6	professional midwives.

L 8	(b) For purposes of this section, "direct entry
L 9	midwife" means an independent practitioner educated in the
20	discipline of midwifery through self-study, apprenticeship,
21	a midwifery school or a college or university-based program
22	distinct from the discipline of nursing. A direct entry
23	midwife is trained to provide the midwifes' model of care

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- 1 to healthy women and newborn infants throughout the child
- 2 bearing cycle primarily in out-of-hospital settings.
