- 12 (a) The commission may grant a manufacturer's license

fifty dollars (\$250.00) for each license. A person may be 2

3 issued both a manufacturer's license and an importer's

4 license.

The Wyoming liquor division shall may grant an a 6 (b) class A industry representative license for alcoholic 7 liquor suppliers to a qualified individual domiciled within 8 9 this state who submits an application to the division on forms provided by the division accompanied by an annual 10 11 license fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) not to exceed 12 one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). A class A 13 industry representative shall have a written statement from 14 any vendor whose products the applicant proposes to represent. The class A industry representative shall be 15 16 published in the division's price catalog with the products 17 from any vendor represented by him and shall be authorized to request that the division list or delist products from 18 19 the vendor represented by him.

(c) The division may grant a class B industry 22 representative license for alcohol liquor suppliers to a qualified individual domiciled within this state who 23 submits an application to the division on forms provided by 24

1 the division accompanied by an annual license fee of not to 2 exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00). A class B industry 3 representative shall be employed or managed by a class A 4 industry representative. A class B industry representative 5 shall have a written statement from the class A industry representative designating any vendor whose products he is 6 7 authorized to represent. 8 9 (d) The division may grant a temporary special event industry representative license to any individual twenty-10 11 one (21) years of age or older who submits an application on a form supplied by the division for a fee of not to 12 13 exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per event. 14 15 (e) No class A or B industry representative shall be employed by a licensee as defined by W.S. 16 17 12-1-101(a) (viii). 18 19 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2005. 20 21 (END)
