Hospital improvement grants.

Sponsored by: Joint Labor, Health and Social Services Interim Committee

A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to public health and safety; requiring the
- 2 department of health to establish a magnet hospital grant
- 3 program and a critical access hospital grant program as
- 4 specified; providing grant criteria and deadlines;
- 5 providing for repayment of grants as specified; requiring
- 6 matching fund expenditure by grant recipients; granting
- 7 rulemaking authority; providing appropriations; and
- 8 providing for an effective date.

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

11

12 Section 1.

- 14 (a) The department of health shall establish a magnet
- 15 hospital grant program to support efforts by Wyoming
- 16 hospitals to reduce nursing shortages and improve patient

safety. The department shall award grants of up to two 1

hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) to each of 2

3 three (3) hospitals in the state to assist in obtaining

4 magnet hospital certification through the American Nurses

5 Credentialing Center. The grants shall be awarded through

an open competitive process that is publicized among the 6

hospitals in the state. The department shall establish 7

application procedures and grant award criteria through 8

9 rule and regulation. Criteria shall include, but are not

10 limited to, the following:

11

12 (i) The recipient hospital provides medical care

13 to patients qualified under the Medical Assistance and

Services Act, Title XVIII of the federal Social Security 14

15 Act and the child health insurance program;

16

17 (ii) The grant application shall be accompanied

by a narrative that details how the hospital will achieve 18

magnet certification within five (5) years; 19

20

21 (iii) The grant application shall include a

22 budget that specifies how grant funds will be expended;

1 (iv) The applicant hospital shall demonstrate

2 that it could not afford to achieve magnet hospital

3 certification without the grant;

4

5 (v) The grant application and accompanying

6 budget shall document that the hospital will match forty

7 percent (40%) of the grant award with in-kind services or

8 in-cash funds to be expended in achieving magnet hospital

9 certification.

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11 (b) The magnet hospital criteria shall be those

12 developed by the American Nurses Credentialing Center and

13 in effect on July 1, 2006. Any subsequent changes in the

14 magnet hospital certification program shall continue to

15 promote quality nursing practices, a quality nursing

16 working environment, and demonstrated improved outcomes for

17 patients. If subsequent changes in the magnet hospital

18 certification program do not reflect all of these elements,

19 the unexpended amount of grant funds shall be returned to

20 the department.

21

22 (c) The grant award recipients shall achieve magnet

23 hospital status within five (5) years from the date of the

24 grant award. The department shall require periodic

1 reporting by the hospital to determine that progress is

2 being made in preparing and submitting a magnet hospital

3 application and in acquiring the certification. A hospital

4 that fails to meet the five (5) year requirement or make

5 progress toward acquiring the certification, as determined

6 by the department, shall repay the full grant amount to the

7 department if the failure occurs within one (1) year of the

8 grant award date or one-half (1/2) of the grant amount if

9 the failure occurs one (1) year or more after the grant

10 award date.

11

12 (d) The department may expend up to one hundred

13 thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) from the appropriation

14 provided in section 2 of this act to provide technical and

15 professional assistance to hospitals receiving the grants

16 in preparing a magnet hospital application and in making

17 the necessary changes in nursing practices and the working

18 environment to attain magnet hospital status. This

19 assistance may be contracted to a Wyoming hospital that has

20 previously prepared or submitted a magnet hospital

21 application or to the University of Wyoming Nightingale

22 Center.

Section 2. Eight hundred fifty thousand dollars 1 2 (\$850,000.00) is appropriated from the budget reserve 3 account to the department of health for grants to hospitals 4 as provided in section 1 of this act, and nine thousand 5 eight hundred dollars (\$9,800.00) is appropriated from the general fund to the department of health to administer 6 these grants. Any unexpended funds, including any funds 7 returned by a hospital receiving a grant under this act, 8 shall be deposited in the general fund. 9

11 Section 3.

12

13 (a) The department of health shall establish a
14 program to provide grants and technical assistance to
15 critical access hospitals for the promotion of quality
16 nursing practices, quality nursing working environments,
17 increased retention of nursing staff and demonstrated
18 improved outcomes for patients.

19

20 (b) The department may contract with a third party
21 for the technical assistance to critical access hospitals
22 pursuant to this section.

1 (c) The department, following consultation with the board of nursing, Wyoming hospital association and critical 2 3 access hospital network, shall promulgate rules 4 regulations that include award criteria and application 5 procedures for grants pursuant to this section. The rules shall provide that the grant application shall include a 6 commitment from the applicant hospital to match twenty 7

8 percent (20%) of the grant award with in-kind services or

9 in-cash funds to be expended with the grant funds.

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11 (d) Recipients of grants pursuant to this section 12 shall be required to report periodically to the department 13 regarding the use of grant funds and measurable results 14 obtained with those funds.

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Section 4. Two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00)

is appropriated from the budget reserve account to the

department of health for grants to hospitals as provided in

Section 3 of this act, and six thousand two hundred dollars

(\$6,200.00) is appropriated from the general fund to the

department of health to administer those grants.

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Section 5. This act is effective July 1, 2006.
