Tribal identification cards. 3 4 An identification card issued by the governing body of the 5 Eastern Shoshone tribe of Wyoming or Northern Arapahoe tribe of Wyoming that substantially conforms to the 6 7 requirements of W.S. 31-8-102(a)(i) through (vi) shall be considered a valid form of identification for all purposes 8 for which an identification card issued under W.S. 31-8-101 9 10 may be used. 11 8-7-102. Prohibited acts; penalties. 12 13 14 (a) No person shall: 15 (i) Possess any cancelled, fictitious, 16 17 fraudulently altered or fraudulently obtained tribal identification card; 18 19 20 (ii) Lend his identification card to any other 21 person or knowingly permit its use by another; 22 23 (iii) Display or represent a tribal 24 identification card not issued to him as being his card;

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2 (iv) Photograph, photostat, duplicate or in any 3 way reproduce a tribal identification card or facsimile 4 thereof in such a manner that it could be mistaken for a 5 valid identification card; 6 7 (v) Use a tribal identification card that was obtained by false swearing, fraud or false statement of any 8 9 kind or in any form. 10 11 (b) Any person who violates any provision of 12 subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor 13 punishable by a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), by imprisonment for not more than ninety 14 (90) days, or both. 15 16 17 Section 2. W.S. 6-3-901(b), 14-3-107(a), 22-2-113(d) are amended to read: 18 19 20 6-3-901. Unauthorized use of personal identifying 21 information; penalties; restitution. 22 23 (b) As used in this section "personal identifying 24 information," means the name, address, telephone number,

driver's license number, social security number, place of employment, employee identification number, <u>tribal</u> <u>identification card number</u>, mother's maiden name, demand deposit account number, savings account number, or credit card number of an individual person.

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7 14-3-107. Performing body-art on persons who have not
8 reached the age of majority; penalties; definition.

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10 (a) No person shall knowingly perform body-art upon 11 or under the skin of a person who has not reached the age 12 of majority, except with the consent of the person's parent 13 or legal guardian who is present at the time the body-art 14 procedure is performed upon the person. The person performing the body-art procedure shall demand proof of age 15 prior to administering the body-art procedure upon the 16 17 person. A motor vehicle driver's license, a registration card issued under the federal Selective Service Act, an 18 identification card issued to a member of the armed forces, 19 20 a valid United States passport, a tribal identification 21 card issued by the governing body of the Eastern Shoshone 22 tribe of Wyoming or the Northern Arapahoe tribe of Wyoming or an identification card issued by the department of 23 24 transportation is prima facie evidence of the age and

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identity of the person. Proof that the person performing the body-art procedure demanded, was shown and acted in reasonable reliance upon the information contained in any one (1) of the above documents as identification and proof of age is a defense to any criminal prosecution under this section.

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12 (d) Unless otherwise specifically stated in this 13 Election Code, all election records of the county clerk are 14 public. The availability and dissemination of such records shall be in accordance with the Wyoming Public Records Act. 15 16 Election records containing social security numbers, 17 portions of social security numbers, driver's license numbers, state generated unique voter identification 18 19 numbers, birth dates, telephone numbers, tribal 20 identification card numbers and other personally 21 identifiable information other than names, gender, 22 addresses and party affiliations are not public records and shall be kept confidential. When necessary, members of the 23 24 county or state canvassing boards may access confidential
