    Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
    Section 1. W.S. 12-4-201(d) (iii), (f) (ii) and (iii)
    is amended to read:
    12-4-201. Retail liquor licenses and malt beverage
    permits; population formulas; fees.
    (d) Effective January 1, 1986, the number of retail liquor licenses issued shall be based on the following population formula:
(iii) Not more than one (1) additional license for each additional full three thousand (3,000) two five hundred $(2,500)$ population over nine thousand five hundred $(9,500)$.
(f) Retail liquor licenses and malt beverage permits may be granted by the county commissioners as the appropriate licensing authority in a county outside of incorporated cities and towns as follows:
(ii) No more than three (3) six (6) retail liquor licenses issued for locations within five (5) miles of the corporate limits of a city or town; and
(iii) Malt beverage permits may be issued for county locations beyond a five (5) mile zone around incorporated cities and towns without regard to population-, but no more than three (3) malt beverage permits shall be issued for locations within five (5) miles of the corporate limits of a city or town.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2006
