## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to alcoholic beverages; specifying

2 penalties for minors purchasing alcohol; providing for

3 driver's license suspension as specified; and providing for

4 an effective date.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 12-6-101(c), and 31-7-129 by creating

9 a new subsection (c), are amended to read:

11 12-6-101. Sale or possession prohibited; when

12 possession unlawful; public drunkenness; falsification of

13 identification; penalty; prima facie identification as

14 defense.

Τ	(c) Any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years
2	who attempts in any manner to purchase alcoholic or malt
3	beverages or who falsifies any identification or uses any
4	false identification in order to obtain alcoholic or malt
5	beverages is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction
6	shall be fined not more than seven hundred fifty dollars
7	(\$750.00), imprisoned for not more than six (6) months, or
8	both. Any minor convicted under this section may have his
9	driver's license or permit suspended pursuant to W.S.
10	31-7-129. The court shall forward to the department of
11	transportation a copy of the record pertaining to the
12	disposition of any minor convicted under this section. Any
13	driver's license suspension or related records under this
14	section shall not be the basis for any increase in
15	insurance premiums or the cancellation of any insurance
16	policy for a minor, his parents or quardian.

## W.S. 31-7-129 would allow for the Department of 19 20 Transportation to use discretion on whether or 21 not to suspend the license or permit. A decision 22

will need to be made on whether or not to set 23 specific guidelines for DOT to follow in using

24 this discretion.
