14 ARTICLE 10

15 PUBLIC SHOOTING RANGE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

23-1-1001. Definitions. 1 2 3 (a) As used in this article: 4 5 (i) "Board" means the Wyoming public shooting range development advisory board created by W.S. 23-1-1003; 6 7 (ii) "Public shooting program" means a program 8 9 conducted at a public shooting range which increases the 10 public appreciation, enjoyment or development of skills in 11 shooting disciplines; 12 13 (iii) "Public shooting range" means a shooting range that is available and accessible to the general 14 public at least fifty percent (50%) of the time that it is 15 16 open for use. If a facility is owned, managed and operated 17 by a nongovernmental organization, the facility shall provide unlimited public memberships or day use fees at a 18 reasonable rate as determined by the commission to qualify 19 20 as a public shooting range under this article; 21 22 (iv) "Shooting range" means an indoor or outdoor 23 facility for shooting disciplines including trap, skeet and 24 sporting clays, facilities for practice firing of air gun,

rim fire, center fire, small bore and large bore rifles, 1 pistols or handguns, black powder firearms or facilities 2 3 for practice firing of archery equipment. 4 5 23-1-1002. Powers and duties; rules and regulations; funds and grant awards; development of public shooting 6 7 facilities and programs. 8 9 (a) The commission shall: 10 11 (i) Adopt rules and regulations necessary to 12 implement this article; 13 14 (ii) Receive and disburse funds authorized by this article, including funds appropriated by the 15 16 legislature, or from private gifts or grants to be used for 17 purposes of this article; 18 19 (iii) Ensure that any grant award and any 20 disbursement of grant funds are utilized in accordance with 21 this article;

23 (iv) Upon request from a public shooting range 24 facility or local government, assist in the planning and

development of public shooting range facilities and 1 2 programs; 3 4 (v) Assist in the planning and development of 5 programs to educate the public on the shooting disciplines. 6 7 23-1-1003. Wyoming shooting range development advisory board created. 8 9 10 There is created the Wyoming shooting range development advisory board. The board shall advise the commission in 11 determining the award of grants under W.S. 23-1-1007. 12 13 14 23-1-1004. Wyoming shooting range development 15 advisory board; members; expenses. 16 17 (a) The Wyoming shooting range development advisory 18 board shall consist of five (5) members, as follows: 19 20 (i) The director of the department or his 21 designee; 22 (ii) The hunter education coordinator with the 23 24 department;

2 (iii) One (1) member of the commission or his designee;

5 (iv) Two (2) members of the shooting sports 6 community appointed by the governor.

7

(b) The terms of members appointed under paragraph 8 9 (a) (iv) of this section shall be for four (4) years. Of the initial appointees under paragraph (a) (iv) of this 10 section, one (1) member shall be appointed for two (2) 11 12 years and one (1) member shall be appointed for four (4) 13 years. The governor may remove any member appointed under paragraph (a) (iv) of this section as provided in W.S. 14 9-1-202. A vacancy on the board shall be filled for the 15 balance of the unexpired term. The board shall select one 16 17 (1) of its members to serve as chairman.

18

19 (c) The board shall meet not less than two (2) times
20 each year. Members shall serve without compensation but
21 shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the
22 performance of their official duties in the manner and
23 amounts provided by law for state employees. Members who
24 are government employees or public officials shall be

considered on official business of their agency when 1 2 performing duties as members of the board. 3 4 23-1-1005. Board; duties and responsibilities. 5 The Wyoming shooting range development advisory 6 board shall: 7 8 9 (i) Review innovative program grants and grant proposals for the development of new public shooting range 10 facilities and the expansion of existing public shooting 11 12 range facilities; 13 (ii) Advise the commission on criteria for grant 14 categories and grant applications, which shall 15 be implemented through rules and regulations promulgated by 16 the commission to meet the following public purposes: 17 18 19 (A) To meet the demands of Wyoming's 20 shooting sports population for public shooting 21 facilities; 22 23 To enhance the availability of public (B) 24 shooting programs;

2 (C) To be cost effective in the provision

3 of public shooting range facilities and programs; and

4

5 (D) To increase public access, including

6 access for persons with disabilities to public shooting

7 range facilities.

9 (iii) Consult with and advise the commission on

10 the awarding of grants pursuant to W.S. 23-1-1007;

11

12 (iv) Consult with and advise the commission in

13 the promulgation of reasonable rules and regulations in

14 accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act to

15 implement the provisions of this article; and

16

17 (v) Consider other necessary matters.

18

19 23-1-1006. Wyoming shooting range development

20 account; establishment of account; use of funds.

21

22 (a) A separate account is established which shall be

23 referred to as the Wyoming public shooting range

24 development account. The account shall consist of those

1 funds designated to the account by law and other

2 contributions, grants, gifts, bequests and donations to the

3 account.

4

5 (b) The funds deposited in the Wyoming public

6 shooting range development account are continuously

7 appropriated to and shall be administered by the commission

8 with the advice and counsel of the Wyoming public shooting

9 range development advisory board to fund grants in

10 accordance with W.S. 23-1-1007 and to pay expenses of the

11 board authorized under W.S. 23-1-1004(c).

12

13 **23-1-1007.** Disbursement of grants.

14

15 (a) From the funds available for distribution, the

16 board may advise the commission on the awarding of grants

17 and the commission may award grants to public shooting

18 range facilities throughout the state to support the

19 purposes specified in W.S. 23-1-1005(a)(ii), in accordance

20 with rules and regulations promulgated by the commission.

21

22 (b) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-4-207, unobligated or

23 unencumbered funds retained by the commission under this

24 section shall not lapse at the end of a fiscal period and

shall remain available for distribution as provided in this 1 2 section. 3 4 Section 2. W.S. 23-1-302(a) by creating 5 paragraphs (xxx) and (xxxi) is amended to read: 6 7 23-1-302. Powers and duties. 8 9 The commission is directed and empowered: (a) 10 11 (xxx) To promulgate rules and regulations in 12 consultation with the Wyoming public shooting range 13 development advisory board created under W.S. 23-1-1003, to 14 establish a formula for distribution of funds available for distribution under W.S. 23-1-1007; 15 16 17 (xxxi) To maintain, manage and be responsible for the awarding of grants and distribution of the funds 18 19 appropriated for distribution under W.S. 23-1-1007. 20 21 Section 3. 22 23 There is appropriated four million three hundred (a) eighty thousand dollars (\$4,380,000.00) for the fiscal year 24

1 commencing July 1, 2005 and one million five hundred eighty

2 thousand dollars (\$1,580,000.00) for the fiscal year

3 commencing July 1, 2006 from the general fund to the

4 Wyoming public shooting range development account

5 established pursuant to W.S. 23-1-1006.

7 (b) Of the monies deposited in the account, eighty

8 thousand dollars (\$80,000.00) each fiscal year may be used

9 by the Wyoming game and fish commission to promote public

10 awareness of the availability of grants from the account

11 and to administer and monitor the development of new and

12 existing public shooting range facilities and programs.

14 (c) By September 1, 2005, and annually thereafter,

the commission shall provide a report to the joint travel,

16 recreation, wildlife and cultural resources interim

17 committee specifying a detailed list of the projects funded

18 and the amount provided for each project from the account.

Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
