for
AN ACT relating to public health and safety; authorizing
the chief electrical inspector to investigate
electrocutions; providing for a report to the electrical
board; and providing for an effective date.
Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:  Section 1. W.S. 35-9-131 is created to read:
35-9-131. Investigation of electrocutions;
notification to electrical board; powers of chief
electrical inspector.
(a) The chief electrical inspector, or his designee,

may investigate the cause, origin and circumstances of each

- electrocution occurring in the state that was reported to 1
- 2 the chief electrical inspector or was subject to emergency
- 3 response.

- 5 The chief electrical inspector, or his designee,
- 6 investigating an electrocution shall notify the electrical
- 7 board and within one (1) week of the electrocution and may,
- if an investigation was done, furnish the electrical board 8
- a written statement of all facts relating to its cause and 9
- 10 origin, and other information required by forms provided by
- 11 the electrical board.

- (c) In performing the duties imposed by this section, 13
- 14 the chief electrical inspector, or his designee, may:

- 16 Enter and examine any property, building or (i)
- 17 premises where any electrocution occurred;

- 19 (ii) Enter any property, building or premises
- 20 adjacent to that in which an electrocution occurred;

- 22 (iii) Take full control and custody of the
- 23 buildings and premises until his examination and
- 24 investigations are completed; and

- testimony to be reduced to writing. In taking testimony 2
- 3 and performing an investigation, the chief electrical
- 4 inspector or his designee may:

- 6 (A) Subpoena witnesses and compel their
- 7 attendance before him;

- 9 (B) Cause to be produced papers he requires
- 10 in the examination; and

- (C) Administer oaths and affirmations to 12
- persons appearing as witnesses before him. 13

- 15 (d) When the examination discloses that
- 16 electrocution involved criminal activity, the chief
- electrical inspector shall transmit a copy of the testimony 17
- 18 to the district attorney for the county where the
- 19 electrocution occurred.
