W.S. 9-1-222, 9-2-1005(a)(xii)(B), 9-2-16 1018(a)(i), 9-2-1026.1(a)(xiii) and (b)(vi) and 9-2-17 1026.2(k) are amended to read: 18

That provision is then repealed under W.S. 9-2-1018(a)(ii). However, the language has been modified at the request of the agency to reflect what is actually happening today. The changes affect the entities the policies and standards apply to, among other things. The language being repealed states: "(ii) Provide uniform standards for the economical, efficient and coordinated utilization of all data processing equipment, software, techniques and services by executive agencies, the judiciary and the legislature. The uniform standards shall be adhered to by all state agencies and, to the extent feasible, by the University of Wyoming and the state community colleges;"

5	legislature. The uniform standards shall be adhered to by
6	all state agencies and, to the extent feasible, by the
7	University of Wyoming and the state community colleges;

9	(iii) Upon request of any state agency provide
10	information and recommendations regarding the installation
11	and acquisition of computer and data processing equipment,
12	the qualifications of data processing personnel and
13	software systems required by the agency. The information
14	and recommendations shall be directed to advising the
15	agency how to comply with the uniform standards, minimize
16	duplication and promote effectiveness in the collection,
17	storage, interchange, retrieval, processing and

transmission of information<u>; The equipment and software</u> 18

19 shall be compatible with the central mainframe unless a

determination is made by the division administrator that 20

incompatibility would not affect the operation of the 21

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1	(b) No employee or agency of state government,
2	excluding the University of Wyoming and community colleges,

4	for hardware or software services on behalf of the state
5	without previously notifying the administrator of the

7	administration and information. Upon receiving notification
8	the administrator may suggest alternatives to the proposed
9	purchase which better accomplish the goals specified in
10	subsection (a) of this section. Any contract for purchase
11	or services under this section, pursuant to a list of
12	compatible hardware and software preapproved by the
13	administrator of the information technology division,
14	constitutes prior notification.

16	(c) The governor shall appoint the director of the
17	department of administration and information and two (2)
18	additional directors of state departments or separate
19	operating agencies to act as a information technology
20	oversight panel. The panel shall oversee the implementation
21	of this section as directed by the governor.
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23	(f) As used in this section:

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1	(i) "Compatible data processing equipment and
2	software" means the capability of direct interconnection
3	which for hardware may be achieved by the basic hardware
4	design and for software by modification;
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6	(ii) "Data processing equipment" means all
7	mainframe computers, all minicomputers, all personal
8	computers and all related peripheral equipment;
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10	(iii) "Data processing software" means all
11	purchased or developed software for any mainframe computer,
12	any minicomputer or any personal computer.
