1	AN ACT relating to public welfare; creating the emergency
2	energy assistance trust fund; providing for assistance
3	payments for residential heating as specified; imposing
4	conditions upon payments; providing for administration of
5	the program; providing an appropriation and for a
6	continuous appropriation; specifying legislative findings;
7	and providing for an effective date.

9	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

.1	Section 1.

(a) The legislature finds:

The average price for natural gas received 1 (i)

2 by producers in Wyoming in 2002 was two dollars eleven

3 cents (\$2.11) per MCF;

4

5 (ii) That average price received by producers in

Wyoming increased to approximately seven dollars (\$7.00) 6

7 per MCF for 2005;

8

9 (iii) The state has received extraordinary

10 increases in severance tax revenues as a result of the

11 increased value of natural gas;

12

(iv) The state has also received state and 13

14 federal mineral royalty increases corresponding to the

increased value of natural gas over the same period; 15

16

17 (v) Wyoming residents have suffered higher

heating bills as a result of higher energy commodity 18

prices; 19

20

21 (vi) Many Wyoming residents fail to qualify for

22 state and federal energy assistance programs based upon

income and other guidelines yet through conditions beyond 23

their control are unable to afford the increased heating 1

2 bills and still maintain an adequate standard of living;

3

4 (vii) When the state coffers are filling at

5 previously unseen rates based upon energy prices which

inversely burden residents of the state with high heating 6

7 bills, the state has a moral obligation to ensure that all

residents can pay those bills to adequately heat their 8

9 homes, while still maintaining an adequate standard of

10 living;

11

12 (viii) It is in the public interest to encourage

13 industry and others enjoying high revenues based upon high

energy prices to share those revenues in order to provide 14

relief to those suffering as a result of the same high 15

16 energy prices;

17

18 The expenditure of public funds under this (ix)

act will encourage the private sector to share monies with 19

20 Wyoming citizens for the overall public good and is in

21 fulfillment of both a moral obligation of the state and for

22 a public purpose.

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42-2-502. Energy assistance trust fund created; 1 2 income account; funding. 3 4 The Wyoming energy assistance trust fund is (a) 5 created. The trust fund shall consist of: 6 7 (i) All funds received by the state of Wyoming and designated to the trust fund by gift from whatever 8 9 source; 10 11 (ii) Severance tax revenues deposited pursuant to 12 W.S. 39-14-801(e)(i) and this paragraph. The state 13 treasurer shall determine deposits made to the trust fund pursuant to paragraph (i) of this subsection in the 14 previous month and deposit to the trust fund from revenues 15 under W.S. 39-14-801(e)(i) an amount equal to the amount of 16 17 those deposits; and 18 19 (iii) Other funds appropriated to the trust 20 fund.

21

22 (b) Funds deposited to the trust fund are intended to be inviolate and constitute a permanent or perpetual fund 23 24 which shall be invested by the state treasurer as

- 1 authorized by law and in a manner to obtain the highest
- 2 return possible consistent with preservation of the corpus.
- 3 Any earnings from investment of the corpus of the trust
- 4 fund shall be credited by the state treasurer into a
- 5 separate income account.

6

- 7 (c) Revenues deposited into the income account are
- 8 continuously appropriated to the department to be expended
- 9 only as provided by this act.

10

- 11 (d) Funds within the income account which are not
- 12 expended nor obligated shall be transferred to the trust
- 13 fund on July 1 of each year.

14

- 15 **42-2-503**. Emergency energy assistance program;
- 16 criteria for assistance.

- 18 (a) Funds within the income account shall be expended
- 19 for emergency energy assistance to Wyoming residents for
- 20 residential heating bills in accordance with the following:

- 22 (i) The household has a currently due or
- 23 delinquent heating bill which cannot be paid with resources
- 24 of members of the household while still providing for other

- 1 living essentials, such as, but not limited to food,
- 2 clothing and health care;

3

- 4 (ii) All other sources of public energy
- 5 assistance for the household shall have been exhausted;

6

- 7 (iii) The maximum yearly expenditure under this
- program shall be determined by the department on a yearly 8
- 9 basis;

10

- (iv) Expenditures under the program shall be 11
- limited by the amount within the income account and shall 12
- otherwise be upon a first come-first served basis. 13

14

- 15 42-2-504. Administration; administrative expenses;
- 16 rulemaking.

- The department shall administer the program 18 (a)
- through a contract basis with a private nonprofit entity 19
- 20 located in Wyoming. The contract shall require the
- 21 administrator to actively seek private donations to the
- 22 trust account and may provide for cooperative endeavors
- with other public and private energy assistance programs, 23

1 so long as funds are only expended under the program in

2 accordance with this act.

3

4 (b) The department may annually expend not more than

5 five percent (5%) from the annual amount of funds deposited

6 to the income account for administration of this act.

7

8 (c) No funds received by individuals pursuant to this

9 program shall be deemed as income for purposes of any other

10 assistance program funded entirely with state funds.

11

12 (d) The department shall adopt rules and regulations

13 to implement the provisions of this act.

14

Section 3. W.S. 9-2-2101 by creating a new subsection

16 (k) and 39-14-801(e)(i) are amended to read:

18 9-2-2101. Department of family services; duties and

19 responsibilities; state grants; authority to contract for

20 shelters; definitions; youth programs.

22 (k) The department shall administer the emergency

23 energy assistance program in accordance with W.S. 42-2-501

24 through 42-2-504.

2 39-14-801. Severance tax distributions; distribution 3 account created; formula.

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- 5 (e) Deposits into the account created by subsection
- (a) of this section shall be distributed as follows, 6
- 7 subject to subsections (b) through (d) of this section:

8

- 9 (i) To the general fund, sixty-two and twenty-
- 10 six hundredths percent (62.26%). Prior to making these
- 11 distributions to the general fund the amounts required to
- 12 match private contributions to the energy assistance
- 13 account as provided by W.S. 42-2-502(a)(ii) shall be
- 14 deposited to that account;

15

- Section 4. There is appropriated fifty thousand 16
- 17 dollars (\$50,000.00) from the general fund to the
- department of family services for publicizing the emergency 18
- 19 energy assistance program, for initial contract
- 20 administration, and rulemaking to implement the program.

- Section 5. This act is effective immediately upon 22
- completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 23
