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8 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-24-156 is created to read:

10 33-24-156. Remote pharmacy practice authorized.

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- 12 (a) The board pursuant to its rules and regulations
- 13 may authorize a licensed pharmacy to practice telepharmacy
- 14 through either a branch pharmacy or an automated pharmacy
- 15 system located at a site at least twenty-five (25) miles
- 16 from a licensed pharmacy.

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(ii) Connection by a secure communication system 8
