A Bill

for

- 1 A JOINT RESOLUTION encouraging the United States Congress
- 2 to pass the Clear Skies Act of 2003.

- 4 WHEREAS, the federal government has introduced legislation,
- 5 called the Clear Skies Act, to reduce SO_2 , NO_x and mercury
- 6 from coal-fired plants; and

7

- 8 WHEREAS, Wyoming produces over 1/3 of the nation's coal
- 9 supply which supplies affordable electricity to many areas
- 10 of the United States; and

- 12 WHEREAS, Wyoming has a vested interest in a regulatory
- 13 program that is fair, predictable and provides certainty;
- 14 and

- 1 WHEREAS, electric power providers have significantly
- 2 reduced air emissions, but additional reductions are needed
- 3 in parts of the United States to help achieve air quality
- 4 goals; and

- 6 WHEREAS, implementation of the Clean Air Act's multiple,
- 7 overlapping requirements could be streamlined to facilitate
- 8 greater, more efficient and more certain emission
- 9 reductions, that would reduce litigation that often causes
- 10 significant delays in achieving air quality goals; and

- 12 WHEREAS, a new federal emission reduction program could
- 13 help to resolve regional and national air quality
- 14 challenges, interstate environmental conflicts and reduce
- 15 inconsistencies between state programs; and

16

- 17 WHEREAS, the implications of any emission reduction
- 18 programs on consumer energy prices and electric power
- 19 reliability must be factored into policy decisions.

- 21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE
- 22 LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

23

- 1 That Wyoming calls for the United States Congress to pass
- 2 multi-emission legislation in 2005 that significantly
- 3 reduces emissions of SO_2 , NO_x and mercury from electric
- 4 power generators and helps the nation toward attainment of
- 5 federal air quality standards without impacting the Wyoming
- 6 coal industry; and

- 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the final multi-emission
- 9 reduction program should maintain and encourage a diverse
- 10 fuel supply that will benefit states and local communities,
- 11 consumers and manufacturers, as well as maintain and
- 12 promote electric power reliability, availability and
- 13 affordability, and

14

- 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that reductions under such a
- 16 program should be achieved using a market-based approach
- 17 patterned after the successful Clean Air Act acid rain
- 18 program; and

- 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such a program should
- 21 streamline Clean Air Act provisions given that SO_2 , NO_x and
- 22 mercury emissions caps will substantially reduce the amount

23 of emissions from electric power facilities; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Wyoming urges that the Clear

- 2 Skies Act set an interim target for mercury reduction based
- 3 upon the co-benefit of installing technology for SO_2 and
- 4 NO_{x} , and that any debate over regulating CO_2 should be held
- 5 in a separate forum; and

- 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the legislation provide fair
- 8 allocations of SO_2 , NO_x and mercury to sources in Wyoming;
- 9 and

- 11 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State of
- 12 Wyoming transmit copies of this resolution to the President
- 13 of the United States, to the President of the Senate and
- 14 the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United
- 15 States Congress, to the Wyoming Congressional Delegation
- 16 and the Governor of Wyoming and other local officials, as
- 17 is appropriate.
