Health care commission amendments.

Sponsored by: Joint Labor, Health and Social Services Interim Committee

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming health care commission; expanding commission membership, as specified; providing 2 3 for staggered terms; removing limitation on staff for the 4 commission; amending the commission's duties, as specified; 5 repealing obsolete provisions; authorizing fees for 6 commission reports and data; granting subpoena authority; amending reporting dates; repealing sunset date; requiring 7 8 a report and plan for demonstration alternate compensation 9 systems, as specified; requiring a study and report for redesign of the Medicaid benefit system as specified; and 10 providing for an effective date. 11

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13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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Section 1. W.S. 9-2-2801(b), (c) and (e), 2802(b),
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- 2 9-2-2803(a)(intro), (d) and by creating new subsections (f)
- 3 and (g) are amended to read:

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5 9-2-2801. Health care commission created; membership; salary; meetings; advisory committees. 6

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- (b) The commission shall consist of eleven (11) 8
- 9 members appointed by the governor, the director of the
- department of health or the director's designee and the 10
- insurance commissioner or the commissioner's designee. 11

- 13 (c) Appointed commission members shall serve until
- 14 completion of duties delegated to the commission under this
- 15 article three year terms. For the eleven (11) appointed
- members of the commission on July 1, 2006, the governor 16
- 17 shall select three members who will serve one year terms,
- 18 four members who will serve two year terms and four members
- who will serve three year terms. The governor may re-19
- 20 appoint members. If a vacancy occurs on the commission,
- 21 the governor shall appoint a new member to fill the vacancy
- 22 for the remainder of the term. The governor may remove
- members as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. Commission members who 23
- 24 are not state employees shall receive a salary equal to the

- 1 per diem paid members of the Wyoming legislature under W.S.
- 28-5-101 for each day of actual service and when engaged in 2
- necessary travel plus necessary expenses. 3

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- 5 (e) The commission shall meet at the call of the
- 6 chairman. Six (6) Seven (7) members shall constitute a
- 7 quorum.

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- 9 9-2-2802. Director; appointment; duties; additional
- staff; qualifications. 10

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- (b) Subject to approval by the commission, the 12
- 13 director may employ one (1) staff member members to assist
- 14 the commission in performing its duties. The staff member
- 15 Staff members shall possess those administrative,
- technical, professional and clerical qualifications 16
- 17 determined necessary by the commission. All staff to the
- 18 commission shall serve at the pleasure of the director.

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- 9-2-2803. Health care commission duties; report; open 20
- 21 meetings; attorney general to represent; rulemaking;
- administrative subpoenas. 22

The commission shall develop strategies to 1 (a) improve health care and reduce health care and medical 2 liability insurance costs for Wyoming citizens by holding 3 4 public meetings throughout the state, hearing from experts 5 and other interested parties, studying and researching other states' actions on health care and medical liability 6 insurance reform, studying and utilizing Wyoming data, and 7 considering past efforts, including, but not limited to, 8 9 the report issued by the Wyoming health reform commission on December 1, 1994, and future possibilities that can be 10 useful in decision making by addressing the following: 11 issues related to healthcare access, quality and cost. 12

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(d) Every $\frac{1}{2}$ six (6) months the commission shall submit a written progress report to the joint labor, health and social services interim committee. The committee shall create a subcommittee to meet jointly with the commission, as appropriate and subject to the agreement of the chairman of the commission, and prepare legislation necessary to implement commission recommendations. The subcommittee commission shall submit recommended draft legislation to the joint labor, health and social services interim committee for consideration.

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1 (f) The commission may maintain a system of health 2 care information and issue reports and disseminate 3 information by other means related to health care access, quality and costs. The commission may assess a fee for 4 5 reports and the use of its health care information system. 6 Reports to and use of the information database by public 7 agencies and subdivisions of the state shall be free of charge. Any revenue generated by the fees shall be 8 9 deposited in the general fund. 10 (g) In carrying out the commission's duties, the 11 director may apply to the office of administrative hearings 12 13 for an administrative subpoena for the production of any 14 books, papers or other documents relevant or material to 15 the commission's inquiry. 16 17 9-2-2804. Termination of article. 18 19 W.S. 9-2-2801 through 9-2-2803 are repealed effective 20 June 30, 20062009. 21 22 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-2-2803(a)(i) through (xi), (b) and

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(c) are repealed.

1 Section 3. The health care commission shall develop and submit to the joint labor, health and social services 2 interim committee by November 10, 2006 a detailed plan for 3 4 one or more demonstration projects of patient safety and 5 alternate compensation systems as recommended by the October 1, 2005 health care commission report on medical 6 7 errors and medical injury compensation. The plan shall include a plan of operation for the demonstration and a 8 9 draft of legislation necessary authorizing the 10 demonstrations. The plan shall: 11 (a) Assume the objective of the demonstration project 12 13 is to determine if an alternate compensation system will, 14 at a cost that does not exceed the cost of the current 15 system:

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17 (i) Facilitate the identification and prevention 18 of medical error and other avoidable adverse medical 19 events;

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21 (ii) Provide better compensation for those injured by avoidable adverse medical events; and 22

(iii) Provide a more favorable professional 1

environment for attracting skilled medical professionals 2

3 now in short supply in Wyoming.

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5 (b) Consider making an alternative compensation

6 system available to governmental hospitals and their

7 employees;

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9 (c) Provide that relevant professional liability

coverage for the participating governmental entities be 10

provided through a separate and financially independent 11

12 subaccount of the local government insurance

13 created by W.S. 1-42-103;

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15 (d) Identify the size of the appropriation needed to

appropriately capitalize a special alternative compensation 16

17 system fund account;

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(e) Assume that for the duration of the demonstration 19

20 the state will protect the local governments involved from

21 medical liability costs in excess of those expected under

22 the current system;

1 (f) Be consistent with the provisions of the Wyoming

Constitution as it exists as of 2005 and not be dependent 2

on any constitutional changes; 3

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5 (g) Provide for periodic evaluation of the progress

opportunity 6 of the demonstration and provide

7 modifications of the demonstration based on experience.

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Section 5. 9

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(a) The health care commission shall support a 11 redesign of the Medicaid benefit structure as recommended 12 13 by the final report of the joint legislative executive 14 committee reviewing the health department in response to 15 chapter 182, 2005 Session Laws of Wyoming. The ioint labor, health and social services interim committee shall 16 17 undertake the redesign with the support of the commission 18 and the governor's office. The objective of the redesign 19 shall be to improve the cost effectiveness of the Wyoming 20 The redesign shall include changes to Medicaid program. 21 the benefit structure and to the management and operation 22 of the program as needed. The redesign shall be done without reference to the traditional federal constraints on 23 24 the Medicaid program on the assumption that waivers will be

- 1 sought and obtained as needed to implement changes. A
- 2 preliminary report shall be submitted to the legislature by
- 3 the joint labor, health and social services interim
- 4 committee before the 2007 general session and a final
- 5 report by the 2008 budget session along with legislation
- 6 necessary to implement the conclusions of the report. To
- 7 the extent practical the redesign effort shall:

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- 9 (i) Use the same database that is developed for
- 10 the health care commission's study of a system to improve
- 11 the cost effectiveness of private insurance and reduce the
- 12 number of uninsured pursuant to section 3 of this act;

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- 14 (ii) Utilize the same or similar cost control
- 15 techniques as are developed pursuant to the study required
- 16 by section 3 of this act; and

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- 18 (iii) Be coordinated with that study so that the
- 19 proposed systems have as smooth and simple a transition as
- 20 possible for people moving from the Medicaid system to the
- 21 Wyocare system developed pursuant to section 3 of this act.

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23 **Section 4.** This act is effective July 1, 2006.
