ACT exam fees.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the American college testing (ACT) exam;
2 appropriating funds to pay exam fees for specified
3 students; delegating duties to the department of education;
4 and providing for an effective date.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

8 **Section 1.**

9

10 (a) Any school district may apply, on behalf of an
11 eligible student qualifying under this section, to the
12 department of education for payment of fees to participate
13 in the American college testing (ACT) examination. To
14 qualify for payment under this section, the participating
15 student shall be:

16

1 (i) Enrolled in grade eleven (11) during school
2 year 2004-2005 and participate in the ACT on the spring
3 2005 national testing dates; or

4
5 (ii) Enrolled in grade eleven (11) during school
6 year 2005-2006 and participate in the ACT on the spring
7 2006 national testing dates.

8
9 (b) Upon a form and within the time prescribed by the
10 department, a district may apply for payment under this
11 section. The department shall upon verification of
12 qualifying students participating in the ACT during the
13 spring 2005 administration of the exam, and again in the
14 2006 administration of the exam, distribute amounts to each
15 applicant district by multiplying the number of
16 participating students by twenty-eight dollars (\$28.00).
17 The department shall, as soon as reasonably possible
18 following the effective date of this act, notify districts
19 of funding available under this section.

20
21 (c) For the period commencing on the effective date
22 of this act through June 30, 2006, three hundred eighty
23 thousand dollars (\$380,000.00) is appropriated from the

1 general fund to the department of education to implement
2 this section.

3

4 **Section 2.** This act is effective immediately upon
5 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
6 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
7 Constitution.
