AN ACT relating to nursing; amending requirements for the 1 practice of nursing as specified; providing for the 2 3 regulation of advance practice registered nurses; providing definitions; providing for the membership of the board of 4 5 nursing; providing that the board shall report violations of the act to prosecuting attorneys; authorizing the board 6 7 to collect data; amending fees; providing that board rules and regulations may be more stringent than federal rules; 8 providing qualifications for an executive director; 9 10 providing for examinations; removing grace period for renewal of licenses; providing for approval and evaluation 11 of nursing education programs and providing for a fee; 12 13 providing for competency examinations; providing for unlicensed practice in the case of emergency or disaster; 14

2	board permitting the performance by a nursing

8	performing skillfully and proficiently the functions within
9	the role of the licensee, and demonstrating the
10	interrelationship of essential the application of
11	knowledge, judgment and the interpersonal, critical
12	thinking, decision-making, and psychomotor skills expected
13	for the practice role, within the context of public health,
14	safety and welfare;
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16	(vii) "Impaired" means the inability to practice
17	nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by
18	reason of one (1) or more of the following:
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20	(A) Lack of nursing competence;
21	
22	(B) Mental illness;
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(C) Physical illness, including, but not 1 2 limited to, deterioration through the aging process or loss 3 of motor skill; or 4 5 (D) Chemical or alcohol impairment. 6 7 (v) (viii) "License" means a current document permitting the practice of nursing as a registered nurse or 8 9 licensed practical nurse; 10 11 (vi) "Medical act" means an aspect of care which implements the medical plan as prescribed by a licensed or 12 otherwise legally authorized physician or dentist; 13 14 (vii) (ix) "Nursing process" means the 15 investigative approach to nursing practice utilizing a 16 17 method of problem identification by means of: 18 19 (A) Assessment: A systematic and continuous 20 collection of objective and subjective data about the 21 health status of individuals and groups derived from 22 observations, health assessment including physical assessment, skills, interviews, written records 23 and 24 reports;

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2	(B) <u>Nursing</u> Diagnosis: The identification
3	of actual or potential responses to health needs or
4	problems based on collecting, analyzing and comparing data
5	with appropriate nursing standards to serve as the basis
6	for indicating providing nursing care or for which referral
7	to appropriate medical or community resources is required;

9	(viii)(x) "Practice of practical nursing" means
10	the performance of technical services requiring and nursing
11	procedures which require basic knowledge of the biological,
12	physical, behavioral, psychological and sociological
13	sciences. and of nursing procedures. These skills and
14	services are performed under the direction of a licensed
15	physician or dentist, advanced practice registered nurse or
16	registered professional nurse <mark>., and utilize</mark> <u>S</u> tandardized
17	procedures leading that lead to predictable outcomes <u>are</u>
18	utilized in the observation and care of the ill, injured
19	and infirm, in provision of care for the maintenance of
20	health, in action to safeguard <u>directed</u> toward safeguarding
21	life and health, and in the administration of medications
22	and treatments prescribed by any person authorized by state
23	law to prescribe, and in delegation to appropriate

1 assistive personnel as provided by state law and board 2 rules and regulations;

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4 (ix) (xi) "Practice of professional nursing" 5 means the performance of professional services requiring substantial knowledge of biological, physical, 6 the 7 behavioral, psychological and sociological sciences, and of nursing theory as the basis for applying the nursing 8 9 process which consists of assessment, diagnosis, planning, 10 intervention and evaluation. The nursing process is 11 utilized in the promotion and maintenance of health, the 12 finding and management of illness, injury or case 13 infirmity, the restoration of optimum function or the and 14 achievement of a dignified death. Nursing practice includes but is not limited to administration, teaching, counseling, 15 supervision, delegation, evaluation of nursing practice and 16 17 execution or of the medical regimen., including The therapeutic plan includes the administration of medications 18 and treatments prescribed by any person authorized by state 19 20 law to prescribe. Each registered professional nurse is 21 accountable and responsible for the quality of nursing care 22 rendered;

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1	(x) (xii) "Practice of a certified nursing
2	assistant/nurse aide" means, regardless of title or care
3	setting, the performance of delegated nursing related tasks
4	and services <u>delegated</u> by a person, regardless of title or
5	care setting, who has completed licensed nurse. The nursing
6	assistant/nurse aide shall complete a specified course of
7	study , has met <u>approved by the board, meet</u> minimum
8	competency requirements and is be certified by the board;
9	
10	(xi) "Functions of a nursing assistant/nurse
11	aide" means those limited tasks and services that a
12	licensed nurse may delegate to a nursing assistant;
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14	(xii)<mark>(xiii)</mark> "This act" means W.S. 33-21-119

20	(a) The board of nursing shall consist of seven (7)
21	members to be appointed by the governor. Four (4) Five (5)
22	members shall be registered nurses, two (2) members one (1)
23	<pre>member shall be a licensed practical nurses nurse and one</pre>
24	(1) member shall be a representative of the public.

Membership shall be restricted to no more than one (1)
person who is associated with a particular agency,
educational institution, corporation or other enterprise or
subsidiary at one time. Membership shall represent various
geographical areas of Wyoming.

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(b) Each registered nurse member of the board shall 7 be a resident of this state, licensed in good standing 8 9 under the provisions of this act, currently engaged in the practice of nursing as a registered nurse and shall have 10 11 had no less than five (5) years of experience as a 12 registered nurse, at least three (3) of which immediately 13 preceded appointment. Of the four (4) five (5) registered 14 nurse members on the board, one (1) member shall have had at least two (2) years of experience in an administrative 15 16 or teaching position in a nursing education program, one 17 (1) member shall have had at least two (2) years of experience in administration in nursing service or public 18 19 health nursing, one (1) member shall have at least two (2) 20 years experience as an advanced practice registered nurse, 21 and the remaining two (2) members shall be appointed from 22 various areas of nursing.
