Mental health and substance abuse appropriations.

Sponsored by: Select Committee on Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services

### A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to appropriations for mental health and
- 2 substance abuse programs; providing appropriations,
- 3 providing continuous appropriations; specifying conditions;
- 4 requiring rulemaking; continuing a study of the mental
- 5 health and substance abuse services delivery system;
- 6 requiring reports; authorizing positions; and providing for
- 7 effective dates.

8

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10

11 Section 1. Wyoming state hospital facilities study.

- 13 (a) There is appropriated one hundred seventy-three
- 14 thousand six hundred eighty dollars (\$173,680.00), or as
- 15 much thereof as is necessary, from the general fund to the

- 1 department of administration and information.
- 2 Notwithstanding W.S. 9-4-207, funds appropriated under this
- 3 section shall not lapse or revert to the general fund at
- 4 the end of the biennium ending June 30, 2006.

- 6 (b) The state building commission shall use the funds
- 7 appropriated under this section to enter into competitive
- 8 bid contracts with one (1) or more entities to conduct a
- 9 building assessment of the physical infrastructure at the
- 10 Wyoming state hospital to determine the extent to which
- 11 buildings and other structures at the Wyoming state
- 12 hospital may need to be remodeled, repaired or replaced.
- 13 The state building commission shall report to the joint
- 14 appropriations interim committee no later than September 1,
- 15 2007, with a description of the current physical facilities
- 16 at the Wyoming state hospital, the extent to which
- 17 structures need to be remodeled or replaced to meet life
- 18 safety codes and any other standards applicable to
- 19 facilities for the treatment and housing of mentally ill
- 20 persons, and the projected costs for such proposals.

- 22 (c) The Wyoming state hospital shall assist the state
- 23 building commission and its contractors, as necessary, to
- 24 determine the needs of the physical facilities at the state

- 1 hospital. The state hospital shall specifically establish
- 2 a strategic plan defining its mission in treatment of
- 3 mentally ill persons in the state and shall report to the
- 4 joint appropriations interim committee and the select
- 5 committee on mental health and substance abuse services no
- 6 later than August 1, 2006. The strategic plan shall
- 7 include a description of:

- 9 (i) The scope of acute adult psychiatric care the
- 10 state hospital will provide;

11

- 12 (ii) The scope of forensic examinations and
- 13 treatment the state hospital will provide for persons who
- 14 have entered a plea of not guilty by reason of mental
- 15 illness or deficiency under W.S. 7-11-301 through 7-11-307;

16

- 17 (iii) The scope of in-patient and out-patient
- 18 services the state hospital will provide;

19

- 20 (iv) The scope of geropsychiatric services the
- 21 state hospital will provide;

- 23 (v) The availability and projected need for adult
- 24 voluntary and involuntary acute psychiatric care.

2 (d) This section is effective immediately upon

3 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

4 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

5 Constitution.

6

7 Section 2. Advocacy liaison position at Wyoming state

8 hospital.

9

10 (a) There is appropriated one hundred fifty thousand 11 dollars (\$150,000.00), or as much thereof as is necessary,

12 from the general fund for the biennium beginning July 1,

13 2006, to the Wyoming attorney general to contract with the

14 federally funded agency established under the federal

15 Protection and Advocacy for Mentally Ill Individuals Act

16 (42 U.S.C. 10803) for a liaison position located at the

17 Wyoming state hospital to ensure the safety, treatment and

18 civil rights of residents at the state hospital are

19 protected.

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24

(b) The state hospital shall provide office space and equipment necessary for the liaison position to perform its functions, but the liaison shall not be a state employee

for purposes of the attorney general's or the department of

- 1 health's budgets. The liaison shall be hired and subject to
- 2 the policies of the federally funded agency specified in
- 3 subsection (a) of this section.

- 5 (c) The attorney general shall, in consultation with
- 6 the federally funded agency specified in subsection (a) of
- 7 this section, establish criteria to provide the liaison
- 8 with maximum access to patients and facilities at the state
- 9 hospital, consistent with state and federal privacy and
- 10 treatment standards.

- 12 (d) The liaison shall report its activities and
- 13 findings directly to the federally funded agency specified
- 14 in subsection (a) of this section. Any findings by the
- 15 liaison of alleged violations or practices that compromise
- 16 the safety, treatment or civil rights of patients at the
- 17 state hospital shall, immediately upon receipt from the
- 18 liaison, be provided by the federally funded agency to the
- 19 administrator of the state hospital, the director of the
- 20 department of health and the attorney general.

- The preceding section is a placeholder, pending
- 23 completion of negotiations between the Attorney
- General and Protection & Advocacy Systems, Inc.
- with respect to the details of the proposed
- liaison position at the Wyoming State Hospital.

## Section 3. Community services enhancements.

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4 (a) There is appropriated three million two hundred 5 five thousand ninety-eight dollars (\$3,205,098.00), or as much thereof as is necessary, from the general fund for the 6 7 biennium beginning July 1, 2006, to the department of health, mental health division, to reimburse community 8 9 based mental health and substance abuse centers with whom 10 the division has contracts, for community services enhancements. The funds appropriated under this section 11 shall be used by the community mental health and substance 12 13 abuse centers to enhance supported independent living, 14 including emergency subsistence, prescription medication, 15 other health and medical supports, housing, transportation, development of socialization skills, respite care and other 16 17 appropriate services, as determined by the department of 18 health.

19

#### 20 Section 4. Medicaid waiver.

21

(a) The department of health shall apply for a mental health waiver from the federal centers for Medicare and Medicaid services (CMS) to allow the provision of services

- 1 under the mental health waiver to children who are in need
- 2 of mental health services under the Wyoming Medical
- 3 Assistance and Services Act, in such a manner that will not
- 4 require the child's family to relinquish legal custody of
- 5 the child. Children eligible under the waiver shall be
- 6 required to:

- 8 (i) Undergo an evaluation to determine a
- 9 diagnosis and level of care;

10

- 11 (ii) Meet the federal definition of a child with
- 12 a serious emotional disturbance as defined in 34 C.F.R.
- 13 part 300.7;

14

- 15 (iii) Meet at least one (1) Medicaid criterion
- 16 for inpatient psychiatric hospitalization;

17

- 18 (iv) Receive a recommendation from a licensed
- 19 mental health professional that the child can safely be
- 20 served in his home, school and community; and

- 22 (v) Meet Medicaid financial eligibility
- 23 requirements based on the child's own resources, without

1 regard to the resources of other members of the child's

2 family unit.

3

4 (b) Up to two hundred fifty (250) children may be

5 served under the mental health waiver, if approved by CMS,

6 on a first-come, first-served basis. The department shall

7 screen children for eligibility prior to placing the child

8 on a waiting list for services under the mental health

9 waiver. The waiting list and the status of each child on

10 the waiting list with respect to eligibility and the need

11 for services shall be reviewed at least quarterly by the

12 department.

13

14 (c) For purposes of this section and contingent upon

15 approval of the waiver by CMS, there is appropriated for

16 the biennium beginning July 1, 2006, to the department of

17 health, mental health division, the following amounts to

18 implement the purposes of the mental health waiver:

19

20 (i) Four million three hundred eighty-seven

21 thousand four hundred eighty dollars (\$4,387,480.00) from

22 the general fund;

1 (ii) Four million eight hundred twelve thousand

2 five hundred twenty dollars (\$4,812,520.00) from federal

3 funds.

4

5 (d) Subsection (a) of this section is effective

6 immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a

7 bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of

8 the Wyoming Constitution.

9

# 10 Section 5. Bereavement counseling.

11

12 (a) There is appropriated from the general fund to the

13 department of health, mental health division, fifty

14 thousand dollars (\$50,000.00), which the division may

15 distribute, upon application from qualified private, not-

16 for-profit agencies providing mental health service under

17 contract with the division, for bereavement services to

18 surviving family members of deceased emergency responders

19 who died while in the performance of their official duties

20 responding to a civil or military emergency, or natural or

21 human caused disaster.

- 1 (b) The department of health shall promulgate rules
- 2 and regulations to implement this section, no later than
- 3 November 1, 2006.

- 5 (c) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-4-207, funds appropriated
- 6 under this section shall not lapse or revert to the general
- 7 fund at the end of the biennium and shall remain in a
- 8 bereavement account established by the department of health
- 9 until disbursed by the department for the purposes
- 10 specified in this section. Any interest earned on the
- 11 funds in the account shall remain in the account until
- 12 disbursed by the department for the purposes specified in
- 13 this section.

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- 15 Section 6. Regional pilot projects.
- 16 \*\*\*Staff Comment\*\*\*

Concern with paragraph (b)(ii) of this section has resulted in alternative language being provided below for subsections (a) & (b). The concerns include: 1) the psychiatrists should be employees of the contracting provider, and not of the Dept. of Health; and 2) if the Department is unable to recruit and hire psychiatrists, the requirement in paragraph (b)(ii) would make it impossible to enter into the contracts for the pilot projects. The authority to hire and funding for the Dept. of Health psychiatrists can be found in Section 9 of this act.

1 (a) The department of health, mental health division,

2 may enter into not more than two (2) separate contracts for

3 pilot projects within the state to enhance acute

4 psychiatric care services within regions it shall

5 designate. The contracts shall be entered into after

6 competitive bidding. The contracts shall include

7 assurances that:

8

9 (i) At least one (1) psychiatrist and other

10 appropriate allied health care providers shall be available

11 within the region to provide acute psychiatric services on

12 behalf of the contractor;

13

14 (ii) Transportation shall be available for

15 clients to and from the treatment facility;

16

17 (iii) Services shall be provided, as necessary,

18 to enable clients to transition back into the community or

19 to another more appropriate facility;

20

21 (iv) Outcome measurements shall be developed and

22 the outcomes documented, with due consideration of clients'

23 privacy.

(b) Contracts under this section shall not be entered 1 2 into unless and until the department: 3 4 (i) Adopts rules designating authorized treatment 5 facilities under W.S. 25-10-104; 6 7 (ii) Has hired additional psychiatrists, which psychiatrists shall be located in regions designated by the 8 9 department as having the most critical need for 10 psychiatrists; 11 12 (iii) Ensures that it shall pay the costs of transportation to the contracted acute psychiatric care 13 14 facilities; and 15 16 (iv) Has developed and made available a voluntary 17 training program for primary care physicians, mental health 18 workers and allied health care providers to develop and 19 enhance systems of care that can provide acute psychiatric 20 care throughout the state. 21 22 Alternative language for subsections (a) & (b) (a) The department of health, mental health division, 23 24 may enter into not more than two (2) separate contracts for

- 1 pilot projects within the state to enhance acute
- 2 psychiatric care services within regions it shall
- 3 designate. The contracts shall be entered into after
- 4 competitive bidding. The contracts shall include
- 5 assurances that:

- 7 (i) At least one (1) psychiatrist and other
- 8 appropriate allied health care providers are available
- 9 within the region to provide acute psychiatric services. If
- 10 no psychiatrist practices within the region, the
- 11 contracting provider will be responsible for the hiring of
- 12 a psychiatrist before full funding associated with the
- 13 acute psychiatric care under the contract is disbursed by
- 14 the department;

15

- 16 (ii) Transportation shall be available for
- 17 clients to and from the treatment facility;

18

- 19 (iii) Services shall be provided, as necessary,
- 20 to enable clients to transition back into the community or
- 21 to another more appropriate facility;

1 (iv) Outcome measurements shall be developed and 2 the outcomes documented, with due consideration of clients' 3 privacy. 4 (b) Contracts under this section shall not be entered 5 into unless and until the department: 6 7 8 (i) Adopts rules designating authorized treatment hospitals under W.S. 25-10-104; 9 10 (ii) Ensures that it shall pay the costs of 11 12 transportation to the contracted acute psychiatric care 13 facilities; and 14 15 (iii) Has developed and made available a voluntary training program for primary care physicians, 16 mental health workers and allied health care providers to 17 develop and enhance systems of care that can provide acute 18 19 psychiatric care throughout the state. 20 21 (c) There is appropriated two million eight hundred three thousand one hundred dollars (\$2,803,100.00), or as 22 23 much thereof as is necessary, from the general fund to the

department of health, mental health division, for the

1 biennium beginning July 1, 2006, to implement the purposes

2 of this section.

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4 (d) The department may commence the solicitation of

5 potential contractors under this section through requests

6 for proposals immediately.

7

8 (e) Subsection (d) of this subsection is effective

9 immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a

10 bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of

11 the Wyoming Constitution.

12

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Section 7. Involuntary commitment transportation.

14

15 (a) Of the general fund appropriation for the Wyoming

16 state hospital, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2006,

17 four hundred twenty-four thousand three hundred twenty-four

18 dollars (\$424,324.00) shall be used only to pay the costs

19 of transporting persons involuntarily committed under W.S.

20 25-10-110 to the Wyoming state hospital and back to the

21 person's community, or another location within the state at

22 the person's request, upon release from the state hospital.

23 The funds specified under this subsection shall remain in a

24 separate account and shall not be commingled with any other

1 funds appropriated to, or managed by, the Wyoming state

2 hospital.

3

4 (b) In addition to the funds specified in subsection 5 (a) of this section, there is appropriated two hundred thousand four hundred ninety-six 6 thirty 7 (\$230,496.00), or as much thereof as is necessary, from the general fund to the Wyoming state hospital, for the 8 9 biennium beginning July 1, 2006. The appropriation under this subsection shall be used only to pay the costs 10 associated with the establishment and operation of a mobile 11 team to transport persons involuntarily committed under 12 13 W.S. 25-10-110 to the Wyoming state hospital and back to 14 the person's community or another location within the state 15 at the person's request, upon release from the state hospital, or to pay the costs of air transportation of such 16 17 involuntarily committed persons and necessary staff, upon 18 circumstances deemed appropriate by the administrator of 19 the state hospital. The funds appropriated under this 20 subsection shall remain in the separate account required 21 under subsection (a) of this section and shall not be 22 commingled with any other funds appropriated to, or managed by, the department of health, except as provided in this 23 24 section.

- 2 (c) The Wyoming state hospital is authorized two (2)
- 3 full-time equivalent positions for the biennium beginning
- 4 July 1, 2006, to implement the purposes of this section.

5

6 Section 8. Mental health consumer services.

7

- 8 (a) There is appropriated five hundred thousand
- 9 dollars (\$500,000.00) from the general fund to the
- 10 department of health, mental health division, for the
- 11 biennium beginning July 1, 2006, to contract with a
- 12 consumer information and referral agency within the state.
- 13 The funds shall be used only for information, referral,
- 14 outreach and education services for consumers of mental
- 15 health services and their families. Funds appropriated
- 16 under this section shall not be used for lobbying purposes
- 17 before the legislature or the United States Congress.

18

- 19 Section 9. Mental health statewide system
- 20 improvements.

- 22 (a) There is appropriated eight million seven hundred
- 23 fifty-seven thousand dollars (\$8,757,000.00), or as much
- 24 thereof as is necessary, from the general fund to the

- 1 department of health, mental health division, for the
- 2 biennium beginning July 1, 2006, to implement statewide
- 3 mental health system improvements. The appropriation under
- 4 this section shall only be expended by the department as
- 5 follows:

- 7 (i) Not more than two million six hundred eighty-
- 8 eight thousand dollars (\$2,688,000.00) shall be for
- 9 salaries and benefits for not more than six (6)
- 10 psychiatrists to be hired by the mental health division and
- 11 located throughout the state in regions as designated by
- 12 the division;

13

- 14 (ii) Not more than four hundred twenty thousand
- 15 dollars (\$420,000.00) for recruitment of psychiatrists,
- 16 advanced nurse practitioners and physician assistants with
- 17 specialties in psychiatric care;

18

- 19 (iii) Not more than one million three hundred
- 20 forty-four thousand dollars (\$1,344,000.00) for crisis
- 21 response and triage;

- 23 (iv) Not more than three million dollars
- 24 (\$3,000,000.00) to implement social detoxification services

1 at community mental health centers under contract with the

2 department;

3

4 (v) Not more than one million three hundred five

5 thousand dollars (\$1,305,000.00) to increase early

6 intervention training and referral programs to identify

7 and serve children with at-risk behavioral or mental health

8 problems.

9

(b) The department of health, mental health division, 10

is authorized not more that six (6) additional full-time 11

equivalent positions to implement the purposes of paragraph 12

13 (a)(i) of this section.

14

15 Section 10. Mental health outcomes development/data

16 infrastructure.

17

18 (a) There is appropriated nine hundred forty-eight

thousand three hundred dollars (\$948,300.00), or as much 19

20 thereof as is necessary, from the general fund to the

21 department of health, mental health division, for the

biennium beginning July 1, 2006, to develop and enhance an 22

23 outcomes development and data infrastructure system.

24 funds under this section shall be used as follows:

2 (i) Seven hundred eighty-four thousand dollars 3 (\$784,000.00) shall be for salaries and benefits for one 4 (1) statewide quality improvement manager who shall be an 5 employee of the mental health division and not more than six (6) regional quality improvement coordinators, who 6 shall be hired by, and be employees of, community mental 7 health or substance abuse centers under contract with the 8 9 department; 10 (ii) One hundred thirty-five thousand eight 11 hundred dollars (\$135,800.00) shall be for regional and 12 13 statewide training and travel; 14 15 (iii) Twenty thousand hundred one dollars (\$20,100.00) shall be for purchase of computer equipment; 16 17 and

18

19 (iv) Eight thousand four hundred dollars
20 (\$8,400.00) shall be for telecommunications expenses.

21

(b) The department of health, mental health division, authorized one (1) additional full-time equivalent 1 position for the biennium beginning July 1, 2006, for

2 purposes of this section.

3

4 (c) The department of health, mental health division,

5 shall expend the appropriation under this section to

6 establish a statewide quality improvement program which

7 will systematically monitor the effectiveness, efficiency,

8 appropriateness and quality of mental health care and

9 services. The department of health, mental health

10 division, shall negotiate with service providers specific

11 system performance measures and client outcome measures

12 utilized on the statewide quality improvement program, to

13 include, but not be limited to, access to and quality of

14 core and regional services, changes in employment and

15 residential status of clients, and cost effectiveness of

16 services. Quality improvement reports shall be provided to

17 the joint appropriations interim committee and the joint

18 labor, health and social services interim committee no

19 later than October 1 of each year, beginning October 1,

20 2007.

21

22 Section 11. Mental health crisis stabilization.

1 (a) There is appropriated one million fifty thousand

2 dollars (\$1,050,000.00), or as much thereof as is

3 necessary, from the general fund to the department of

4 health, mental health division, for the biennium beginning

5 July 1, 2006, to develop or enhance mental health crisis

6 stabilization at each of the regions designated by the

7 department. The funds under this section shall be

8 distributed under contracts competitively bid within each

9 of the regions designated by the department.

10

## 11 Section 12. Substance abuse funding.

12

13 (a) There is appropriated forty-four million six

14 hundred fifty-six thousand five hundred sixty-six dollars

15 (\$44,656,566.00), or as much thereof as is necessary, from

16 the general fund to the department of health, substance

17 abuse division, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2006, to

18 continue, restructure and build the following programs with

19 the funds specified:

20

21 (i) Not more than six million dollars

22 (\$6,000,000.00) to continue the methamphetamine initiative

23 authorized under 2005 House Bill 308;

1 (ii) Not more than twenty-one million one hundred 2 one hundred seventy-three dollars sixty-six thousand (\$21,166,173.00) to continue residential substance abuse 3 4 treatment services for children, adolescents and women 5 previously funded with monies from the Temporary Assistance 6 to Needy Families Act bonus monies; 7 (iii) Not more than eight hundred seventy-seven 8 9 thousand two hundred twenty-two dollars (\$877,222.00) to 10 develop and enhance substance abuse treatment services data 11 collection; 12 13 (iv) Not more than four million four hundred sixty thousand dollars (\$4,460,000.00) to develop and 14 15 enhance social and medical detoxification services; 16 17 (v) Not more than three million five hundred sixty-two thousand six hundred forty 18 dollars (\$3,562,640.00) to continue and support the 19 quitline for the prevention and cessation of tobacco use; 20 21 22 (vi) Not more than four million twenty thousand 23 six hundred ninety dollars (\$4,020,690.00) to continue and

support system enhancements for the drug court program; and

2 (vii) Not more than four million five hundred

3 sixty-nine thousand eight hundred forty-one dollars

4 (\$4,569,841.00) to expand the access to recovery program

5 for adolescents and their families in Sheridan, Fremont and

6 Laramie counties and the Wind River Indian Reservation.

7 \*\*\*Staff Comment\*\*\*

Some of the general fund appropriation in this section, may duplicate funding that is provided from other sources, such as the tobacco settlement income account or federal funds.

11 12

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Section 13. Psychiatric residency rotations planning.

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(a) Not later than October 1, 2006, the University of 16 Wyoming shall submit a plan to the select committee on 17 mental health and substance abuse services under which 18 19 residents being trained in psychiatric residencies operated 20 in other states will perform a psychiatric rotation within 21 the state of Wyoming. The purpose of the plan and budget will be to provide exposure for psychiatrists in training 22 23 to the opportunities for practice within Wyoming and also to enhance the availability of mental health services 24 25 within the state. In developing the plan and the budget, 26 the University shall consult with providers of mental

- 1 health services in Wyoming and the Wyoming department of
- 2 health. The plan and proposed budget shall recommend a
- 3 structure for placement of the program within Wyoming state
- 4 government.

- 6 (b) There is appropriated forty-five thousand dollars
- 7 (\$45,000.00) from the general fund to the University of
- 8 Wyoming for professional services, travel and other
- 9 expenses associated with the development of the plan
- 10 required under this section.

11

- 12 (c) This section is effective immediately upon
- 13 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
- 14 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
- 15 Constitution.

16

- 17 Section 14. Select committee on mental health and
- 18 substance abuse services

- 20 (a) There is appropriated from the general fund to
- 21 the legislative service office seventy-five thousand dollars
- 22 (\$75,000.00) to be used for the select committee on mental
- 23 health and substance abuse services created by 2005 Wyoming
- 24 Session Laws, Chapter 195, to continue the study of issues

1 and propose legislation to provide more cost effective and

2 accessible delivery of mental health and substance abuse

3 services as provided in 2005 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter

4 195.

5

6 (b) The committee shall meet as necessary and shall

7 report to the joint appropriations interim committee, the

joint labor, health and social services interim committee and 8

9 the joint Judiciary interim committee its findings and

recommendations no later than November 1, 2006. 10

11

12 (c) This section is effective immediately upon

13 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

14 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

15 Constitution.

16

17 Section 15. Except as otherwise provided in this act,

18 this act is effective July 1, 2006.
