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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 1-1-131 is created to read:

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- 12 1-1-131. Actions against health care providers;
- 13 collateral source payments.

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- 15 (a) In any action for damages for injury or death
- 16 against a health care provider, whether based upon tort,

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1 breach of contract, or otherwise, where the liability of a

2 defendant is admitted or established, the defendant may

3 introduce evidence for consideration by the finder of fact

4 on the question of whether any cost or expense incurred by

5 the plaintiff for medical care, custodial care,

6 rehabilitation services, loss of earned income or other

7 economic loss has been replaced or indemnified, in whole or

8 in part, by a collateral source from a governmental,

9 employee or service benefit program or insurance of any

10 kind except life insurance, and excluding the assets of the

11 plaintiff or the plaintiff's immediate family.

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13 (b) If the defendant elects to introduce evidence as

14 provided in subsection (a) of this section, the plaintiff

15 may introduce evidence of any amount that the plaintiff has

16 paid or contributed to secure the plaintiff's right to

17 receive the benefits of which the defendant has introduced

18 evidence.

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20 (c) If the defendant elects to introduce evidence as

21 provided in subsection (a) of this section, the finder of

22 fact may reduce the amount of the plaintiff's award by an

23 amount equal to the total amount received from any

24 collateral source.

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2 (d) For purposes of this section, "health care

3 provider" means as defined in W.S. 1-1-130.

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5 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2005.
