Magnet hospital grants.

## A BILL

## for

1 AN ACT relating to public health and safety; requiring the department of health to establish a magnet bospital grant 2 3 program as specified; providing grant criteria and 4 deadlines; providing for repayment of grants as specified; 5 requiring matching fund expenditure by grant recipients; providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective 6 7 date. 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 11 Section 1. 12 13 (a) The department of health shall establish a magnet hospital grant program to support efforts by Wyoming 14

15 hospitals to reduce nursing shortages and improve patient

safety. The department shall award grants of up to two 1 hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) to each of 2 3 three hospitals in the state to assist in obtaining magnet 4 hospital certification through the American Nurses 5 Credentialing Center. The grants shall be awarded through an open competitive process that is publicized among the 6 7 publicly owned hospitals in the state. The department shall establish application procedures and grant award 8 9 criteria through rule and regulation. Criteria shall include, but are not limited to, the following: 10 11 12 (i) The recipient hospital is operated by the 13 state, a county or a special hospital district; 14 15 (ii) The grant application shall be accompanied by a narrative that details how the hospital will achieve 16 17 magnet certification within five years; 18 19 (iii) The grant application shall include a 20 budget that specifies how grant funds will be expended; 21 22 (iv) The applicant hospital shall demonstrate 23 that it could not afford to achieve magnet hospital 24 certification without the grant;

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(iv) The grant application and accompanying
budget shall document that the hospital will match forty
percent (40%) of the grant award with in-kind services or
in-cash funds to be expended in achieving magnet hospital
certification. For critical access hospitals, the matching
requirement shall be twenty percent (20%).

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9 The magnet hospital criteria shall (C) be those developed by the American Nurses Credentialing Center and 10 in effect on July 1, 2006. Any subsequent changes in the 11 magnet hospital certification program shall continue to 12 13 promote quality nursing practices, a quality nursing 14 working environment, and demonstrated improved outcomes for 15 If subsequent changes in the magnet hospital patients. certification program do not reflect all of these elements, 16 17 the unexpended amount of grant funds shall be returned to 18 the department.

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20 (d) The grant award recipients shall achieve magnet 21 hospital status within five years from the date of the 22 grant award. The department shall require periodic 23 reporting by the hospital to determine that progress is 24 being made in preparing and submitting a magnet hospital

application and in acquiring the certification. A hospital 1 that fails to meet the five year requirement or make 2 progress toward acquiring the certification, as determined 3 4 by the department, shall repay the full grant amount to the 5 department if the failure occurs within one (1) year of the grant award date or one-half (1/2) of the grant amount if 6 7 the failure occurs one (1) year or more after the grant 8 award date.

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10 (e) The department may expend up to one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) from the appropriation 11 provided in Section 2 of this act to provide technical and 12 13 professional assistance to the hospitals receiving the 14 grants in preparing a magnet hospital application and in 15 making the necessary changes in nursing practices and the 16 working environment to attain magnet hospital status. This 17 assistance may be contracted to a Wyoming hospital that has 18 previously prepared or submitted a magnet hospital 19 application or to the University of Wyoming Nightingale 20 Center.

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22 Section 2. Eight hundred fifty thousand dollars 23 (\$850,000.00) is appropriated from the budget reserve 24 account to the department of health for purposes of this

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act. Any unexpended funds, including any funds returned by 1 2 a hospital receiving a grant under this section, shall be deposited in the general fund. 3 4 5 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2006. б 7 (END)
