Wyoming historic mine trail system.

AN ACT relating to the Wyoming historic mine trail system; 1 2 establishing the trail system; creating a commission to develop the system; specifying commission duties and 3 4 authorizing compensation; prescribing a process for system development and establishing advisory groups to assist with 5 the process; imposing duties upon the tourism and travel 6 division; providing an appropriation; and providing for 7 8 effective dates. 9 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 11 12 Section 1. W.S. 36-8-1401 through 36-8-1403 are 13 created to read: 14 15 ARTICLE 14 16 WYOMING HISTORIC MINE TRAIL SYSTEM

1 2 36-8-1401. Historic mine trail commission; created; membership; legislative advisory members; 3 quorum; 4 compensation. 5 (a) The historic mine trail commission is established 6 and shall consist of the following four (4) members: 7 8 9 (i) A member of the Wyoming business council selected by the council; 10 11 12 (ii) The director of the Wyoming division of 13 travel and tourism or his designee; 14 15 (iii) The director of the Wyoming department of 16 transportation or his designee; 17 18 (iv) The administrator of the Wyoming abandoned mine land division or his designee. 19 20 21 (b) In addition to the members specified under subsection (a) of this section, the chairman of the Wyoming 22 senate travel, recreation, wildlife and cultural resources 23 committee or his designee, and the chairman of the Wyoming 24

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house travel, recreation, wildlife and cultural resources 1 2 committee or his designee, shall serve on the commission in 3 an advisory, nonvoting capacity. 4 5 (c) The commission shall elect one (1) of its voting members to act as chairman, who shall ensure the commission 6 7 meets at least once each year on or near July 10, and more frequently when necessary. Three (3) members shall 8 9 constitute a quorum necessary to take official commission action. 10 11 12 (d) Legislative advisory members of the commission shall receive salary, per diem and travel in the manner and amounts specified under W.S. 28-5-101, for attending commission meetings. The commission member representing

13 14 15 the business council shall be paid per diem in accordance 16 17 with W.S. 9-12-102(b) when conducting official commission 18 business.

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20 36-8-1402. Wyoming historic mine trail system; 21 creation; commission duties and processes for trail 22 development; advisory groups.

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(a) The Wyoming historic mine trail system is created 1 2 for purposes of designating and identifying historic mine locations and trails linking historic mines within the 3 4 state, and as such, shall: 5 6 (i) Provide a precise history of mineral 7 development in Wyoming; 8 9 (ii) Integrate the role of mining and minerals 10 in the development of Wyoming's economy; 11 12 (iii) Identify and describe Wyoming's mining and 13 mineral development heritage. 14 15 (b) The Wyoming historic mine trail system shall be established by the commission created under W.S. 36-8-1401 16 17 through a process of nominations submitted from among 18 various public and private sectors within Wyoming which are 19 knowledgeable of historic mining activities, and in 20 consultation and coordination with the affected boards of county commissioners and other local governing bodies and 21 22 agencies. The system shall expand upon the first 23 designated historic mine trail as established by this subsection, which shall link the gold mines located in 24

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South Pass City and Atlantic City, Wyoming, to the iron
mines located in Atlantic City, to the uranium mines in the
Crooks Gap and Gas Hills mining districts located in
Fremont County, Wyoming.

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(c) For purposes of subsection (b) of this section, 6 7 the commission shall organize advisory groups from among representatives of relevant historical societies operating 8 9 Wyoming, private and public museums operating in in Wyoming, state, city and county libraries and other state 10 11 and federal agencies providing background, information and 12 representation of mining activities on private and 13 governmental lands within Wyoming. The advisory groups shall develop nominations for additional segments to the 14 Wyoming historic mine trail system for subsequent review 15 16 and determination by the commission. Upon approval of the 17 commission chairman, advisory members may be reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred for participation in official 18 advisory group business in the manner and amounts provided 19 20 for state employees under W.S. 9-3-102 and 9-3-103.

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22 (d) In addition to subsection (b) of this section, 23 the commission shall:

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1 (i) Annually determine any additional segments 2 to the historic mine trail system through the nomination 3 process established under this section;

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5 (ii) Consult and coordinate trail development 6 with the appropriate local governmental entities having 7 jurisdiction over lands and roads involved in trail 8 designation;

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10 (iii) Through the travel and tourism division, 11 develop promotional materials supporting the trail system, 12 including appropriate historical information describing the 13 trail system, its significance to Wyoming and links to 14 information expanding upon the historic mining industry; 15

16 (iv) Encourage the Wyoming media industry to 17 provide appropriate recognition of information on the 18 mining areas of Wyoming, its historical significance, 19 communities impacted by the industry, activities 20 surrounding the historic mine trail system and development 21 of the trail system;

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(v) Develop the historic mine trail system in 1 2 conjunction with appropriate state and local land use and 3 health and safety regulations and policies; 4 5 (vi) Establish rules and regulations governing the trail system development and nomination process and the 6 7 expansion of trail segments. 8 9 36-8-1403. Commission administrative support; annual 10 report. 11 12 The division of travel and tourism within the (a) 13 business council shall provide necessary staffing and administrative support to the commission in carrying out 14 duties and responsibilities imposed under this article. 15 16 17 (b) The commission shall annually report to the governor and legislature in the manner provided under W.S. 18 9-2-1014 on the execution of delegated duties and historic 19 mine trail development and on the expenditures of funds 20 21 appropriated to the commission. 22 Section 2. Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) 23 is

24 appropriated from the general fund to the Wyoming business

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council, travel and tourism division, to fund the expenses
of the commission and other expenditures necessary to carry
out section 1 of this act during the period commencing July
1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006.

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6 Section 3. Members of the Wyoming historic mine trail 7 commission established under W.S. 36-8-1401, as created 8 under section 1 of this act, shall be determined in 9 sufficient time to enable a meeting of the commission on or 10 about July 10, 2005.

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12 Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2005, except 13 for section 3 of this act which is effective immediately 14 upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become 15 law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 16 Constitution.
