A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to private school licensing; requiring 2 registration of all accredited private degree granting post 3 secondary education institutions as specified; prohibiting 4 operation without registration; eliminating licensure 5 requirements for nonaccredited private degree granting post 6 secondary education institutions; imposing fees; and 7 providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10

Section 1. W.S. 21-2-401(a), (b) and (d), 21-2-402(a), (b)(intro) and (d), 21-2-403(a), 21-2-404(a) and (d) and 21-2-405(a) are amended to read:

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15 21-2-401. License required; registration required for 16 private degree granting post secondary education

institutions; state board of education to administer and
 set minimum standards for licensure.

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4 Except as provided by subsection (b) of this (a) 5 section, all trade, correspondence, distance education, technical, vocational, business or other private schools, 6 and all degree granting post secondary education 7 institutions not accredited by an accrediting association 8 9 recognized by the United States department of education, 10 which are located within the state or have their principal place of business out of state but doing business in the 11 12 state, shall be licensed under this article before 13 operating or doing business in this state.

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15 (b) Any private degree granting post secondary 16 education institution not accredited by an accrediting 17 association recognized by the United States department of education, shall prior to operating or doing business in 18 this state, maintain physical facilities as office space 19 20 which is located in the state either through property owned 21 by the institution or through office space which is subject 22 to a current lease at the time of application. The term of 23 any lease shall be for a minimum of one (1) year from its 24 inception and lease renewal shall be for periods of not

1	less than one (1) year. In addition to W.S.
2	21-2-402(b)(vi), the institution shall provide the state
3	department a copy of each new lease or lease renewal
4	executed while holding a license under this article. The
5	designated office space shall be staffed on a full-time
6	basis by an employee of the institution. In addition, the
7	institution shall provide the state department with
8	evidence that substantive academic and student service-
9	related activity is conducted at this designated location
10	be registered with the state board in accordance with this
11	article.

(d) The board shall establish minimum standards for 13 all schools described in subsection (a) of this section and 14 provide for the investigation and evaluation of the schools 15 as necessary to administer this article. In addition, the 16 board shall prior to issuing any license under this article 17 and not less than once every three (3) years thereafter, 18 inspect and visit any place of business of or any place 19 20 where services are delivered by each degree granting post 21 secondary education institution. The on-site inspection and visitation shall be conducted by a representative of the 22 state department and may occur more frequently if requested 23 24 by the department. The licensee shall pay the costs of the

1	inspection and visitation according to rule and regulation
2	of the department. Written findings by the department shall
3	be provided to the board and the licensee. To enforce
4	requirements prescribed under subsection (b) of this
5	section, the department may provide for random, unannounced
6	on-site visitations at designated office space locations of
7	any degree granting post secondary education institution.
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9	21-2-402. Licensure; registration of private degree
10	granting post secondary education institutions; fees;
11	suspension and revocation.
12	
13	(a) Schools specified under W.S. 21-2-401(a)
14	excluding those schools exempt under W.S. 21-2-406 and
15	private degree granting post secondary education
16	institutions subject to subsection (b) of this section,
17	shall pay an annual license fee established by rule and
18	regulation of the department in an amount that, to the
19	extent practicable, the total revenue generated from the
20	fees collected approximates but does not exceed the direct
0.1	
21	and indirect costs of administering the regulatory

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1	(b) <u>Private degree granting p</u> ost secondary education
2	institutions specified under W.S. 21-2-401(a) shall
3	<u>annually</u> apply to the state department of education for $\frac{1}{2}$
4	license registration under this article. Application shall
5	be in a manner and on a form prescribed by the department
6	and shall include: documentation or other verification of
7	accreditation by an accrediting association recognized by
8	the United States department of education or verification
9	of candidacy status for accreditation. Except as otherwise
10	provided under this subsection, an annual registration fee
11	of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) shall be collected by the
12	department prior to issuing a registration certificate
13	under this article. If the applicant is a candidate for
14	accreditation and submits verification of candidacy status,
15	the department shall collect an annual registration fee of
16	one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for each year the
17	applicant institution remains a candidate, up to a period
18	of not to exceed five (5) years and until the institution
19	receives accreditation. Upon a showing of good cause by
20	the applicant, the five (5) year period of candidacy status
21	may be extended by the department.

23 (d) Subject to the requirements of the Wyoming24 Administrative Procedure Act, the state board may suspend

1 or revoke a license registration certificate issued under this section to any private degree granting post secondary 2 education institution for past or current material 3 misrepresentations or omissions in any information 4 5 submitted to the department pursuant to this article, for failure of the licensee to report any change in information 6 7 and other materials required under subsection (b) of this 8 section, for multiple or repeated violations of board 9 requirements to report or take action in a timely manner, 10 or for any other violation of this article. The board shall 11 provide written notice of any violation of this article to 12 the licensee at his last known address, which shall notify 13 the licensee of his opportunity to address any violation of this article and otherwise demonstrate compliance with this 14 article within ten (10) days from the date of notice loss 15 16 of accreditation status or accreditation candidacy status 17 during any registration period.

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19 21-2-403. Licensing and regulation of qualifications
 20 of agents of private schools; fee.

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(a) Agents of those schools specified under W.S.
23 21-2-401(a) and (b) who operate in the state and agents
employed to solicit resident students by schools located

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outside the state which are similar to schools specified 1 under W.S. 21-2-401(a) and (b), shall be licensed under 2 3 this article before soliciting students and representing 4 schools in this state. 5 21-2-404. Operation without license or registration 6 7 unlawful; soliciting business in public schools; furnishing list of students. 8 9 10 (a) No person shall operate a school as defined in W.S. 21-2-401 in Wyoming and no private school shall 11 conduct business in Wyoming without first obtaining a 12 13 license or registration under this article. 14 (d) No school licensed under this article shall claim 15 16 or advertise to prospective or enrolled students that it is 17 accredited in the United States unless the named accrediting association, commission or other entity is 18 approved by the United States department of education. - or 19 20 the council for higher education accreditation. 21 22 21-2-405. Performance bond or other security; amount; 23 exemption.

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1 (a) Before any school is issued a license under this 2 article, it shall submit to the state department of 3 education a performance bond or other form of security 4 prescribed by rule and regulation of the state department. 5 The bond or other form of security shall be in an amount specified by department rule and regulation subject to 6 7 limitations prescribed by this subsection. The bond for $\frac{1}{2}$ degree granting post secondary education institution shall 8 9 be not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) 10 and for all other private schools except those schools 11 excluded under subsection (b) of this section and private 12 degree granting posit secondary education institutions registered under this article, shall be not more than ten 13 thousand dollars (\$10,000.00). The bonds or other form of 14 security shall be approved by the attorney general and 15 16 shall be renewed annually as long as the school retains its 17 license to do business in Wyoming. The performance bond or other form of security is to assure protection of all 18 persons enrolled in a course of study who may be aggrieved 19 20 by any school doing business or operating in the state. 21 The department of education is custodian of all bonds and 22 other securities filed under this section and may render administrative but not legal assistance to all aggrieved 23 persons who may be entitled to relief under the bond. 24
