Student loan repayment programs.

## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to student loans; establishing a loan repayment program to recruit and retain graduates 2 targeted occupations; creating a separate account for 3 program expenditures; specifying procedures, eligibility 4 requirements and imposing contractual conditions upon 5 6 recipients; imposing duties upon the Wyoming community 7 college commission; transferring program administration of the nursing loan and grant program from the Wyoming higher 8 education assistance authority to the commission 9 transferring program funds accordingly; providing 10 11 initial loan repayment program assistance; providing 12 appropriations and authorizing an additional position; and providing for an effective date. 13

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15 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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**Section 1.** W.S. 21-16-1201 through 21-16-1204 are 1 2 created to read: 3 4 ARTICLE 12 5 WYOMING STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM 6 7 21-16-1201. Wyoming student loan repayment program account established; disposition of account monies. 8 9 10 (a) The Wyoming student loan repayment program account is created within the earmarked revenue fund to 11 12 consist of funds appropriated to or designated to the account by law or by gift from whatever source, for 13 distribution in accordance with this article. 14 15 16 (b) The state treasurer shall within any limits 17 established by legislative appropriation, pay resources of the account established under subsection (a) of this 18 section to the state treasury to be drawn out and 19 20 distributed for repayment of federal loans 21 certification of and in accordance with necessary 22 procedures and documentation provided by the community

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college commission.

1 21-16-1202. Wyoming student loan repayment program;

2 administered by Wyoming community college commission;

3 gubernatorial determination of targeted occupations and

4 skills.

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6 The Wyoming student loan repayment program is 7 established and shall be administered by the community college commission. The purpose of the program 8 9 is to recruit and retain graduates of accredited 10 postsecondary education programs including technological, 11 vocational and technical programs, in targeted professions, 12 occupations and skills, to augment the workforce in Wyoming and provide for and advance the economic welfare of the 13 14 state.

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The community college commission shall not later 16 (b) 17 than October 1 of each year, and in consultation with the Wyoming business council, the Wyoming workforce development 18 council, the Wyoming department of workforce services, the 19 20 Wyoming department of employment and other designated 21 agencies, report to the governor on professions, 22 occupations and skills which over the subsequent five (5) to ten (10) year period, require a significant increase in 23 24 the number of related postsecondary education program

1 graduates which are not located and available within the

- 2 state. Based upon this report, the governor shall identify
- 3 those professions, occupations and skills to be targeted by
- 4 the loan repayment program established under this article
- 5 within the recommended state budget for the loan repayment
- 6 program during the corresponding budget period.

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- 8 (c) The commission shall annually provide for
- 9 assistance payments from the account established under W.S.
- 10 21-16-1201 on behalf of a recipient. Assistance payments
- 11 shall be for repayment of the recipient's federal student
- 12 loan upon compliance with terms of the contractual
- 13 agreement required under W.S. 21-16-1203. In administering
- 14 this subsection, the commission shall establish procedures
- 15 for repayments made on each recipient's behalf and for
- 16 necessary reporting requirements.

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- 18 (d) The commission shall establish terms and
- 19 conditions for assistance payments awarded under this
- 20 article, including:

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22 (i) The form and process for assistance

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23 application, review and award;

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and conditions for contractual 1 (ii) Terms 2 agreements between the recipient and the commission; 3 4 (iii) Limitations on program participation to 5 the extent funds are available within the repayment program account, ensuring sufficient funds are maintained at all 6 7 times to fulfill contractual obligations entered into pursuant to this article. 8 9 The commission shall adopt rules and regulations 10 consistent with this article, as necessary to implement and 11 12 administer the student loan repayment program established by this article. In addition, the commission may contract 13 appropriate expertise and professionals 14 administering this article and in performing duties imposed 15 under this article. 16 17 18 21-16-1203. Eligibility requirements; contractual 19 agreement required. 20 21 (a) To qualify for assistance under this article, 22 individuals shall meet the following requirements:

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1 (i) Successful completion of a postsecondary 2 education program from a postsecondary education 3 institution accredited by an accrediting association 4 recognized by the United States department of education, as 5 evidenced by a degree or certificate; 6 7 (ii) Recipient of education loans funded or guaranteed by the federal government, including federal 8 9 Stafford loans, federal direct loans and federal consolidated loans under Title IV of the Higher Education 10 11 Act, with outstanding loan repayments not in default; 12 13 (iii) Qualification for employment in profession, occupation or skill targeted for recruitment 14 and retention under procedures specified by this article. 15 16 Assistance available under this article shall be 17 contingent upon a contractual agreement entered into 18 between the community college commission and the recipient 19 20 requires the recipient to reside and employment within the state in a profession, occupation or 21 22 skill for any year in which loan repayment assistance is provided under this article. Assistance payments shall not 23 be made on behalf of a recipient under this article until 24

1 completion of one (1) full year of employment within the

- 2 state, as specified within the contractual agreement. The
- 3 total amount of assistance provided under this article on
- 4 behalf of any one (1) recipient shall be limited to the
- 5 lesser of twenty percent (20%) of remaining outstanding
- 6 Title IV federal assistance repayments or ten thousand
- 7 dollars (\$10,000.00), payable over a period of five (5)
- 8 years at an annual amount not to exceed two thousand
- 9 dollars (\$2,000.00).

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- 13 The commission shall annually review the assistance program
- 14 established under this article and report to the governor
- 15 and the legislature in accordance with W.S. 9-2-1014,
- 16 regarding program results, account funds and repayment
- 17 assistance provided during the preceding fiscal year,
- 18 together with the status of all outstanding contractual
- 19 agreements under the program.

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- 21 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-2-123(a), (c)(i) through (iii),
- 22 (g)(iii), (j)(intro), (k) and (n) and 21-18-202(c) by

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23 creating a new paragraph (viii) are amended to read:

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9-2-123. Wyoming investment in nursing loan and grant 1 2 program; eligibility criteria; procedures. 3 4 There is created the Wyoming investment (a) 5 nursing program administered by the Wyoming <del>higher</del> education assistance authority created under W.S. 21-16-703 6 community college commission. The program shall be known as 7 the WYIN program. Applicants shall be residents of this 8 9 state or graduates of a Wyoming high school and may apply for loans from the WYIN program in accordance with this 10 11 section. 12 (c) Subject to the availability of funds appropriated 13 for this program, loans under the WYIN program may be 14 granted to applicants enrolled or planning to enroll in 15 16 nursing education programs as follows: 17 18 (i) An applicant who is accepted into a Wyoming licensed practical nurse or registered nursing education 19 20 program or a baccalaureate degree program in nursing may be 21 eligible for a loan to pay the unmet need, as determined by the Wyoming higher education assistance authority or its 22 designee community college commission, of attendance at the 23 24 licensed practical nursing education program or the

1 registered nursing education program leading to an

2 associate's or baccalaureate degree;

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4 (ii) A registered nurse with a baccalaureate 5 degree who holds an unencumbered license with the Wyoming board of nursing, has the equivalent of at least one (1) 6 7 year of full-time service teaching in a nursing education Wyoming as a registered nurse with 8 program in 9 baccalaureate degree and is accepted into a nursing education program at the University of Wyoming leading to a 10 master's degree in nursing or nursing education may be 11 12 eligible for a loan to pay the unmet need of attendance, as 13 determined by the Wyoming higher education assistance authority or its designee community college commission, 14 provided that in order to receive a loan for a master's 15 degree program, the applicant shall agree to repay the loan 16 by teaching at a Wyoming college or the University of 17 18 Wyoming;

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20 (iii) A registered nurse with a master's degree
21 in nursing who holds an unencumbered license with the
22 Wyoming board of nursing, has the equivalent of at least
23 one (1) year of full-time service teaching in a nursing
24 education program in Wyoming as a registered nurse with a

1 master's degree in nursing and is accepted into a nursing 2 education program at an institution providing the required 3 nursing education courses under contract with the western 4 interstate commission for higher education or in a distance 5 nursing education program at a university that regionally accredited leading to a doctorate level degree 6 7 in nursing may be eligible for a loan to pay the unmet need attendance, as determined by the Wyoming higher 8 education assistance authority or its designee community 9 10 college commission, provided that in order to receive a 11 loan for a doctorate level degree program, the applicant 12 shall agree to repay the loan by teaching at the University 13 of Wyoming.

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(g) Any recipient of a WYIN loan who fails:

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examination on the first attempt may retake the examination at the next available opportunity before commencing repayment of the loan. The recipient shall notify the Wyoming higher education assistance authority or its contractor community college commission of the intent to retake the examination and the date the examination will be taken. Any recipient of a WYIN loan who fails the

1 examination after the second attempt shall commence cash

2 repayment of the loan within forty-five (45) days after

3 receipt of notification of the second failure by the board

4 of nursing. If the recipient of a WYIN loan who fails the

5 examination on the first attempt does not retake the

6 examination at the next available opportunity, cash

7 repayment shall commence within forty-five (45) days after

8 the next available examination is conducted.

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10 (j) The Wyoming higher education assistance authority

11 shall have the powers and duties specified in W.S.

12 <del>21-16-705 to community college commission shall implement</del>

13 this section and shall establish terms and conditions of

14 loans issued under this section, including:

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16 (k) Funding of the loan program established under

17 this section shall be by appropriation of the legislature.

18 The authority commission shall transfer approved loan

19 amounts to the University of Wyoming and to Wyoming

20 community colleges at which loan recipients are enrolled.

21 In consultation with the university and affected community

22 colleges, the <del>authority commission</del> shall establish

23 procedures for transferring loan amounts and for reporting

requirements on the expenditure of transferred loan 1 2 amounts. 3 4 The authority commission shall annually review (n) 5 the loan program established under this section and report 6 to the governor and the legislature in accordance with W.S. 7 9-2-1014, regarding program results, funds received and loans issued during the preceding academic year, together 8 9 with the status of all outstanding loan commitments and 10 repayments under the program. 11 21-18-202. Powers and duties of the commission. 12 13 14 (c) The commission shall perform the following administrative functions: 15 16 17 (viii) Administer the Wyoming student loan repayment program established under W.S. 21-16-1201 through 18 19 21-16-1204, and the Wyoming investment in nursing loan and 20 grant program established under W.S. 9-2-123, and may 21 contract with appropriate professional expertise to 22 administer these programs.

Section 3.

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2 To implement section 1 of this act for the fiscal 3 year commencing July 1, 2005, and notwithstanding W.S. 4 21-16-1202(b) as created under section 1 of this act, the 5 community college commission shall not later than June 1, 2005, with the assistance of the Wyoming business council, 6 7 the Wyoming workforce development council, the Wyoming department of workforce services, the Wyoming department of 8 9 employment and other designated agencies, report to the governor on professions, occupations and skills in short 10 11 supply to meet state needs. Based upon this report, the 12 governor shall identify those professions, occupations and 13 skills to be targeted by the loan repayment program under this article and 14 established funded by the appropriation under subsection (b) of this section. 15

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(b) Five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) is appropriated from the general fund to the Wyoming student loan repayment account established by W.S. 21-16-1201(a), as created under section 1 of this act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005.

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23 (c) Any unexpended, unobligated or unencumbered funds 24 as of the effective date of this act which were

1 appropriated to the Wyoming higher education assistance

2 authority under 2004 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 95,

3 Section 047, shall be transferred to the Wyoming community

4 college commission.

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6 (d) Eighty-five thousand seven dollars (\$85,007.00)

7 is appropriated from the general fund to the Wyoming

8 community college commission for the fiscal year commencing

9 July 1, 2005. In addition, the commission is authorized

10 one (1) full-time position to implement this act. Of the

11 amounts appropriated under this subsection, up to ten

12 thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) is available to the

13 commission for contractual services.

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15 **Section 4.** This act is effective immediately upon

16 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

17 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

18 Constitution.
