1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming Pharmacy Act; amending 2 licensing requirements for resident and nonresident 3 pharmacies as specified; amending grounds for denial, 4 suspension, revocation or nonrenewal of licenses as specified; amending grounds for required notice 5 by licensees to the board of pharmacy; and providing for an 6 7 effective date.

12	place in the pharmacy for which it is issued, and shall

14	annually on or before June 30 by submitting a renewal

17	(c) It is unlawful for any person or commercial
18	operation to operate a pharmacy unless a license has been
19	issued to the operator by the board of pharmacy.
20	
21	(d) The board of pharmacy may deny, suspend, revoke
22	or refuse to renew a license issued under the section, may
23	issue a letter of admonition, to a resident pharmacy
24	licensee and may assess an administrative penalty, of up to

2	renew any registration obtained by false representation or
3	fraud, or when the pharmacy for which the registration was
4	made is kept open for the transaction of business without a
5	registered pharmacist in charge thereof, or when the person
6	to whom registration was granted or his employees or other
7	persons under his supervision or control has been convicted
8	of a violation of W.S. 33-24-101 through 33-24-301. per
9	violation, against a resident pharmacy licensee on any of
10	the following grounds:

14	(viii) Purchase or receipt of a dangerous drug,
15	controlled substance or medical device that is not approved
16	by the federal drug administration;

18	(ix) Keeping the pharmacy open for business
19	without a licensed pharmacist in charge on site;
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21	(x) Allowing a person who is not licensed by the
22	board to perform duties as a pharmacist, pharmacy
23	technician or pharmacy technician in training.
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1 (e) Before any final adverse administrative penalty may be assessed action is taken against a pharmacy 2 3 licensee, the holder of the registration licensee is 4 entitled to a hearing by the board of pharmacy upon due 5 notice of the time and place where the hearing will be held. The accused may be represented by legal counsel, is 6 entitled to compulsory attendance of witnesses and may 7 appeal to the district court of the county in which the 8 9 pharmacy is situated, in accordance with the Wyoming 10 Administrative Procedure Act. 11 12 (f) Any administrative penalty assessed shall be paid 13 to the board who shall remit the monies to the county treasurer to the credit of the public school fund of the 14 county in which the violation occurred. 15 16 17 33-24-152. Nonresident pharmacy registration; 18 requirements for registration; fees; renewal; denial, 19 letter of admonition, administrative penalty, revocation or 20 suspension; advertising. 21 22 (a) Any pharmacy located outside this state which ships, mails or delivers, in any manner, controlled 23 substances or dangerous drugs or devices into this state 24

pursuant to a prescription or provides pharmaceutical care

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2 to a resident of this state shall be considered a 3 nonresident pharmacy, shall register with obtain a license 4 from the board, and shall: 5 6 (ii) Comply with all directions and requests for 7 information from the regulatory or licensing agency of the state in which it is licensed as well as with all requests 8 9 for information made by the board pursuant to this section. The nonresident pharmacy shall maintain, at all times, a 10 11 valid unexpired license, permit or registration to conduct 12 the pharmacy in compliance with the laws of the state in which it is a resident; . As a prerequisite to registering 13 with the board, the nonresident pharmacy shall submit a 14 15 copy of the most recent inspection report resulting from an 16 inspection conducted by the regulatory or licensing agency of the state in which it is located; 17 18 19 (v) Submit a license application to the board on 20 a form prescribed by the board and pay the license fee 21 established by the board in its rules and regulations; 22 (vi) Immediately notify the board of the 23 24 occurrence of any of the following:

22	this section shall be renewed annually on or before the
23	first day of July of each year June 30 by submitting a
24	renewal application to the board.

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2	(e) The board may deny, suspend, revoke or refuse to
3	renew a license issued under this section, may issue a
4	letter of admonition, to a nonresident pharmacy licensee
5	and may assess an administrative penalty, not to exceed two
6	thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) per violation, revoke or
7	suspend against a nonresident pharmacy registration for
8	failure to comply with any requirement of this chapter.

20 (x) Retaining a pharmacist in charge who does 21 not obtain a Wyoming pharmacist license within one hundred 22 twenty (120) days of becoming a pharmacist in charge.

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(g) It is unlawful for any nonresident pharmacy which 1 is not registered pursuant to this section licensed by the 2 3 board to advertise its services in this state, or for any 4 person who is a resident of this state to advertise the 5 pharmacy services of a nonresident pharmacy which has not registered with been licensed by the board, with the 6 7 knowledge that the advertisement will or is likely to induce members of the public in this state to use the 8 9 pharmacy to fill prescriptions. Any person convicted of violating this subsection shall be subject to the penalties 10 11 provided by W.S. 33-24-142. 12 13 **Section 2.** W.S. 33-24-152(a)(i), (iv) and (f) is 14 repealed. 15 16 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2005. 17
