A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to salaries of county officials;
2 authorizing salaries as specified; and providing for an
3 effective date.

5 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 18-3-107(a), (b) and by creating a
8 new subsection (g) is amended to read:

9

10 **18-3-107. Annual salaries of certain officers;**
11 **additional compensation prohibited; exception as to**
12 **traveling and other expenses; compensation of county**
13 **commissioner; appointment and salaries of deputies, clerks,**
14 **stenographers and other assistants.**

15

16 (a) From and after January 1, 1979, the county
17 assessor, part-time county and prosecuting attorneys, part-

1 time county attorneys, county clerk, clerk of district
2 court, county sheriff and county treasurer in their
3 respective counties shall receive not less than ten
4 thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) nor more than twenty-five
5 thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) as annual salaries. From and
6 after January 1, 1983, the specified county officers shall
7 receive an annual salary of not less than ten thousand
8 dollars (\$10,000.00) nor more than forty thousand dollars
9 (\$40,000.00). Full-time county and prosecuting attorneys
10 shall receive not less than thirty-five thousand dollars
11 (\$35,000.00) and not more than forty-five thousand dollars
12 (\$45,000.00) as annual salaries. From and after January 1,
13 1995, the specified full-time county officers shall receive
14 an annual salary not less than ten thousand dollars
15 (\$10,000.00) nor more than fifty thousand dollars
16 (\$50,000.00). Full-time county attorneys shall receive not
17 less than thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) nor more
18 than sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00) as annual
19 salaries. Full-time county and prosecuting attorneys shall
20 receive not less than thirty-five thousand dollars
21 (\$35,000.00) nor more than sixty thousand dollars
22 (\$60,000.00) as annual salaries. From and after January 1,
23 1999, the specified full-time county officers shall receive
24 an annual salary not less than ten thousand dollars

1 (\$10,000.00) nor more than sixty thousand dollars
2 (\$60,000.00). Full-time county attorneys shall receive not
3 less than thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) nor more
4 than seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000.00) as annual
5 salaries. Full-time county and prosecuting attorneys shall
6 receive not less than thirty-five thousand dollars
7 (\$35,000.00) nor more than seventy thousand dollars
8 (\$70,000.00) as annual salaries. From and after January 1,
9 2007, county assessors, county clerks, clerks of district
10 court, county sheriffs, county treasurers and county and
11 prosecuting attorneys shall receive an annual salary of not
12 more than one hundred twenty thousand dollars
13 (\$120,000.00). Salaries shall be paid in equal monthly
14 installments. The board of county commissioners of each
15 county shall meet not later than June 1, 1978, and on or
16 before the same date each four (4) years thereafter, for
17 the purpose of setting salaries, which shall not be changed
18 during the term of each official for whom a salary is
19 determined.

21 (b) The salaries provided in subsection (a) of this
22 section shall compensate county officers for all of the
23 duties prescribed by law to be performed by them, and no
24 such officer shall receive from federal, state or county

1 funds any additional or separate salary or compensation
2 other than as above specified. This restriction shall not
3 apply to traveling and other expenses nor to compensation
4 allowed for office rent or house ~~rent when~~ stipend as
5 provided in subsection (g) of this section, which is
6 expressly ~~provided by law~~ permitted for each of the full-
7 time county officers and their deputies, nor to other
8 benefits provided to all employees of the respective
9 county.

11 (g) If approved by the board of county commissioners,
12 the full-time county officers and their deputies may
13 receive a housing stipend for housing occupied by the full-
14 time county officer or his deputy as a residence. If an
15 office is not furnished the county officers and their
16 deputies by the county and if approved by the board of
17 county commissioners, the full-time county officers and
18 their deputies may also receive office rent. The housing
19 stipend shall be set by the board of county commissioners
20 at the same time and for the same duration as the salaries.

22 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2005.
