State outdoor recreation areas and facilities-fees.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to state outdoor recreation areas; authorizing the establishment of fees for state outdoor 2 recreation areas by the department of state parks and 3 cultural resources; providing criteria and requirements for 4 5 the establishment of fees; repealing statutorily set fees; authorizing the establishment of amenities and 6 7 enhancements; providing for a continuous appropriation of 8 fees; making conforming amendments; and providing for an 9 effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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13 **Section 1.** W.S. 36-4-121(a) (intro), by creating new

14 paragraphs (xiii) through (xv), by amending and renumbering

15 (xiii) and (xiv) as (xvi) and (xvii), (b), (c), (e), (h),

1 (j), (k) (n), (o) and by creating a new subsection (p),

2 36-4-123(a)(intro) and 36-8-1002(d) are amended to read:

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4 **36-4-121**. Permits to use outdoor recreation areas and 5 facilities.

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7 (a) department of state parks and cultural resources shall offer for sale permits that allow use of 8 9 the state parks, recreation areas, archeological sites and 10 historic sites. Daily use permits shall be required at 11 Glendo, Guernsey, Curt Gowdy, Edness Kimball Wilkins, Buffalo Bill, Boysen, Seminoe and Keyhole state parks and 12 13 Fort Bridger, South Pass City, Trail End, Fort Fetterman and Fort Phil Kearney state historic sites, and Hawk 14 15 Springs state recreation area outdoor recreation areas and 16 facilities. There shall be no daily use fees established at 17 Bear River or Hot Springs State parks. The department may establish voluntary pay stations at Bear River and Hot 18 19 Springs state parks to allow users of those parks to make 20 voluntary contributions for the use of the state parks. 21 Persons who enter or use Bear River or Hot Springs state 22 park without paying daily use fees shall not be subject to 23 the penalties provided for in subsection (j) of this 24 section. Overnight camping permits shall be required at

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Boysen, Buffalo Bill, Curt Gowdy, Glendo, 1 2 Keyhole, Seminoe and Sinks Canyon state parks, Connor 3 Battlefield state historic site, Medicine Lodge state 4 archeological site and Hawk Springs state recreation area by the department during the entire calendar year. Except 5 for as otherwise provided in this section, including the 6 7 lifetime permit issued without cost pursuant to subsection (n) of this section, the cost of the permits authorized 8 9 under this section shall be the department is authorized to 10 establish daily, overnight and annual permit fees by rule 11 and regulation annually. The permit fees may be 12 established to allow the use of all outdoor recreation 13 areas and facilities, any specified outdoor recreation area 14 or facility, or any combination thereof. The department shall maintain records sufficient to support the fees 15 charged and shall establish fees in accordance with the 16 17 following: 18

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(xiii) Fees shall be established by rule promulgated in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act and approved by the commission. Upon receipt of notice from the department of its intent to adopt rules pursuant to this subsection, the legislative service office shall give notice to the joint travel,

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The operation and maintenance costs of 1 (D) 2 outdoor recreation areas and facilities. 3 4 (xiii) (xvi) Upon written request of a group 5 sponsoring a special event or upon the department's sponsorship of a special event, the director of the 6 department may, with the approval of after informing the 7 parks and cultural resources commission, waive any fees 8 9 required under established pursuant to this subsection. A fee which may exceed the daily use permit fee specified in 10 11 this section provided by rule may be charged for entry to 12 special events. Holders of annual bucking horse daily or 13 evernight permits may be charged the special event fee. A special event fee may be charged at any park, area or site 14 outdoor recreation area or facility under the jurisdiction 15 16 of the department, regardless of whether a daily use fee 17 has been established by law rule; 18 19 (xiv) (xvii) Fees may be waived for by the 20 following: department with the approval of the commission. 21 22 (A) Persons needing to pass through a state

park or historic site to access private property shall be

1 exempt from the entrance permit requirements of this 2 section; 3 4 (B) Persons needing access to a state park or historic site to conduct official business or only to 5 6 access a private commercial business without further use of 7 the state park or historic site shall be exempt from the 8 entrance permit requirements of this section; 9 10 (C) School groups on school sanctioned events including events sanctioned by educational programs 11 defined under W.S. 21-4-101(a)(iii), (iv) and (v), and 12 residents and staff of publicly owned homes or institutions 13 while on official agency functions shall be exempt from the 14 15 entrance permit requirements of this section; 16 17 (D) Not for profit groups or organizations 18 needing access to a state park or historic site to provide volunteer assistance or services that have been previously 19 agreed upon by the department of state parks and cultural 20 21 resources shall be exempt from the permit requirements of 22 this section. 23

(b) Any holder of an annual bucking horse entrance 1 2 permit or an annual resident or nonresident overnight 3 camping permit may obtain additional vehicle annual bucking 4 horse entrance permits or additional vehicle annual 5 overnight camping permits from the department or selling agent of the department upon payment of 6 the 7 established fee, prescribed under paragraph (a) (vii) or (viii) of this section, as applicable, and upon submission 8 9 of proof satisfactory to the department that an original 10 annual permit was purchased and that the additional vehicle 11 is registered in the same name as the vehicle for which the 12 original annual permit is obtained, or that the additional vehicle is operated by the person who purchased the 13 original annual permit or a member of his family under duly 14 granted authority from his employer. The director shall 15 determine the validity of the authority of an applicant to 16 17 operate an employer-owned vehicle prior to issuance of an additional vehicle permit for that vehicle under this 18 section. Any vehicle in tow by another vehicle owned by the 19 20 same person shall be considered a single vehicle for 21 purposes of this section and only a single annual bucking 22 horse daily use permit or fee shall be required for 23 entrance at state parks outdoor recreation areas and 24 facilities and a single annual overnight camping permit or

1 <u>fee</u> shall be required for overnight camping at state parks

2 outdoor recreation areas and facilities.

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annual resident or nonresident overnight camping permit is lost, mutilated or destroyed, the holder of the permit may obtain a duplicate annual permit from the department or any selling agent of the department upon filing an affidavit showing the loss, mutilation or destruction of the original permit and upon payment of the fee imposed under paragraph (a) (ix) or (x) of this section by rule, as applicable.

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13 The department through the division of state parks and historic sites shall in accordance with W.S. 14 36-4-123, appoint selling agents to sell bucking horse 15 16 permits authorized under this section. Each appointed 17 selling agent shall retain up to ten percent (10%) as established by rule of the department under subsection (a) 18 of this section of the cost selling price of each permit 19 20 sold under this section as his sales commission. Designated 21 department employees may sell annual bucking horse daily 22 use permits and other permits required by this section but no employee of the department shall receive any commission 23 24 on permits sold.

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(h) The funds received by the department from the sale of the permits shall be deposited in a capital construction account within the enterprise fund and are continuously appropriated to and may be expended by the division department for capital construction projects, major maintenance and site interpretation such as exhibits, signage and displays. as approved by the legislature.

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10 (j) Any person using state parks, recreation areas 11 and historic sites any outdoor recreation area or facility 12 and failing to obtain a bucking horse permit or the other 13 permits or pay the fee required by pursuant to this section 14 and any person otherwise violating this section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than 15 seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), imprisonment for not 16 17 more than six (6) months, or both.

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(k) The department of state parks and cultural resources is authorized to contract with the town of Ranchester to implement a fee collection program at Connor Battlefield state historic site and to provide for park maintenance and operation. Notwithstanding subsection (h) of this section, fees collected pursuant to paragraphs

1 (a) (ii) and (v) of this section for overnight camping at

2 Connor Battlefield state historic site shall be deposited

3 into a separate account within the earmarked revenue fund

4 and are continuously appropriated to and may be expended by

5 the department pursuant to contracts entered into under

6 this subsection.

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Any resident disabled veteran who receives fifty 8 9 percent (50%) or more service connected disability 10 compensation from the United States department of veteran's 11 affairs may apply to the department for a lifetime bucking 12 horse permit authorizing the use of state parks, outdoor 13 recreation areas, archeological sites and historic sites 14 facilities without payment of any daily use, overnight or other fee authorized to be charged pursuant to this 15 16 section. Only one (1) permit shall be issued to any 17 qualified applicant under this subsection and shall be valid for the applicant and for all occupants of the 18 applicant's vehicle. In addition to information and other 19 20 application procedural requirements prescribed by rule and 21 regulation of the department, application for the lifetime 22 permit shall include proof of residency and certification of the service connected disability. The lifetime permit is 23 24 valid as long as the holder is a Wyoming resident. A permit

1 under this subsection shall be issued to an eligible

2 applicant without the imposition of a fee.

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4 (o) The department is authorized to sponsor special 5 events and to contract with groups sponsoring special state parks, outdoor recreation areas, 6 events at 7 archeological sites or historic sites and facilities. A 8 special event fee may be charged as provided in paragraph 9 (a) (xiii) (a) (xvi) of this section. The special event fee need not be established by rule. All funds received from 10 11 special events sponsored or approved by the department 12 shall be deposited in a special events enterprise account. 13 within the enterprise fund. The funds deposited within the 14 account are continuously appropriated to and may be expended by the department to conduct special events 15 16 directly or pursuant to contracts entered under this 17 subsection.

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(p) The department is authorized to develop additional amenities and enhancements at existing outdoor recreation areas and facilities. The department may impose a fee for the use of any amenity or enhancement in excess of fees charged for admission to the outdoor recreation area or facility, to fund the cost of the amenity or

- 1 enhancement authorized under this section. Fees under this
- 2 subsection shall be established in an amount to ensure
- 3 that, to the extent practicable, the revenue generated from
- 4 the additional fee collected approximates the direct and
- 5 indirect costs of maintaining and operating the amenity or
- 6 enhancement. Fees collected pursuant to this subsection
- 7 shall be deposited and expended in accordance with
- 8 subsection (h) of this section.

- 10 **36-4-123**. Selling agents for registrations, licenses
- 11 and permits.

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- 13 (a) The department of state parks and cultural
- 14 resources through the division of parks and historic sites
- 15 shall appoint selling agents to sell snowmobile
- 16 registrations pursuant to W.S. 31-2-402, bucking horse
- 17 permits under W.S. 36-4-121 and other licenses,
- 18 registrations and permits for which the department may by
- 19 law be required authorized to issue and collect fees.
- 20 Selling agents appointed under this section shall be bonded
- 21 by the department, subject to the following:

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23 **36-8-1002**. Transfer of lands; park administration;

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24 site administration; lease and contract agreements.

2 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 3 department may impose an admissions fee in excess of fees 4 charged for admissions to other state parks and sites 5 outdoor recreation areas and facilities, to fund necessary expenses incurred for park and site development, operations 6 and maintenance. Notwithstanding W.S. 36-4-121(h) Daily 7 admission fees collected pursuant to this subsection shall 8 9 be deposited into a separate account within the earmarked 10 revenue fund and may be expended by the department upon legislative appropriation in accordance with W.S. 11 12 36-4-121(h). 13 14 **Section 2.** W.S. 36-4-121(a)(i) through (xii) repealed. 15 17 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

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completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 18 19 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 20 Constitution.
