Wyoming school administrators scholarship fund.

A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to a scholarship program for prospective
- 2 school administrators; establishing a scholarship program
- 3 through the University of Wyoming; specifying terms and
- 4 conditions; requiring an annual report regarding benefits
- 5 to Wyoming students and school districts provided by
- 6 scholarship recipients; providing a termination date;
- 7 providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective
- 8 date.

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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12 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-17-116 is created to read:

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- 21-17-116. Wyoming school administrators scholarship
- 15 fund created; eligibility criteria; procedures; reports;
- 16 termination date.

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(a) created the 1 There is Wyoming school 2 administrators scholarship fund which shall be administered 3 by the University of Wyoming. The purpose of the 4 scholarship fund is to increase the number of persons 5 qualified to serve as administrators in Wyoming public education. Eliqible scholarship applicants shall 6 7 residents of this state who are employed by a Wyoming school district and who have not less than three (3) years 8 9 of experience in Wyoming public education. 10 (b) To qualify for a scholarship under this section, 11 12 the applicant shall: 13 14 (i) Submit an application to the university 15 financial aid office on a form prescribed by the office developed in consultation with the college of education; 16 17 and 18 19 (ii) Be accepted into one (1) of the following 20 programs within the college of education at the university: 21 22 (A) Principal endorsement program; 23

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(B) Master's degree program for principal 1 2 preparation; or 3 4 (C) Doctoral degree program in education 5 leadership. 6 7 (c) To the extent funds are appropriated by the legislature to the program created under this section, 8 9 scholarships shall be granted to applicants subject to the following: 10 11 12 (i) Scholarships shall be awarded by the 13 university through the college of education by a committee appointed by the college dean for that purpose. 14 15 committee shall consider the extent of the applicant's employment experience in education and the applicant's 16 interest in pursuing a career in educational administration 17 18 in Wyoming as demonstrated by relevant experience and 19 activities; 20 21 (ii) The amount of each scholarship shall be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) for each year the 22 23 recipient is enrolled and making satisfactory progress in a

1 program specified under paragraph (b)(ii) of this section,

2 but not to exceed:

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4 (A) For the principal endorsement program,

5 two (2) years;

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7 (B) For the masters degree program for

8 principal preparation, three (3) years; and

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10 (C) For the doctoral degree program in

11 education leadership, five (5) years.

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13 (d) Funding of the scholarship program established

14 under this section shall be by appropriation of the

15 legislature. The university shall make commitments of

16 scholarship funds to students only to the extent that the

17 available appropriations are sufficient to fund annual

18 scholarship payments to the student for the periods

19 specified in paragraph (c)(ii) of this section.

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21 (e) Students who receive a scholarship under this

22 section shall report annually not later than July 1 to the

23 university college of education for three (3) calendar

24 years following the year in which they complete the program

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regarding the extent to which the program has enabled them 1 2 to provide benefits to the students in the Wyoming school 3 district in which they serve. Not later than October 15 of 4 year, the university, through the college 5 education, shall report to the joint education interim committee regarding the scholarship program established 6 7 under this section. The report shall contain the number of scholarships issued for each program, a summary of the 8 9 reports submitted by students who have completed a program 10 and comprehensive information regarding repayments required

under subsection (f) of this section.

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13 Scholarship recipients who fail to complete the 14 program, who fail to submit the required report under subsection (e) of this section or who accept employment in 15 another state within three (3) years following completion 16 17 the program shall repay the scholarship to the university, along with all reasonable costs necessary to 18 19 secure repayment. Repayments shall be made in monthly 20 payments over the same period as the duration of the 21 program for which the scholarship was granted. Repayments 22 shall be separately accounted for by the university and used exclusively for scholarships under this section. A 23 student may be relieved of the requirement to repay the 24

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- 1 scholarship if the requirement to repay would cause undue
- 2 hardship. In determining if undue hardship would be caused,
- 3 the university shall apply criteria similar to the criteria
- 4 developed for nursing education scholarships under W.S.
- $5 \quad 9-1-123(j)(ii)$.

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- 7 (g) The scholarship program created by this section
- 8 shall terminate effective June 30, 2009.

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- 10 **Section 2.** Two hundred fifty thousand dollars
- 11 (\$250,000.00) is appropriated from the common school
- 12 permanent fund reserve account established under W.S.
- 13 9-4-713(f) to the University of Wyoming to fund the
- 14 scholarship program established under this act. This
- 15 appropriation shall be separately accounted for and not
- 16 included in the university block grant.

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- 18 **Section 3.** This act is effective immediately upon
- 19 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
- 20 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
- 21 Constitution.
