- 1 AN ACT relating to agriculture; clarifying the grain laws
- 2 relating to buying, selling and storing grain; amending
- 3 license fees; amending bonding requirements; amending audit
- 4 requirements; amending insurance requirements; making
- 5 conforming amendments; amending penalties; providing an
- 6 appropriation; authorizing an additional position; and
- 7 providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-11-118 is created to read:

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13 **11-11-118.** Perjury.

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- 15 Any affirmation under this chapter shall be given under
- 16 penalty of perjury.

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2 **Section 2.** W.S. 11-11-101(a)(ii), (vii) and by 3 creating new paragraphs (viii) through (xiv), 11-11-103 4 through 11-11-105, 11-11-107 through 11-11-110, 5 11-11-111(a)(i), by creating a new paragraph (viii) and (b), 11-11-112, 11-11-113, 11-11-114(a) and by creating a 6 7 new subsection (c) and 11-11-115 through 11-11-117 are amended to read: 8 9 11-11-101. Definitions. 10 11 12 (a) As used in this chapter: 13 (ii) "Warehouseman" means any person except the 14 grower who buys or sells handles grain at wholesale, or 15 16 receives or solicits grain for purchase, sale, shipment or storage either in or outside the state of Wyoming for 17 commercial storage or solicits grain for the purpose of 18 19 intrastate, interstate or foreign commerce; 20 21 (vii) "Warehouse" means an elevator, mill, 22 warehouse storage bin or building, subterminal grain warehouse storage facility, public warehouse storage 23

facility or other structure or facility in which for legal

1	<pre>consideration grain is received for commercial storage</pre>
2	handling, processing or shipment either in or out of the
3	state of Wyoming. or for the purpose of intrastate,
4	<pre>interstate or foreign commerce;</pre>
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6	(viii) "Audit" means an examination of records
7	or financial accounts to determine their accuracy;
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9	(ix) "Depositor" means any person who is in
10	possession of a commodity and entrusts or delivers the
11	commodity to a warehouse for storage;
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13	(x) "Inspection" means the physical review or
14	examination of the grain warehouse or storage facility and
15	may include an official audit;
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17	(xi) "Loss" means the destruction of the
18	commodity due to fire, theft or weather;
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20	(xii) "Receipt" means a warehouse receipt issued
21	under this act, including an electronic receipt;
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23	(xiii) "Transportation" means the movement of
24	grain from one (1) point to another;

2 (xiv) "Verified" means signed and sworn to be
3 accurate before a person authorized to administer oaths.

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5 11-11-103. Warehousemen to procure licenses; fee; 6 annual renewal.

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Before engaging in business in Wyoming, a warehouseman and 8 a or any person operating a warehouse shall procure a 9 10 license from the director and pay to the department of 11 agriculture. The fee determined by the board of agriculture 12 under this section for the initial license and for each annual renewal thereof. The fee set by the board of 13 agriculture shall represent an amount sufficient to cover 14 up to fifty percent (50%) of anticipated costs of the 15 16 inspection program, but shall not exceed shall be one 17 hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00). All licenses shall be issued for the fiscal year, or fraction thereof, ending 18 June 30. No license shall be renewed unless the director 19 20 department finds from his annual inspection the audit 21 required under W.S. 11-11-109 of the warehouse and audit of 22 the warehouse or warehouseman's records that the operations are conducted properly. 23

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11-11-104. Application for license; form; contents; 1 2 refusal to issue license; appeal; care of agricultural 3 products. 4 5 (a) The director department shall prescribe forms for application for a warehouseman's or warehouse license. 6 7 application shall contain information necessary to inform the director department of the qualifications, facilities, 8 9 experience and financial ability of the applicant to carry on the business of buying, selling, warehousing and storing 10 The director may department shall require the 11 12 submission of a any tax return, bank statement, financial 13 statement or audit prepared by a public accountant or a certified public accountant and any additional information 14 as required by rules and regulations in order to establish 15 the financial responsibility of the applicant. 16 17 license is refused by the director department, appeal may be made to the state board of agriculture director. 18 All 19 hearings for appeal shall be conducted in accordance with 20 the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act. 21 22 (b) Each warehouseman shall at all times, including 23 during any period of suspension of his license, exercise 24 such care in regard to stored and nonstorage agricultural

1 commodities in his custody as required under the licensing

2 <u>agreement.</u>

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4 11-11-105. Surety bond required; amount; approval by 5 department; conditions; exception.

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(a) Each applicant for a warehouseman's or warehouse 7 license shall post a cash bond, irrevocable letter of 8 9 credit or execute and file with the director department a 10 good and sufficient surety bond in an amount determined by 11 the board of agriculture department based on the maximum 12 number of hundred weight the warehouseman or warehouse can 13 store in the warehouses for which the bond is required, but not less than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00). A 14 surety bond shall be executed by a responsible surety 15 16 company licensed to do business in this state, approved by 17 the director, and conditioned upon the faithful performance of the obligation of the warehouseman or person operating a 18 19 warehouse under the laws of this state and of any 20 additional obligations assumed by him under contract with 21 those who deposit grain with him. All bonds shall be 22 payable to the state for the benefit of any injured party, and shall be in the form and contain additional conditions 23 24 as the director department may prescribe. No person is

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required to file a bond who has already posted similar bond 1 2 with the United States department of agriculture pursuant 3 to the United States Warehouse Act of August 11, 1916, as 4 amended. 5 (b) Cash bonds, irrevocable letters of credit and 6 7 surety bonds shall not be released by the department until an audit has been completed and satisfied. The department 8 9 shall publish a public notice for sixty (60) days prior to 10 any bond being released. 11 12 (c) In the event a warehouseman does not renew his 13 license in accordance with W.S. 11-11-103 or suspends 14 normal business operations, the department shall post a public notice in a paper of local distribution for sixty 15 16 (60) days prior to the closure of the warehouse. 17 18 11-11-107. Investigation by department; complaint; 19 service; hearing. 20 21 The director department upon his its own motion or upon 22 verified complaint against any warehouseman or warehouse

shall investigate as he the department deems necessary, and

shall at all times have free and unimpeded access to all

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1 facilities or places in which grain is kept, stored, 2 handled or transported. If the director department, upon 3 investigation, has reason to believe that any dealer 4 warehouseman is not acting as required by law, or upon the 5 filing of a verified complaint against the warehouseman, or warehouse, he the department shall have a complaint or copy 6 7 of the verified complaint served upon the warehouseman or warehouse by personal service, service upon a registered 8 agent or by registered mail. If the warehouseman or 9 10 warehouse fails to make prompt adjustment or settlement of 11 the charges set forth, to the satisfaction of the director 12 department, the director department shall give notice of 13 the time and place of a hearing thereon. The hearing shall 14 be held in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act. 15

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17 11-11-108. Warehouse receipts generally.

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All warehouse receipts issued for stored grain shall be in a form prescribed by the <u>director department</u> and shall be obtainable only by the warehouseman or warehouse from the <u>director department</u> at cost. Each warehouse receipt issued must show the amount of any cash or the value of any merchandise the warehouseman or warehouse has advanced on

1 the grain represented by the receipt, but such notation

2 shall not be construed as fixing the date of sale of the

3 grain.

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5 11-11-109. Audit of records; inspection of warehouse.

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(a) At least once each year and more often if 7 necessary or if requested by an interested person the 8 9 director department shall inspect each licensed warehouse and shall audit the warehouse records. However, no audit 10 11 shall be performed if the person operating the warehouse 12 certifies that the warehouse does not have any grain stored 13 for others. The director after conferring with interested 14 industry groups shall fix, assess and collect fees for the inspection of facilities storing farm products. The fees 15 shall not exceed fifty percent (50%) of the cost of the 16 17 inspection and shall be paid by the person requesting the inspection, if any. 18

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20 (b) If a warehouseman is delinquent in renewing his
21 license in accordance with W.S. 11-11-103, the department
22 shall initiate an inspection and audit of the warehouse
23 immediately.

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1 11-11-110. Warehouseman's records; generally.

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3	Every licensed warehouse warehouseman shall maintain
4	complete records of all grain stored, all grain withdrawn
5	from storage, all warehouse receipts issued and all
6	receipts returned to and cancelled by him. The records
7	shall be available for examination and audit by the
8	director department at any reasonable time.
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10	11-11-111. Warehouseman's records; contents;
11	inspection and audit by department; issuance of warehouse
12	receipts.
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14	(a) Every warehouseman and warehouse shall keep a
15	complete record of all grain handled by him including the
16	following:
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18	(i) Name <u>,</u> and address and phone number of the
19	grower and of the owner;
20	
21	(viii) Documentation stating the location of the
22	stored commodity. If the commodity is stored in another
23	warehouse, then proof of bonding by that facility shall be
24	included in the records.

2 (b) The above records shall be open to the 3 confidential inspection of the director department or his 4 its authorized agents at all times. Upon request of the 5 depositor, every warehouseman and warehouse shall issue a 6 receipt for all grain received for storage on a form 7 furnished by the director department.

9 11-11-112. Stored grain to be insured; insurance 10 requirements; disaster loss to be reported.

(a) The director shall prescribe rules and regulations necessary for the safe conduct of the grain storage business and shall require that All grain stored shall be insured against loss for full value by an insurance company licensed to do business in this state. A copy of the insurance policy in effect shall be provided to the department at the time of the license application and the audit.

(b) Each warehouseman shall comply fully with the terms of insurance policies or contracts covering their warehouse and all products stored therein, and shall not

1 commit any acts, nor permit others to commit any acts, that 2 might impair or invalidate such insurance.

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4 11-11-113. Grading of grain; notation on warehouse 5 receipt.

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7 All grain accepted for storage shall be graded by the

warehouseman or designee according to standards of the 8

9 United States department of agriculture, and the grade

10 established shall be specified upon the warehouse receipt

11 issued for the grain.

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13 11-11-114. Stored grain to constitute bailment;

amount in storage to equal issued storage certificates; 14

exceptions; conversion; seizure.

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17 The storage of grain with a warehouse and the movement of grain by a warehouseman constitutes a bailment 18 and not a sale. Upon return of the scale ticket bearing 19 20 the name of the bailee or warehouse receipt properly 21 endorsed and payment or tender of all advances and charges, 22 the owner of the scale ticket or warehouse receipt is entitled to, and the warehouseman or person operating a 23

warehouse shall deliver the identical grade and amount of

1 grain placed in storage or transported. Every person

2 operating a warehouse shall maintain at all times in

3 storage, in the state of Wyoming, grain equal in amount and

4 grade to all scale tickets and warehouse receipts issued,

5 unless authorized in writing by holders of scale tickets or

6 warehouse receipts or by the director department to move to

7 other storage, and failure to do so is a conversion

8 thereof.

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10 (c) All warehousemen shall post current tariffs at

11 all times.

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13 11-11-115. Disposition of collected funds.

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15 There is created the grain warehouse inspection account 16 within the earmarked revenue fund. All funds collected by

17 the director department shall be deposited in the account

18 created by this section. Interest earned by the account

19 shall be retained in the account. The account is

20 appropriated for use and expenditure by the board of

21 agriculture department for the costs of administering the

22 programs under this article. Itemized vouchers shall be

23 submitted to the chief executive officer of the board

24 <u>department</u> for approval. Upon approval, a warrant for the

1 payment of each voucher shall be issued by the state

2 auditor for payment from the grain warehouse inspection

3 account.

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5 11-11-116. Revocation and cancellation of license.

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7 Failure of any warehouseman or person operating a warehouse

8 to comply with the provisions of this chapter will render

9 the license of the warehouseman or person operating a

10 warehouse subject to revocation and cancellation by the

11 director department.

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11-11-117. Prohibited acts; penalties for violations.

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15 (a) Any person who engages in or carries on any grain
16 warehousing business without first having obtained a
17 license, or who continues to engage in or carry on such

business after his license has been suspended, revoked or

19 expires is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not

20 less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) one hundred dollars

21 (\$100.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) five

22 hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense. Each day that

23 such unlicensed business is carried on is a separate

24 offense.

2 (b) Any warehouseman or person operating a warehouse 3 who converts to his own use or that of another, any grain 4 stored or accepted for storage of the value of five hundred 5 dollars (\$500.00) or more, is guilty of a felony and shall be fined not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for 6 7 each day of violation and imprisoned for not to exceed fourteen (14) years. If the value of the grain converted 8 9 is less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), the 10 warehouseman or person operating a warehouse is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not to exceed one hundred 11 dollars (\$100.00) five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or 12 13 imprisoned not to exceed six (6) months, or both.

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15 Section 3.

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17 (a) There is appropriated one hundred twenty-three
18 thousand seven hundred seventy-three dollars (\$123,773.00),
19 or as much thereof as is necessary, from the general fund
20 to the department of agriculture for the fiscal year
21 beginning July 1, 2005, to implement the purposes of this
22 act.

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1 (b) The department of agriculture is authorized one

2 (1) additional full-time position to perform the audits of

3 grain warehouses.

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5 **Section 4.** This act is effective immediately upon

6 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

7 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

8 Constitution.
