AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; establishing the crime of voyeurism; providing a definition; providing penalties; and providing for an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. W.S. 6-4-304 is created to read:

6-4-304. Voyeurism; penalties; "peep" defined.
(a) A person is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty dollars ( $\$ 750.00$ ), or both, if he, without the consent of the other person, commits the crime of voyeurism by:
(i) Peeping;
(ii) Going upon the land of another with the intent to peep; or
(iii) Peeping into an area where an occupant of the area reasonably can be expected to disrobe, including:
(A) Restrooms;
(B) Baths;
(C) Showers; or
(D) Dressing or fitting rooms.
(b) A person is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than two (2) years, a fine of not more than five thousand dollars $(\$ 5,000.00)$, or both, if he commits the offense specified in subsection (a) of this section and the offense is knowingly or intentionally committed by means of a camera, a video camera or any other type of video recording device.

(c) For purposes of this section, "peep" means any looking of a clandestine, surreptitious, prying or secretive nature.

Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. (END)
