A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; amending the 2 definition of bingo as an activity excluded from the definition of gambling; differentiating between traditional 3 4 bingo and nontraditional bingo; specifying entities authorized to conduct bingo games; providing for permitting 5 and licensing and specifying conditions for nontraditional 6 7 bingo; providing for fees; authorizing cities, towns and 8 counties to prohibit or restrict nontraditional bingo 9 activities; providing for a sunset of certain provisions; 10 requiring reports; providing a statement of legislative 11 intent; and providing for an effective date.

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13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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15 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-7-105 is created to read:

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6-7-105. Nontraditional bingo permitted 1 for 2 restricted purposes; conditions; permits; licenses; fees; 3 repealer. 4 5 (a) For the period commencing April 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006, nontraditional bingo as authorized in W.S. 6 6-7-101(a)(iii)(H) shall not be construed as gambling under 7 this article, nor shall a device used to conduct the game 8 9 of nontraditional bingo be considered a gambling device 10 under this article, if all of the following are met: 11 12 The nontraditional bingo game is conducted (i) 13 by a charitable or nonprofit organization which has been in operation in this state for at least three (3) years and 14 has been issued a permit by the commission in accordance 15 16 with this section; 17 (ii) No corporation or other business entity 18 other than the permittee conducts the nontraditional bingo 19 20 In conducting the nontraditional bingo game the permittee shall use only volunteers who are bona fide 21 22 members of the charitable or nonprofit organization or employees who are paid by the organization to assist in the 23 24 operation of the nontraditional bingo game. The

1 nontraditional bingo game shall be played only on the

2 premises owned or occupied by the permittee;

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4 (iii) The permittee, before conducting 5 nontraditional bingo game, provides thirty (30) days written notice of the time and place thereof to the 6 7 governing body of the city or town in which it intends to conduct the nontraditional bingo game, and the governing 8 9 body does not pass a resolution prohibiting the conduct of 10 the game. If the game is conducted in an unincorporated 11 area of a county, notice under this paragraph shall be 12 provided to the board of county commissioners and that 13 board shall have authority to pass a resolution prohibiting 14 the conduct of the game. If no such resolution is passed 15 by the city, town or county having jurisdiction, and provided to the entity conducting the game at least ten 16 17 (10) days before the game is to be conducted, the game may be conducted as specified in the notice. A governing body 18 may subsequently prohibit the conduct of a game by passing 19 20 a resolution and providing notice to the entity at least 21 ten (10) days before the game is to be conducted;

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23 (iv) Any permittee conducting nontraditional 24 bingo in this state shall report to the commission. The

1 report shall be filed not later than fifteen (15) days

2 after the last day of the month for which the report is

3 filed. All amounts paid to the organization by persons

4 playing nontraditional bingo and amounts redeemed to

5 players as winnings shall be reported separately. The fee

6 required under subsection (c) of this section shall be

7 remitted to the commission with the monthly report.

8 Records related to any nontraditional bingo operation in

9 this state shall be made available upon request of the

10 commission; and

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12 (v) At least sixty-five percent (65%) of all

13 monies paid by persons playing nontraditional bingo to the

14 charitable or nonprofit organization conducting the game

15 shall be redeemed as winnings each month.

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17 (b) The commission may issue permits to charitable or

18 nonprofit organizations meeting the requirements of this

19 section which permits shall authorize the organization to

20 conduct nontraditional bingo games subject to the

21 provisions of this section and which shall be valid through

June 30, 2006. Applications for permits shall be made to

23 the commission and shall fully identify the applicant, show

24 the purpose and use of the permit and describe the

1 nontraditional bingo games to be conducted and the

2 arrangements therefor. No permit shall be granted except

3 upon the express condition that it shall not, by any

4 arrangement of whatever kind or nature, transfer to any

5 person the authority to conduct nontraditional bingo games

6 as permitted under this section. The commission shall

7 revoke the permit of any permittee for any violation of the

8 foregoing condition. The permit is effective only for the

9 places for which it is issued.

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11 (c) Any charitable or nonprofit organization

12 conducting a nontraditional bingo game in this state shall

13 pay to the commission a monthly fee of two percent (2%) of

14 the total amount paid to the organization by persons

15 playing nontraditional bingo less the amount returned to

16 players as winnings.

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18 (d) No person shall use a machine electronically

19 generating bingo cards or numbers for nontraditional bingo

20 unless the machine has been supplied by a person licensed

21 under this section to do so. The commission shall require

22 that providers of machines electronically generating bingo

23 cards or numbers for nontraditional bingo be fingerprinted

24 as a condition of licensing. No person shall be licensed

1 under this subsection if the person has been convicted of

2 any crime, an element of which is dishonesty or fraud,

3 under the laws of Wyoming or any state or of the United

4 States. Applications for licenses under this subsection

5 shall be made to the commission and shall fully identify

6 the applicant, authorize the commission to secure criminal

7 records relating to the applicant and provide such other

8 information required by the commission to ensure compliance

9 with this section. A list of all persons licensed under

10 this subsection shall be provided to all permittees. The

11 commission shall collect a fee of five thousand dollars

12 (\$5,000.00) for licensing providers under this subsection.

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14 (e) The commission may observe and supervise the

15 conduct of nontraditional bingo games and shall make

16 reasonable rules and regulations for permitting and

17 licensing under this section and for the regulation of

18 nontraditional bingo games. Each permittee and each

19 nontraditional bingo game provider licensed by the

20 commission shall comply with all rules and regulations and

21 all orders issued by the commission.

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23 (f) All monies received by the commission under this

24 section shall be deposited with the state treasurer to be

1 credited to a separate account which monies are 2 continuously appropriated to and shall be used by the

3 commission for the payment of all expenses incurred in

4 implementing this section. The state treasurer shall pay

5 out of the account all warrants drawn by the state auditor,

6 upon vouchers issued and signed by the president, vice-

7 president or executive secretary of the commission for

8 these purposes. The commission shall keep an accurate and

9 true account of all funds received and all vouchers issued

10 by the commission.

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(g) For purposes of this section:

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(i) "Nontraditional bingo" means a game of chance in which a prize is awarded to a player who obtains a designated pattern or sequence of numbers or symbols on a bingo card that is the same as the patterns or sequence of numbers or symbols previously selected at random by a mechanical blower or a computer generated random generator;

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21 (ii) "Bingo card" means a device for 22 nontraditional bingo play which may include paper, hard 23 cards or electronic generated cards. Electronic generated 24 cards shall be played in conjunction with paper cards or

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1 hard cards and the organization permitted to conduct the 2 nontraditional bingo game shall offer the player a choice 3 of cards which shall include paper or hard cards; 4 (iii) "Nontraditional bingo game" means a bingo 5 game which begins when the designated numbers or symbols 6 7 are selected and shall end when either a new set of designated numbers or symbols are drawn or the designated 8 9 jackpot price advertised is won. A game shall not end 10 until there has been at least one (1) winner. All players 11 during the course of a game, shall compete for the same 12 prizes utilizing the same set of numbers or symbols; 13 (iv) "Commission" means the Wyoming pari-mutuel 14 commission created by W.S. 11-25-103; 15 16 17 (v) "Charitable or nonprofit organization" means a bona fide nonprofit organization formed to fulfill a 18

19 benevolent, charitable, social or religious purpose;

(vi) "Permittee" means a charitable or nonprofit organization permitted to conduct nontraditional bingo games under this section.

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1 the premises owned or occupied by the charitable or 2 nonprofit organization; 3 4 Any game, wager or transaction which is (E) 5 incidental to a bona fide social relationship, is participated in by natural persons only, and in which no 6 7 person is participating, directly or indirectly, in professional gambling; or 8 9 10 (G) Display or private use of antique 11 gambling devices in the owner's residence; - or 12 (H) Bingo, other than traditional bingo, 13 14 conducted in accordance with W.S. 6-7-105. 15 16 (xi) "Traditional bingo" means a game meeting 17 the specifications of this paragraph. Each player is supplied a paper or cardboard card or board containing five 18 19 (5) adjoining horizontal and vertical rows with five (5) 20 spaces in each row, each containing a number or symbol 21 therein, except for the central row with four (4) spaces,

each containing a number or symbol therein and the word

"free" marked in the center space thereof. Upon

announcement by the person physically present conducting

1 the game of any randomly generated number or symbol 2 appearing on the player's card or board, the space 3 containing the symbol or number is covered by the player. 4 When the player shall have covered all five (5) spaces in 5 any horizontal or vertical row, or shall have covered four (4) spaces and the "free" space in a five (5) space 6 7 diagonal, horizontal or vertical row, or shall have covered the required combination of spaces in some other 8 preannounced pattern or <u>arrangement</u>, such combination of 9 10 spaces covered shall constitute "bingo". The player or players first verified as covering the spaces constituting 11 12 "bingo" shall be awarded money, merchandise or some other 13 consideration by the person conducting the game. Each 14 bingo game shall continue until at least one (1) player's 15 card or board has reached the pattern or arrangement which 16 is verified as "bingo". All players during the course of a game shall compete for the same prizes utilizing different 17 18 arrangements of the same set of numbers or symbols.

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23 (a) Employees of substitute care providers certified 24 by the department of family services pursuant to W.S.

14-4-101 through 14-4-116 or state institution, department 1 2 of family services or department of health employees who 3 may have access to minors, to persons suffering mental 4 illness or developmental disabilities or to the elderly 5 shall be required to submit to fingerprinting for the purpose of obtaining state and national criminal history 6 7 record information before employment or transfer to a position where access is acquired. On and after July 1, 8 9 1996, applicants for initial certification by the professional teaching standards board 10 and employees 11 initially hired by a school district on or after July 1, 12 1996, who may have access to minors in the course of their 13 employment shall be required to submit to fingerprinting 14 for the same purposes. For purposes of this article, department of health or department of family services 15 16 contractors providing specialized home care or respite care 17 to minors shall be considered departmental employees. Ιn order to determine an applicant's eligibility, any person 18 19 applying to the Wyoming pari-mutuel commission for a 20 license to provide games to be used to play nontraditional 21 bingo, shall be required to submit to fingerprinting for 22 the purpose of obtaining state and national criminal 23 history record information.

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5 (d) Access to criminal history record information is available to the Wyoming pari-mutuel commission as provided 6 by W.S. $\frac{11-25-104(j)}{11-25-104(j)}$ and (k). The commission 7 shall take reasonable security precautions to prevent 8 9 unauthorized persons from gaining access to criminal history record information in accordance with rules and 10 11 regulations established by the Wyoming division of criminal 12 investigation. For the purpose of this subsection 13 "criminal history record information" means information, records and data compiled by criminal justice agencies on 14 individuals for the purpose of identifying criminal 15 16 offenders consisting of identifiable descriptions of the 17 offenders and notations or a summary of arrests, indictments, information, 18 detentions, pre-trial proceedings, nature and disposition of criminal charges, 19 20 sentencing, rehabilitation, incarceration, correctional 21 supervision and release. Criminal history record 22 information is limited to information recorded as the result of the initiation of criminal proceedings. 23 not include intelligence data, analytical prosecutorial 24

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8 Section 4. It is the intent of the legislature to 9 authorize nontraditional bingo games to be conducted as specified under this act through the period of June 30, 10 2006. It is the intent of the legislature to allow 11 12 traditional bingo games to be conducted in the same manner 13 and to the same extent as authorized by law prior to the effective date of this act. The joint travel, recreation, 14 wildlife and cultural resources interim committee shall 15 16 review the status of nontraditional bingo operations in 17 this state and shall prepare legislation as that committee determines appropriate to prohibit or authorize and 18 regulate the conduct of nontraditional bingo games in this 19 20 state. The legislation shall be prepared for introduction 21 in the 2006 budget session.

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1 Section 5. This act is effective immediately upon

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
