A BILL

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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-706 is created to read:

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- 14 (a) Expenditures by the division for developmental
- 15 preschool services shall be subject to the following:

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2 (i) Contractual payments to developmental

- 4 the previous year, at the amount of seven thousand two
- 5 hundred six dollars (\$7,206.00) per child per year.

- 9 in subsection (b) shall be increased by the most recent
- 10 external cost adjustment as enacted by the legislature

- 14 the department of health shall report to the select
- 15 committee on developmental programs or, if that committee
- 16 no longer exists, to the joint labor, health and social
- 17 services interim committee as follows:

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salaries, and the effect of school district recalibration 1 2 on those salaries; 3 4 (ii) Whether funding levels are sufficient to 5 provide required services for all eligible children; 6 (iii) Whether services for 7 children with developmental disabilities are provided in an inclusive and 8 9 least restrictive environment; 10 11 (iv) Whether developmental preschools 12 adopted common standards and evidence-based best practices; 13 14 (v) Measurable standards adopted by the division 15 to ensure quality service delivery; 16 17 (b) By October 1, 2006, regarding: 18 19 The progress of a mental health pilot (i) 20 project and the cost of integrating mental health services 21 in developmental preschools; 22 construction 23 (ii) The capital needs of

developmental preschools in the state.

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Section 3. The department of education shall report to the select committee on developmental programs or, if that committee no longer exists, to the joint labor, health and social services interim committee by October 1, 2006 on the amount of funds each school district is providing to the developmental preschools to conduct developmental

screenings of children from birth to five (5) years of age.

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section 4. In addition to any other funds
appropriated for developmental preschool programs, twelve
million dollars (\$12,000,000.00) is appropriated to the
department of health from the general fund for the biennium
commencing July 1, 2006 for the purposes of this act.

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Section 5. This act is effective July 1, 2006.
