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20 (vi) "Pari-mutuel wagering" means wagering on 21 the outcome of pari-mutuel events in which those who wager purchase tickets of various denominations on entrants in 22 the events and all wagers for each event are pooled and 23 24 held by the permittee for distribution, and when the

1 outcome of the event has been decided, the permittee

- 2 distributes the total wagers comprising the pool, less an
- amount not greater than twenty-five and nine-tenths percent 3
- 4 (25.90%) for live racing and not to exceed the percentage
- 5 allowed at the host track in the event of simulcasting and
- 6 less the amount for breakage to holders of tickets on the
- 7 winning entries;

9	fingerprints and other information necessary for a criminal
10	history record background check as provided under W.S.
11	7-19-201.
