1	AN ACT relating to the department of agriculture; creating
2	a task force to study bio-security laboratory issues, needs
3	and coordination in Wyoming and among various state and
4	federal agencies; requiring a report; providing an
5	appropriation; and providing for an effective date.
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7	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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9	Section 1.
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11	(a) There is created an executive task force to study
12	Wyoming bio-security laboratory issues and coordination
13	between Wyoming and other state and federal agencies.
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15	(b) The task force shall be comprised of:

2006 STATE OF WYOMING 06LSO-0288 The governor, or his designee; 1 (i) 2 3 (ii) The director of the Wyoming department of 4 agriculture, who shall be the chairman of the task force; 5 6 (iii) A representative of the Wyoming board of 7 agriculture, appointed by the chairman of the Wyoming board of agriculture; 8 9 10 (iv) A representative of the Wyoming department 11 of game and fish, appointed by the director of the Wyoming 12 department of game and fish; 13 14 (v) A representative of the Wyoming livestock board, appointed by the chairman of the Wyoming livestock 15 16 board; 17 18 (vi) A representative of the Wyoming department of environmental quality, appointed by the director of the 19 20 Wyoming department of environmental quality; 21 22 (vii) A representative of the Wyoming department 23 of health, appointed by the director of the Wyoming 24 department of health;

1 2 (viii) A representative of the Wyoming office of 3 homeland security, appointed by the director of the Wyoming 4 office of homeland security; and 5 6 (ix) A representative of the University of 7 Wyoming, appointed by the president of the University of Wyoming. 8 9 10 (c) The task force shall: 11 12 (i) Consult with the United States department of agriculture/agriculture research service arthropod-borne 13 animal diseases research laboratory; 14 15 16 (ii) Familiarize itself with various the 17 governmental jurisdictions, regulations and homeland 18 security requirements of a bio-security laboratory; 19 20 (iii) Conduct a comprehensive review of other 21 state and federal collaborative bio-security laboratories 22 to determine structural and fiscal potentials or 23 constraints; 24

(iv) Consider current limitations of other state 1 2 bio-security laboratories, overlapping uses, possible 3 jurisdictional gaps and requisite autonomies of each bio-4 security laboratory; 5 (v) Consider advantages of collaborative uses of 6 joint structures. 7 8 9 The task force may contract with a consultant to (d) assist in the facilitation of the task force duties and may 10 consult with any other state, local or federal agencies, 11 public or private stakeholders as the task force deems 12 13 appropriate. 14 (e) The task force shall disseminate requests, 15 16 including through electronic media, for the active 17 participation of private groups and organizations in the 18 study. 19 20 (f) No later than September 1, 2006, the task force 21 shall submit a report to the joint agriculture, public 22 lands and water resources interim committee. The report shall detail the task force's findings, recommend any 23 24 preferable alternatives and recommend any statutory changes

that may be required to implement the task force's final 1 2 recommendations. 3 (g) Staff support for the task force shall 4 be 5 provided by the Wyoming department of agriculture and by any state agency upon request. 6 7 (h) In addition to the appropriation contained in 8 9 section 2 of this act, the Wyoming department of 10 agriculture may utilize existing resources and apply for any federal or private grants that may be available to 11 12 augment funding for the task force study and report 13 required under this act. 14 (j) This act shall terminate April 1, 2007. 15 16 17 Section 2. There is appropriated from the general fund to the Wyoming department of agriculture one hundred 18 thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) to fund interim meetings and 19 20 activities of the task force and to contract with 21 appropriate professionals as necessary to complete the 22 duties assigned to the task force in section 1 of this act.

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1	Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon
2	completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
3	as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
4	Constitution.
