Chief electrical inspector-inspection of electrocutions.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to public health and safety; authorizing

2 the chief electrical inspector to investigate

3 electrocutions; requiring cooperation between agencies with

4 authority to investigate electrocutions; providing for a

5 report to the electrical board; and providing for an

6 effective date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9

10 **Section 1.** W.S. 35-9-131 is created to read:

11

12 35-9-131. Investigation of electrocutions;

13 notification to electrical board; powers of chief

14 electrical inspector.

15

1 (a) The chief electrical inspector, or his designee,

2 may investigate the cause, origin and circumstances of each

3 electrocution occurring in the state that was reported to

4 the chief electrical inspector or was subject to emergency

5 response. In cases where more than one (1) agency has

6 investigative authority over the electrocution, all

7 agencies shall work together to fully investigate.

8

9 (b) The chief electrical inspector, or his designee,

10 investigating an electrocution shall notify the electrical

11 board within one (1) week of the electrocution and may, if

12 an investigation was done, furnish the electrical board a

13 written statement of all facts relating to its cause and

14 origin, and other information required by forms provided by

15 the electrical board.

16

17 (c) In performing the duties imposed by this section,

18 the chief electrical inspector, or his designee, may:

19

20 (i) Enter and examine any property, building or

21 premises where any electrocution occurred;

22

23 (ii) Enter any property, building or premises

24 adjacent to that in which an electrocution occurred;

2 (iii) Take full control and custody of the

3 buildings and premises until his examination and

4 investigations are completed; and

5

(iv) Take testimony under oath and cause the 6

7 testimony to be reduced to writing. In taking testimony

and performing an investigation, the chief electrical 8

9 inspector or his designee may:

10

11 Subpoena witnesses and compel their (A)

12 attendance before him;

13

14 (B) Cause to be produced papers he requires

15 in the examination; and

16

17 (C) Administer oaths and affirmations to

persons appearing as witnesses before him. 18

20 (d) When the examination discloses that an

electrocution involved criminal activity, the chief 21

22 electrical inspector shall transmit a copy of the testimony

to the district attorney or county and prosecuting attorney 23

24 for the county where the electrocution occurred.
