A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; providing that the
- 2 offense of wearing or carrying a concealed weapon requires
- 3 that the weapon be on the defendant's person; authorizing
- 4 the carrying of concealed weapons in vehicles under
- 5 specified conditions; providing a grace period for renewal
- 6 of a concealed weapon permit for returning military
- 7 personnel as specified; and providing for an effective
- 8 date.

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 12 **Section 1**. W.S. 6-8-104(a)(intro), (ii), (iii), by
- 13 creating a new paragraph (iv) and (s) is amended to read:

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- 15 6-8-104. Wearing or carrying concealed weapons;
- 16 penalties; exceptions; permits.

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2 (a) A person who wears or carries on his person a 3 concealed deadly weapon is guilty of a misdemeanor 4 punishable by a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty 5 dollars (\$750.00), imprisonment in the county jail for not more than six (6) months, or both, unless: 6 7 (ii) The person possesses a permit under this 8 9 section; -or 10 11 (iii) The person holds a valid permit 12 authorizing him to carry a concealed firearm authorized and 13 issued by a governmental agency or entity in another state 14 that recognizes Wyoming permits, is a valid statewide permit, and the state has laws similar to the provisions of 15 16 this section, as determined by the attorney general, 17 including a proper background check of the permit holder; -18 or 20 (iv) The person is age eighteen (18) years or

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older and possesses a concealed firearm or other weapon for self-defense or other lawful purpose within the interior of a private conveyance, without a permit, if the firearm or other weapon is securely encased or is otherwise not

1 readily accessible for immediate use. For purposes of this 2 paragraph, "securely encased" means in a glove compartment, 3 snapped in a holster, in a gun case, in a zippered gun case 4 or in a closed box or container which requires a lid or 5 cover to be opened for access. A person knowingly carrying a concealed firearm or other weapon under this paragraph 6 7 who is stopped, detained, questioned or addressed in person by a peace officer, shall immediately inform the peace 8 9 officer that he is carrying a concealed firearm or other 10 weapon. The peace officer may take custody of the 11 concealed firearm or other weapon during the duration of 12 the contact between the person and the peace officer if the 13 peace officer determines that the action is necessary for 14 the safety of any person present, including the peace 15 officer.

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17 The permittee may renew his permit on or before the expiration date by filing with the sheriff of the 18 19 applicant's county of residence the renewal form, 20 notarized affidavit stating that the permittee remains 21 qualified pursuant to the criteria specified in this 22 section, and the required renewal fee. The permit shall be renewed to a qualified applicant upon receipt of the 23 completed renewal application, appropriate payment of fees 24

1 and the division shall verify that the criminal history 2 information available to the division does not indicate 3 that possession of a firearm by the applicant would 4 constitute a violation of state or federal law. A permittee 5 who fails to file a renewal application on or before its expiration date shall renew his permit by paying a late fee 6 7 of ten dollars (\$10.00). No permit shall be renewed six (6) months or more after its expiration date, and the permit 8 9 shall be deemed to be permanently expired, except that a 10 permittee on active military duty outside the continental 11 United States when his permit expires may file a renewal 12 form without a late fee within ninety (90) days of 13 returning to the continental United States. A person whose 14 permit has permanently expired may reapply for a permit 15 pursuant to subsections (b) through (e) of this section.
