A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to natural resources; establishing a
- 2 Wyoming wildlife and natural resource trust account and an
- 3 income account; specifying uses of the accounts;
- 4 establishing procedures for expenditures from the income
- 5 account; providing appropriations; providing for future
- 6 recommended appropriations; establishing a board and
- 7 providing for duties and other administration of the
- 8 account; and providing for an effective date.

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 12 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-15-101 through 9-15-106 are created
- 13 to read:

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15 **9-5-101**. **Short title**.

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This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Wyoming 1 2 Wildlife and Natural Resource Funding Act." 3 9-15-102. Definitions. 4 5 (a) As used in this act: 6 7 (i) "Board" means the Wyoming wildlife and 8 9 natural resource trust account board created by W.S. 9-15-104; 10 11 12 (ii) "Income account" means the Wyoming wildlife 13 and natural resource trust income account created by W.S. 9-15-103(b); 14 15 (iii) "Large project" means a project for which 16 17 the grant sought under this act equals or exceeds five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00); 18 19 (iv) "Small project" means a project for which 20 21 the grant sought under this act is less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00); 22 23

"Trust account" means the Wyoming wildlife 1 (V) 2 resource trust account created by W.S. and natural 3 9-15-103(a);4 5 (vi) "This act" means W.S. 9-15-101 through 9-15-106. 6 7 9-15-103. Wyoming wildlife and natural resource trust 8 9 account created; income account created; expenditures; 10 purposes. 11 12 A trust account is created to be known as the Wyoming wildlife and natural resource trust account. The 13 trust account shall consist of those funds designated to 14 the account by law and all monies received from federal 15 grants and other contributions, grants, gifts, transfers, 16 17 bequests and donations to the trust account. The trust account is specifically empowered to accept grants, gifts, 18 transfers, bequests and donations including those which are 19 limited in their purposes by the grantor. Title to any 20 interest in any real property conveyed to the trust account 21 shall be held in the name of the state of Wyoming and shall 22 23 be administered by the board of land commissioners to

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further the purposes of this act.

Funds deposited within

1 the trust account are intended to be inviolate and

2 constitute a perpetual trust account which shall be

3 invested by the state treasurer as authorized under W.S.

4 9-4-711 and in a manner to obtain the highest return

5 possible consistent with preservation of the account

6 corpus.

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8 (b) The state treasurer shall credit annually to a 9 Wyoming wildlife and natural resource trust income account

10 the interest earned from investment of the trust account

11 corpus. The legislature may, from time to time, appropriate

12 funds directly to the income account for distribution in

13 accordance with the terms of this act. Such specially

14 appropriated funds shall be credited directly by the state

15 treasurer to the income account and are available to the

16 board for award of grants as otherwise permitted by this

17 act.

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19 (c) Individuals and other entities may also grant,
20 give, transfer, bequest or donate funds to the trust
21 account or the income account. Such funds shall be

22 credited by the state treasurer to either the trust account

23 or the income account, as appropriate, in a manner

24 consistent with the conditions attached to their receipt.

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2 The board may expend funds from the income (d) 3 account for staffing and other administrative expenses 4 authorized under this act. Additional disbursements from 5 the income account shall be for the following purposes: 6 7 (i) Improvement and maintenance of existing terrestrial habitat necessary to maintain wildlife 8 9 populations; 10 (ii) Preservation of open spaces by purchase or 11 12 acquisition of development rights; 13 (iii) Improvement and maintenance of existing 14 aquatic habitat necessary to maintain fish populations; 15 16 17 (iv) Acquisition of terrestrial or habitat when existing habitat is determined critical, or is 18 present in minimal amounts, and acquisition presents the 19 20 necessary factor in attaining or preserving desired 21 wildlife or fish population levels; 22 (v) Conservation, maintenance, protection

23 development of wildlife resources; 24

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2 (vi) Participation in water enhancement projects

3 to ensure aquatic habitat for fish populations and allow

4 for other watershed enhancements that benefit wildlife;

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6 (vii) To address and mitigate impacts to

7 wildlife habitat associated with residential, mineral and

8 industrial development;

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10 (viii) To mitigate conflicts and reduce

11 potential for disease transmission between wildlife and

12 domestic livestock.

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14 (e) No funds shall be made available under this act

15 for the reintroduction of any native or nonnative game or

16 nongame species pursuant to the Endangered Species Act of

17 1973, 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seg., as amended.

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19 (f) The board shall not have the power of eminent

20 domain and only has the power to accept, reject or dispose

21 of an interest in property, whether in fee, by way of

22 easement, or otherwise, when the transaction with the board

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23 is that of a willing conveyor of the interest.

9-15-104. Wildlife and natural resource trust account

2 board established; terms; meetings; duties.

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4 There is created the Wyoming wildlife and natural 5 resource trust account board. The board shall consist of nine (9) members appointed by the governor and confirmed by 6 the senate, who are residents of Wyoming. The members shall 7 be appointed from each of the appointment districts set 8 9 forth in W.S. 5-3-101. The board membership shall reflect 10 a broad spectrum of experiences including wildlife, 11 agriculture, energy, sportsmen and tourism. Not more than

five (5) members shall be of the same political party.

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14 (b) Except for the initial board, each appointed member of the board shall serve for a term of three (3) 15 years. Of the initial appointees, three (3) members shall 16 17 be appointed for one (1) year, three (3) members shall be appointed for two (2) years and three (3) members shall be 18 appointed for three (3) years. The governor may remove any 19 20 member as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. Any vacancy occurring 21 between sessions of the legislature may be filled by the 22 governor as provided under W.S. 28-12-101(b). The board shall select one (1) of its members to serve as chair. 23

1 (c) Administration of any funds administered by the

2 board shall be by the secretary to the board, who shall be

3 employed by the board. The secretary shall not be housed

4 in any agency which may be a grantee under this act. The

5 secretary to the board shall further act as liaison for the

6 board to other state, federal and local governmental

7 agencies, as well as nonprofit organizations.

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9 (d) The board shall meet regularly. Members shall

10 serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for

11 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in the

12 manner and amounts provided by law for state employees.

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14 (e) The board shall receive and evaluate applications

15 for grants from the income account. The board shall review

16 applications, approve projects and assure compliance with

17 the terms of grants. The board may approve grants from the

18 account for small projects. Funds for small projects are

19 continuously appropriated from the income account for

20 grants approved by the board. The board may recommend to

21 the governor the funding of large projects. No funds shall

22 be expended for large projects except upon specific

23 legislative appropriation of funds from the income account.

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(f) The board shall adopt rules and regulations in 1 2 accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act as 3 necessary to carry out its duties under this act, including 4 rules to: 5 6 (i) Establish criteria for grants from the 7 income account which accomplish the purposes of this act; 8 9 (ii) Establish criteria for matching funds or 10 other in-kind contributions from grantees; 11 12 (iii) Evaluate, rank and prioritize grant 13 proposals with an emphasis on those projects that are partnerships involving private and public entities; 14 15 16 (iv) Review and monitor grants to grantees; 17 18 (v) Consider citizen access for hunting, fishing and recreation activities; 19 20 21 (vi) Establish criteria for the acceptance or 22 rejection of gifts, transfers, bequests and donations

including interest in real or personal property;

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1 (vii) Consider other necessary matters.

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3 (g) In fulfilling its duties under this act the board

4 may:

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6 (i) Consult with other governmental agencies and

7 nonprofit organizations, as necessary;

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9 (ii) Accept or decline federal grants and other

10 contributions, grants, gifts, transfers, bequests and

11 donations from any source.

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13 (h) The board shall annually report to the governor,

14 the joint appropriations interim committee and the joint

15 travel, recreation, wildlife and cultural resources interim

16 committee no later than September 1 with respect to all

17 federal grants, state appropriations and other

18 contributions, grants, gifts, bequests and donations

19 received and credited to the trust account and income

20 account during the preceding fiscal year. The report shall

21 include grants awarded by the board to nonprofit and

22 governmental organizations and progress made toward the

23 condition of any grant made.

1 (j) The governor shall include in his proposed state 2 budget submitted in accordance with W.S. 9-2-1013, his 3 recommendations for funding from the income account of 4 projects submitted by the board under this section. Until 5 the corpus of the trust account exceeds two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000.00) the governor may also include in 6 7 his proposed state budget recommendations for additional funding of the corpus of the trust account. The governor 8 9 may also include in his proposed state 10 recommendations for additional funding of the income 11 account.

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9-15-105. Grant applications; eligible entities.

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(a) The board may only grant funds to nonprofit and 15 governmental organizations. The board shall award grants 16 17 to promote, preserve and enhance the unique wildlife and environmental heritage of Wyoming and its people. 18 board shall have the discretion to determine the amount of 19 20 each grant and any conditions attached to the grant. For 21 the purposes of this act, a grant may include the 22 acquisition of an interest in real or personal property.

1 (b) Grants by the board are not intended to provide a 2 supplement to, or replacement of, the operating budget of 3 any governmental agency or nonprofit organization except as 4 those funds are directly related to the purposes of the 5 grant. 6 9-15-106. Audits. 7 8 9 The director of the department of audit or his designee 10 shall audit the trust account biennially. Copies of the 11 audit shall be provided to the governor, the joint 12 appropriations interim committee and the joint travel, 13 recreation, wildlife and cultural resources interim committee. 14 15 16 Section 2. 17 18 There is appropriated seventy-five million (a) dollars (\$75,000,000.00) from the budget reserve account to 19 20 the Wyoming wildlife and natural resource trust account. 21 22 (b) There is appropriated from the budget reserve account to the Wyoming wildlife and natural resource income 23 account three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) to 24
