A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to law enforcement dispatchers; authorizing
- 2 the peace officers standards and training commission to
- 3 establish standards for employment of dispatchers as
- 4 specified; providing for revocation of certification;
- 5 conforming provisions; and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-1-702(f)(iv) and (v),
- 10 9-1-703 (b) (iv) and (ix), 9-1-704 (a) and 9-1-708 (a), by
- 11 creating a new subsection (f) and by renumbering (f) as (g)
- 12 are amended to read:

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- 9-1-702. Created; membership; removal; compensation;
- 15 meetings; publication of procedures; standards for
- 16 certified training; powers and duties.

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2 (f) The commission shall:

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(iv) Prescribe reasonable minimum qualifications
relating solely to physical, mental and moral fitness for
persons recruited, appointed or retained as peace officers
or dispatchers by the state or a political subdivision;

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9 (v) Grant, suspend or revoke certification of
10 peace officers <u>and dispatchers</u> for substantial failure to
11 comply with this act or the rules of the commission,
12 subject to the contested case procedures of the Wyoming
13 Administrative Procedure Act.

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9-1-703. Director; appointment; term; powers and duties.

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18 (b) With the approval of the commission, the director 19 may:

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(iv) Certify peace officers <u>and dispatchers</u> who have satisfactorily completed the basic training programs as outlined in this act and issue appropriate certificates to peace officers <u>and dispatchers</u>;

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(ix) Report to the commission at regular
meetings of the commission and at other times as required
and recommend denial, suspension or revocation of
certification of a peace officer or dispatcher to the
commission as deemed necessary.

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8 9-1-704. Qualifications for employment as a peace 9 officer; loss of certification for felony conviction;

termination from employment.

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12 (a) Within fifteen (15) days after the appointment,
13 termination, resignation or death of any peace officer or
14 detention officer dispatcher, written notice thereof shall
15 be given to the commission by the employing agency.

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9-1-708. Certificate required for permanent employment; temporary employment; waiver or modification of training requirements; wages during training; grandfather provisions.

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22 (a) Notwithstanding any general, specific or local
23 law or charter to the contrary, except as provided in
24 subsection (b) of this section, no person shall be employed

as a dispatcher on a permanent or temporary basis unless 1 the person has been awarded a certificate by the director 2 3 of the peace officer standards and training commission 4 attesting to his satisfactory completion of a commission 5 approved dispatcher basic training program. No county, sheriff, mayor, municipality, state agency or any other 6 person authorized by law to employ dispatchers in this 7 state shall employ any person as a dispatcher who does not 8 9 meet the employment standards established by commission 10 rule. 11 12 (f) A person who is convicted of a felony after his 13 employment as a dispatcher is ineligible for continued 14 employment as a dispatcher. If the person has been certified under this section, his certification shall be 15 16 automatically revoked on the date of his conviction. The 17 director shall notify the person and the person's employing agency upon revocation of certification under this section. 18 19 20 Nothing in this section shall be construed to 21 except any dispatcher from any civil service provision or

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requirement.

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
